Trustees report

The trustees present its annual report and the unaudited financial statements for the year ended 31st DECEMBER 2023.

We are incredibly proud of the work that we have been able to accomplish in the reporting year in reaching out to local, national and international communities as we have sought the promotion of the Christian faith mainly but not exclusively by advancing education about the values of Christianity and its contribution.

In the reporting year we have 39 videos that covered a variety of historical topics were created and released via our online digital platforms. These videos covered the time period from the birth of Jesus to 2000AD. These educational videos are used in churches, Bible classes and schools across the country and further afield.

In addition to this we also have worked on the translation of some of our videos and were able to release 100 videos what were dubbed into a number of other languages including Spanish and Italian.

Lineage operates a mentorship programme whereby young videographers and photographers are trained during projects. This took place over a time period of 3.5 intense weeks of training in Italy, Greece and the USA as well as ongoing on a weekly basis throughout the year. The mentorship covered the making of 30 videos in addition to photography. We were able to continue the development of two persons in this intensive training in 2022.

Lineage conducted four training weekends throughout the year (January, February, June, December) in local churches that focused on understanding our spiritual heritage, knowing our history and media training. We had a combined attendance of 350 at these events which were a combination of virtual and in person. In addition we conducted a week long education seminar to a wider audience of 400 on the topics of our spiritual heritage.

In addition to this we have revamