Annual report for 2024

The Trustees of One Sixteen Bible Church Birmingham present their annual report and financial statement for period of (1st January 2024 - 31st December 2024)

1) Structure governance and management

The One Sixteen Bible Church Charity is governed by an Approved Governing Document. As per the One Sixteen constitutional document, the members of this CIO shall be its Charity trustees for the time being. The only persons eligible to be members of the CIO are its charity trustees. Membership of the CIO cannot be transferred to anyone else (Section 16:1). All trustees of the CIO are fully responsible for any decisions made and taken throughout the course of this and any other financial year.

The trustees of One Sixteen Bible Church Birmingham are continuing to aim for conducting regular (approximately every six months) meetings, within which any objectives and activities of the Church are discussed and agreed upon collectively by the trustees. As per the charities constitution, each registered trustee continues to recognise their duty bound requirement and responsibility in the day to day/week by week running of the Church's ongoing work. The trustees also continue to conduct and maintain oversight (yearly financial review of charities accounts) of all financial and legal matters concerning the Charity. Although not all trustees are actively involved in the membership of the Church charity, each trustee is encouraged to take an

appropriate part within both the practical and Spiritual tasks involved within the furtherance of the objectives, purposes and activities of the charity as a whole.

As a charity we continue to operate on the assumption that any matters for consideration can be raised by any trustee or Church member at any time. Any matters which are raised can then be addressed as and when necessary and/or when appropriate by the trustees of the CIO. Any implemented change is to be conducted in accordance with Church policy and governing documents. Although the constitution permits decisions to be made primarily by the trustees, Church members are also actively encouraged to give feedback on aspects of Church matters (governance and management) and these are then discussed as appropriate within the trustee meetings.

2) Objectives and activities

The “One Sixteen Bible Church Birmingham” continues to operate and exist as an independent, evangelical Reformed Baptist Church. As per the inception of the Church until now the continued “Principle purpose” of the Church is to advance the Christian faith for the benefit of the public within the Birmingham/West-Midlands/Worcestershire area and in accordance with Scriptural commands of Christ towards His Church. As a Baptist/evangelical protestant Church body, we seek to uphold of the tenants of the 1689 Baptist Confession of Faith.

In order to continue to achieve this charitable objective set out above, the Church is currently and continues to remain involved in providing a variety of activities, both towards its members in attendance and within the community it is based within. This is achieved as the One Sixteen Bible Church Charity seeks to reach out to the local community as per activities in achievements and objectives (section 3) below.

The aim motivation and purpose of these activities is founded upon the Bible’s teachings and centuries of historic Christian practice. In order to show and tell of the Love of God in the Gospel of Jesus Christ to both the community and Church members, making disciples of all nations (Mathew 28:19).

One Sixteen Bible Church continues to undertake these objectives, through the holding of weekly Church worship services, mid-week prayer meetings/Bible studies, theological training/discipleship, pastoral counselling and open-air evangelism and evangelistic study groups both collectively and personally (one on one). As per previous years these activities of Worship and spiritual practice have been arranged and are being conducted primarily in order for One:16 Bible Church members to grow in their Christian faith and their walk with Jesus, to deepen in their understanding of the Christian faith and to enlighten others (members of the public) with regards to historic protestant/Christian faith.

Throughout the period of 2024, our Church charity’s various weekly activities have consisted of the following:

- Church services continue to be conducted from 10.30am until 1pm every Sunday morning/afternoon.
- Church Prayer meeting takes place once a week (mid week meeting) from around 7.30pm to 9pm.
- Pastoral counselling and visitations with church members and other related contacts, and evangelistic meetings with members of the public showing an interest in the Christian faith on an ongoing basis.
- A monthly midweek evangelism/Christianity explored meeting, with various Church contacts and members.

- Open air evangelism conducted a couple of times a week at non specified times.
- Monthly Church open air outreach sessions.
- Church services consist of singing hymns, times of prayer, communion, reading and preaching from the Bible, time of fellowship.

These objectives and activities are continuing to be conducted in accordance with the primary objective within the Charities governing document and are considered to be of public benefit to many individuals who desire to practice their Christian faith or for those who are inquiring into the tenants and beliefs of Biblical Christianity within the west midlands/Worcestershire area.

3) Achievements and performance

Although the success of the Christian faith is one which is not easily measured by visible performance indicators (such as financial / visible numerical growth etc). As in years gone by, it instead measures it's effective success based upon faithfulness of Christians towards the Lord's commands from within the scriptures (The Biblical teachings). As a Church Charity, One Sixteen Bible Church Birmingham has been pleased as in previous years, to have achieved and performed the objectives of the charity and we as in past remain encouraged in the Charity's progress throughout the year.

Throughout the year of 2024, the One Sixteen Bible Church Birmingham members have continued to meet together for various Church related activities throughout the week, on a weekly basis. We have this last year been greatly encouraged by a young family joining the Church membership for weekly worship together. As per previous years, we remain very encouraged by visiting individuals / families / and friends. There were probably around fifteen or so visitors throughout the year of 2024.

The over all attendance seems to be consistently balanced with around ten to twenty individuals in regular attendance. There continues to be a theological and Spiritual unity amongst those who attend and the congregation continues to remain encouraged with the regular ministry often expressing that encouragement towards one another and the leaders of the Church, making comments such as "the preaching message was good this morning" and "I'm really pleased to be part of this Church".

The Pastor's duties continue to remain consistent as per previous years. Peter Sherwood (The Church Pastor) continues as in previous years, to weekly set up, arrange, lead and often preach at the Sunday morning service. The Church's midweek prayer meeting has also continued to be maintained and attended on a regular basis (again being led by the Pastor), although often with fewer attendees than on a Sunday morning service. The members of the Church are encouraged to pray openly throughout the prayer meetings and to participate as and where appropriate. Peter Sherwood's regular weekly Pastoral duties throughout the week consist of sermon and service preparations, one on one and/or family pastoral visitations. These Pastoral duties consist of Biblical counselling and discipleship where needed and/or appropriate. There continues to remain regular opportunities for the congregation/members to feedback to the Pastor concerning the things which they are learning about with regards to the Christian faith. Members of the Church are also encouraged as previous to engage in fruitful discussion relating to their own Christian/spiritual walk and how they can best be supported practically and pastorally in their own journey of faith.

One of the Pastor's other main responsibilities aside from Bible teaching and discipling those within the Church, is to spend time in prayer for the congregants which is a regular pattern

throughout the week of ministry.

There continues to be many other practical tasks to be arranged by the Leadership of the One Sixteen Bible Church Birmingham, such as ongoing administrative tasks, developing and keeping on top of policies (Safeguarding etc), liaising with third parties (safeguarding oversight, the bank, Charity commission, hall hire etc), keeping records of invoices, receipts for purchased goods, inventories, video production (Church YouTube channel), WhatsApp group admin and communication, service preparation (Hymn selection/preparing communion/readings/notice updates/Church etc) and the general upkeep of equipment/literature amongst other duties. These regular weekly pastoral duties and weekly activities of the Church have been and are continually aimed to be undertaken in line with and as per the working objectives of the Charity and ultimately the Bible's instruction to the Church.

We have continued to keep the format of the Church very similar to other years. Continuing to meet for weekly worship together on a Sunday morning. With the service starting at 10.30am, the members of the Church gather together (singing hymns, praying, taking communion and preaching and hearing from God's Word in the preaching of the Bible). Our set-up consists of a seating arrangement, pulpit and projector screen and hymn books to assist with the reading of the words for worship.

The midweek prayer meetings are an integral part of the ministry of One Sixteen Bible Church and although sometimes less attended (due to family / childcare evening commitments). The members have opportunity to come together and pray for the needs of the Church and others together at these meetings.

Members of the Church also continue to conduct regular evangelistic outreach in the local area to the Church. Whilst doing so, One Sixteen Bible Church members have the opportunity to speak with the general public concerning their beliefs and to engage those who would like to talk about spiritual matters of the Christian faith. Tracts and literature are often handed out and these opportunities to talk with members of the public can often present themselves to be very fruitful.

Off the back of the evangelistic endeavours of the Church, 2024 has seen the Church commence a course of Christianity explored sessions. Taking place once a month, these sessions give believers and non-believers alike, an opportunity to come together and to hear/discuss the fundamentals of the Christian faith.

Peter (The Church Pastor) has also continued to develop and deepen relationships with other evangelical Church leaders within the local area. Remaining in good standing with other branches of the evangelical Protestant Church community, the Pastor continues to attend regular fraternal and discussion/prayer groups for mutual encouragement and sideways accountability within the work of ministry.

The Pastor also often has regular opportunities to attend and preach at other Churches. This is sometimes reciprocated by leaders coming to share and minister at One Sixteen Bible Church as in previous years. This has always been mutually encouraged by the members within the Church and also the attendance of occasional visiting speakers seems to be profitable to the members and has often proved to be a rich encouragement towards those in the Church.

The regular weekly teaching ministry has consisted of looking through various books of the Bible, finishing off Mark's Gospel, 1st John, several Psalms, passages from Isaiah and various New Testament epistles.

Regular fellowship (post service tea and coffees), and fellowship lunches also present an informal opportunity for members' feedback and fellowship together. Members of the Church can and often do discuss/feedback from the mornings' weekly teaching both together and with the leadership.

This fellowship often offers individuals the opportunity to informally discuss what they have learned each week which can be a great encouragement.

We continue to hold regular meetings and services where possible (as per the charities objectives and activities) and we as Charity continue to remain greatly encouraged throughout 2024 and for the year ahead.

4) Financial review.

As per previous years, One Sixteen Bible Church Birmingham continues to rely on the kind financial donations of the members within the Church throughout the year of 2024.

Our Church bank balance/account as per form CC16a continues to remain in good standing with accurate records and receipts kept from year to year. As over previous years, the Church has made no wider public appeal for funds during the financial year of 2024.

Following the independently agreed remuneration change throughout the financial year of 2023 (June 30th) by Trustees Alasdair Nicholson and Philip Close, Peter Sherwood's remuneration has continued to remain at £13.00 per hour and would not exceed an invoicing amount of 40 hours per month for pastoral services rendered. Peter Sherwoods remuneration for services from the charity was decided independently by above named trustees and was made on the basis of being considered in the best interest of the Charity and in light of the current financial position of the account thereof.

The majority of all other expenditure made throughout 2024 has been as per previous years for the weekly hall hire, various items/equipment, Usable materials, remuneration for visiting speakers, Church subscriptions and fellowship activities as per CC16a form.

All in all as per previous years, the year of 2024 has been a blessed year for the One Sixteen Bible Church Birmingham Charity. We remain encouraged together as Church members. Being able to practice the Christian faith and to reach out to the surrounding region with the Gospel of Jesus. This has been in the progress of/in conjunction with the Charity's objectives. The trustees of One Sixteen Bible Church Birmingham remain pleased with all that has taken place throughout 2024. The trustees and members of the Charity continue to remain expectant and faithful for all that lies ahead going forward in 2025.



Although we have sadly seen some individuals / families move on from Church membership this year, we have also been greatly encouraged by others joining the Church for weekly worship together. As per previous years, we have also been very encouraged by visiting individuals / families that have come to fellowship on a more intermittent basis.

Although the attendance overall has been slightly less at the Church than previous years. There continues to be a common and increasing unity amongst those who attend and it isn't uncommon to see between around ten to fifteen folks in attendance on a weekly basis. The congregation remains encouraged with the regular ministry and regularly express those encouragements towards one another and the leaders of the Church.

The Pastor's duties continue to remain consistent as per previous years. Peter Sherwood (The Church Pastor) continues weekly to set up, arrange, lead and often preach at the weekly services on the Sunday morning service. The Church's midweek prayer meeting has also continued to be maintained and attended on a regular basis (being led by the Pastor), although often with fewer attendees than on a Sunday morning service.

This has always been mutually encouraged by the members within the Church and also the attendance of occasional visiting speakers seems to be profitable to the members and has often proved to be a rich encouragement towards those in the Church.

The regular weekly teaching ministry has consisted of looking through the book of Mark's Gospel, Jonah, various epistles of the Apostle Paul and other texts from both the old and new testament. There is always opportunity for feedback and fellowship together after each service where members of the Church can discuss/feedback the mornings teaching, which therefore offers a more dialogued (two way) dynamic to what they have learned each week.

We continue to hold regular meetings and services where possible (as per the charities objectives and activities) and we as Charity trustees remain generally encouraged for the year ahead.

4) Financial review.

As per previous years, One Sixteen Bible Church Birmingham continues to rely on the kind financial donations of the members within the Church throughout the year of 2023.

Our Church bank balance/account as per form CC16a continues to remain in good standing with accurate records and receipts kept from year to year. The Church has made no wider public appeal for funds during the financial year of 2023.

Following the recommencement of remuneration for the Pastoral services of Peter Sherwood in October 2022 (As per previous Annual report). It has since been independently agreed throughout the financial year of 2023 (June 30th) by Trustees Alasdair Nicholson and Philip Close, that Peter Sherwood's remuneration would be increased from £10.00 per hour to £13.00 per hour and would not exceed an invoicing amount of 40 hours per month (increased from 32 hrs per month) for pastoral services rendered. This decision was taken independently of Peter Sherwood and made on the basis of being considered in the best interest of the Charity and in light of the current financial position of the account thereof.

The majority of all other expenditure made throughout 2023 has been as per previous years for the weekly hall hire, various items (Microphone leads), Usable materials, remuneration for visiting speakers, Church subscriptions and fellowship activities as per CC16a form.

All in all as per previous years, the year of 2023 has been a blessed year for the One Sixteen Bible Church Birmingham Charity. We remain encouraged in the progress of the Charity's objectives and are pleased with all that has taken place throughout 2023. The trustees and members of the Charity remain expectant and optimistic for all that lies ahead going forward.



The Trustees of One Sixteen Bible Church Birmingham present their annual report and financial statement for period of (1st Jan 2022 - 31st December 2022)

1) Structure governance and management

The One Sixteen Bible Church Charity is governed by an Approved Governing Document. As per the One Sixteen constitutional document, the members of this CIO shall be it's Charity trustees for the time being. The only persons eligible to be members of the CIO are it's charity trustees. Membership of the CIO cannot be transferred to anyone else (Section 16:1). All trustees of the CIO are fully responsible for any decisions made and taken throughout the course of this and any other financial year.

The Trustees of One Sixteen Bible Church Birmingham are continuing to aim for conducting regular (approximately every six months) meetings, within which any objectives and activities of the Church are discussed and agreed upon collectively by the Trustees. As per the charities constitution, each registered trustee continues to recognise their duty bound requirement and responsibility in the day to day/week by week running of the Churches ongoing work. The trustees

also continue to conduct and maintain oversight (yearly financial review of charities accounts) of all financial and legal matters concerning the Charity. Although not all trustees are actively involved in the membership of the Church charity, each trustee is encouraged to take an appropriate part within both the practical and Spiritual tasks involved within the furtherance of the objectives, purposes and activities of the Charity as a whole.

As a charity we continue to operate on the assumption that any matters for consideration can be raised by any trustee or Church member at any time. Any matters which are raised can then be addressed as and when necessary and/or when appropriate by the trustees of the CIO. Any implemented change is to be conducted in accordance with Church policy and governing documents. Although the constitution permits decisions to be made primarily by the trustees, Church members are also actively encouraged to give feedback on aspects of Church matters (governance and management) and these are then discussed as appropriate within the trustee meetings.

2) Objectives and activities

As an Independent, evangelical Reformed Baptist Church "The principle purpose of the "One Sixteen Bible Church" charity is to advance the Christian faith according to the 1689 Baptist Confession of Faith in the Birmingham/Midlands area for the benefit of the public.

In order to achieve this charitable objective set out above, the Church is currently involved in providing a variety of activities, both to it's members and within the community in general. The aim of these activities is founded upon the Bibles teachings and centuries of historic Christian practice. In order to show and tell of the Love of God in the Gospel of Jesus Christ to both the community and Church members, making disciples of all nations (Mathew 28:19).

One Sixteen Bible Church is undertaking these objectives through the holding of weekly Church worship services, prayer meetings, Bible studies, theological training/discipleship, pastoral counselling and open-air evangelism. These activities have been arranged and are being conducted in order for One:16 Bible Church members to grow in their Christian faith and to enlighten others (members of the public) concerning the Christian faith."

Throughout the period of 2022, our Church charity's various weekly activities have consisted of the following:

- Church services continue to be conducted from 10.30am until 1pm every Sunday morning/afternoon.
- Church Prayer meeting takes place once a week (mid week meeting) from around 7.30pm to 9pm.
- Theological discussion sessions (once a month)
- Pastoral counselling and visitations with church members and other members and other evangelistic meetings with members of the public showing an interest in the Christian faith on an ongoing basis.
- Open air evangelism conducted a couple of times a week at non specified times.
- Church services consist of singing hymns, times of prayer, communion, reading and preaching from the Bible.

These objectives and activities are continuing to be conducted in accordance with the primary objective within the Charities governing document and are considered to be of public benefit to many individuals who desire to practice their Christian faith or for those who are inquiring into Christianity.

3) Achievements and performance

Although the success of the Christian faith is not easily measured by visible performance indicators (For example, financial growth/numerical growth etc), it instead measures it's effective success upon faithfulness towards the Lords commands from within the scriptures. To both see and be part of a body (group) of Christian believers who are progressively growing in nearness to God over time, through Faith and practice together.

This being stated, we as trustees of the One Sixteen Bible Church charity consider the achievements and performance of the Church to be one of much fruitfulness during the year of 2022.

During which time, we have continued to meet together as a Church on a weekly basis. Throughout the year we have once again enjoyed seeing new faces/visitors coming along to the Church. Many of whom have stayed in fellowship with us and continue to attend the Sunday morning Worship service on a weekly basis.

Sadly we have also had various individuals come for shorter periods of time, due to having recently moved to the area and seemingly just looking for a Church to fellowship in the short term. We generally remain encouraged by the attendance of those who come to the Church and we have seen a slight increase of attendees over the year. It isn't uncommon on some weeks to see between twenty to thirty Church attendees on a Sunday morning.

The duties of the Pastor are increasing and adapting in light of these increased numbers of attendees. Peter Sherwood (the Pastor) continues to prepare from the Bible on a weekly basis in order to preach the Sunday sermons and hold devotions during the midweek prayer meeting. The regular week by week Pastoral ministry is continuing to take place as usual, such as one on one or family pastoral visitations/counselling and discipleship where needed and appropriate.

During 2022 some members of the Church also completed the learning series "Behold your God" in which the Church met together (monthly) in order to review and discuss a work pack and Dvd series. Within these sessions members of the Church had opportunities to discuss and learn further, concerning the attributes of the God of the Bible and the Christian faith.

These Church activities and the regular weekly Pastoral activities have been undertaken in line with and as per the working performance objectives of the Charity.

The format of the Churches Worship services has remained mostly the same throughout 2022, continuing to meet together weekly on a Sunday morning for the Lords day worship, (singing of hymns, prayer, taking of communion, preaching the Bible). On a practical note we now have a new Church projector screen which allows for the words of the hymns to be read from a screen.

The Churches midweek prayer meetings continue and are attended by a few less individuals than on a Sunday. None the less these meetings remain a wonderful time of fellowship where members of the Church have the opportunity to bring appropriate prayer requests and needs concerning their walk in the Christian faith to one another, and where the Church can then all pray about/for

these matters together during the meeting.

The One Sixteen Bible Church continues to also have the opportunity to get out into the local community of Worcestershire and the Birmingham/West midlands areas in order to speak to members of the public about Jesus Christ and the Christian faith (sharing the Gospel/conducting evangelism). Whilst out and about in the local area members of the One:16 Church are distributing Christian literature and one getting into conversation with those present concerning matters pertaining to the Christian faith. There is often a mixed response when engaging with people with the Gospel of Jesus Christ, however in the most part people are often encouraged by what they are hearing and some individuals have even visited as a result of the evangelistic outreach of the Church.

We have had several more informal activities take place throughout the year of 2022. Such as Church walks and outings, Ladies groups meeting together to get to know one another socially. It's not uncommon for families to occasionally meet together also for coffees, meals and informal fellowship throughout the week and it's been wonderful to see natural friendships begin to blossom throughout the Church fellowship during 2022.

The Church elders and many of the One Sixteen congregants continue to remain in good standing and relationships with other branches of the protestant/evangelical Christian Communities in the Local area. From time to time the Pastor is occasionally asked to meet with and share/preach sermons for other local Churches. This is mutually encouraged by the members of One:16 Bible Church and is seen to be healthy for the mutual encouragement and edification of like minded Churches within the Protestant Christian faith.

This year we have also occasionally, as in previous years had the privilege of being joined by other evangelical leaders. These individuals have come and shared from the Bible and spoken/preached to the Church members concerning various aspects of the Christian faith. These occasional visiting speakers seemed to be very profitable and seemingly brought a rich encouragement for those at the Church.

The regular preaching/teaching ministry from our own Church leadership has been taken from the books of Mark, Romans, Habakkuk amongst others within the Bible and expounded upon during the preaching within a Sunday morning sermon.

It was also an encouragement to have one of our Church members deliver a science and faith lecture during one of the Sunday morning services, which was very well received.

We continue to hold our regular meetings and services where possible (as per our objectives and activities) and we as Charity trustees remain generally very encouraged for the year ahead.

4) Financial review

Our Bank account (as above) remains in good standing and the Church has made no wider public appeal for funds during the year.

Due to the growing nature of the Churches' activities and the increased donations within the Church account. The decision was independently made by the two unremunerated trustees (Philip close and Alasdair Nicholson) to recommence the remuneration of the Pastor (Peter Sherwood) at One:16 Bible Church for services rendered as of October 2022. It was independently agreed that

Peter would begin to invoice the Church charity in conjunction with recorded hours for Pastoral services rendered, at an amount of £10.00 per hour (As per the Trustees meeting minutes at commencement of Charity) for no more than 32 hours per month.

The majority of all other Church expenditure made throughout the year of 2022 has been for the use of the hall hire and various items of equipment such as Projector Screen, Projector, resources, evangelistic literature, and remuneration for visiting speakers.

All in all 2022 has been a blessed year for One:16 Bible Church and we remain encouraged in the development of the Charity and the Churches activities heading into 2023.



Although we have also had a few individuals sadly leave the fellowship during 2021(due to moving Churches).Those who do continue to come and meet together for worship each week, has gradually been increasing numerically throughout 2021.

This numerical growth of the Church has given occasion for more pastoral duties to be undertaken throughout the year. Duties such as in counselling, discipleship, Bible study sessions with Church attendees have increased, giving increased opportunity for the leadership of the Church to meet together with the congregants throughout the weeks during 2021. The Church also has a midweek prayer meeting where the opportunity to pray for one another's needs and various aspects of our Christian walk is carried out. Both of these meetings are seemingly well received (often with encouraging feedback by those in attendance) and fully participated in by all present.

The One Sixteen Bible Church continues to also have the opportunity to get out into the local community of Worcestershire and the Birmingham/West midlands areas in order to speak to members of the public about Jesus Christ and the Christian faith (sharing the Gospel/conduct evangelism). Many of these opportunities to engage with the public are often well received and sometimes people will even ask us to pray with them, or may consider keeping in touch for further contact. It would regularly appear that the Coronavirus pandemic still had a profound impact on many people throughout 2021. Individuals who were often looking for the deep answers to life's big questions. We as a Church would often enter into such conversations and point people to the only hope that is to be found in Jesus Christ's forgiveness.

As a Church we also had various other, more informal aspects of ministry amongst the members taking place throughout the year of 2021. We had individuals undertaking Bible studies with one another and the conducting of general Church fellowship activities, such as going for meals/walks/coffee shops together.

The Church elders and many of the One Sixteen congregants continue to remain in good standing and relationships with other branches of the protestant/evangelical Christian Communities in the Local area. Often our One Sixteen Church pastor being asked to speak at other Churches and to occasionally meet with leaders and congregants in order to share and mutually encourage one

another within the Christian faith.

We have also had the privilege of inviting several other pastors/speakers to come and share with us throughout the year of 2021. This has been a tremendous blessing/encouragement to the fellowship and their ministry was well received. The regular preaching/teaching ministry from our own Church leadership has been taken from the books of Mark, Revelation and Genesis within the Bible and expounded upon during the Sunday morning preaching.

We continue to hold our regular meetings and services where possible (as per our objectives and activities) and we as Charity trustees remain generally very encouraged for the year ahead.

4) Financial review

As a Church charity we have continued to rely on the kind financial donations of the Church members throughout the year 2021.

Our Bank account (as above) remains in good standing and the Church has made no wider public appeal for funds during the year.

The majority of expenditure made throughout the year of 2021 has been for the use of the hall hire and various items of equipment such as books, resources, evangelistic literature, Church video camera and sound equipment.



Annual report for 2020

The Trustees of One Sixteen Bible Church Birmingham present their annual report and financial statement for period of (December 9th 2019 -31st December 2020)

1) Structure governance and management

The One Sixteen Bible Church Charity is governed by an Approved Governing Document. As per the One Sixteen constitutional document, the members of this CIO shall be it's Charity trustees for the time being. The only persons eligible to be members of the CIO are it's charity trustees. Membership of the CIO cannot be transferred to anyone else (Section16:1).

All trustees of the CIO are fully responsible for any decisions made and taken throughout the course of this and any other financial year.

As trustees we aim to have regular (approximately every six months) meetings, within which any objectives and activities of the Church are discussed and agreed upon. Each registered trustee recognises their duty bound requirement and responsibility in the day to day running of the Churches work and witness and oversight of all financial and legal matters concerning the Charity. Each trustee is also encouraged to take an appropriate part within both the practical and Spiritual tasks involved within the furtherance of the objectives, purposes and activities of the Charity as a

whole.

Any matters for consideration can be raised by any trustee or Church member. These matters are then addressed as necessary and/or appropriate by the trustees of the CIO for consideration and any implemented change needed as appropriate and in accordance with Church policy and governing documents. Although the constitution permits decisions to be made primarily by the trustees, Church members are also encouraged to give feedback on aspects of Church matters (governance and management) and these are then discussed as appropriate within the trustee meetings.

2) Objectives and activities

As an Independent, evangelical Reformed Baptist Church "The principle purpose of the "One Sixteen Bible Church" charity is to advance the Christian faith according to the 1689 Baptist Confession of Faith in the Birmingham/Midlands area for the benefit of the public.

In order to achieve this charitable objective set out above, the Church is currently involved in providing a variety of activities, both to its members and within the community in general. The aim of these activities is founded upon the Bibles teachings and centuries of historic Christian practice. In order to show and tell of the Love of God in the Gospel of Jesus Christ to both the community and Church members, making disciples of all nations (Mathew 28:19).

One Sixteen Bible Church is undertaking these objectives through the holding of Church worship services, prayer meetings, Bible studies, pastoral counselling and open-air evangelism to enlighten others concerning the Christian faith."

Our Church charity's various weekly activities consist of the following:

- Church services will be conducted from 10.30am until 12.30pm every Sunday.
- Prayer meeting will be implemented once a week (mid week meeting)
- Pastoral counselling with church members and other members of the public showing an interest in the Christian faith on an ongoing basis.
- Open air evangelism conducted a couple of times a week at non specified times.
- Church services consist of singing hymns, times of prayer, communion, reading and preaching from the Bible.

These objectives and activities are conducted in accordance with the primary objective within the Charities governing document and are considered to be of public benefit to many individuals who desire to practice their Christian faith or for those who are inquiring into Christianity.

3) Achievements and performance

Although the success of the Christian faith is not easily measured by visible performance indicators (For example, financial growth/numerical growth etc), it instead measures its effective success upon faithfulness towards the Lords commands from within the scriptures. To both see and be part of a body (group) of Christian believers who are progressively growing in nearness to God over time, through Faith and practice together.

We as trustees recognise that 2020 even with much disruption from the corona virus (Lockdowns/government guidelines etc) was in some small way a very positive and encouraging

one.

We had six new individuals join with us for fellowship as and when possible (due to restrictions) throughout 2020. Two of which (at the time of writing this report 2021) are now committed Church members and actively involved within aspects of Church service.

In between the various government restrictions of 2020, there were also opportunities for the Church to be getting out in the community, sharing the Christian faith with the local people of Worcester and Birmingham. Many of these times were often warmly received by members of the local communities. Some of whom, had not been socially in contact with many other people for great periods of time due to the corona virus.

During 2020 we have also had several individuals who attended the Church services with various practical needs, to which the Lead elders were able to offer pastoral council and advice accordingly and as appropriate towards the Christian faith.

The Church elders and many of the One Sixteen congregants are also in good standing and relationships with other branches of the protestant/evangelical Christian Communities in the Local area. Often our One Sixteen Church pastor being asked to speak at other Churches and to occasionally meet with leaders and congregants in order to share and mutually encourage one another within the Christian faith.

During 2020 we had one previous member transfer his membership to another more local Church due to the extensive distance and travelling.

We continue to hold regular meetings and services where possible (as per our objectives and activities) and we as Charity trustees remain generally very encouraged for the year ahead.

4) Financial review

Since the inception of the Church charity in 2019 until present, the Church has relied totally on the kind financial donations of it's members and congregants. Our Charity bank account was opened in Jan 2020 following the official registration of the Charity in Dec 2019. All donations that were given before the Church bank account was active were therefore subsequently added to the account in the first quarter of 2020. No wider public appeal was made for funds during the year.

The most significant expense relates to services rendered by Pastor Peter Sherwood. To lead and coordinate the Churches activities including the Sunday services, a time of worship, preaching and teaching from the Bible, to provide pastoral care for the congregation and other people and to equip and encourage the Church membership in their Christian life, witness and service.

Remuneration for the above services rendered were independently agreed upon by the majority of non beneficiary trustees as to be suitable and in the best interests of the Charity.


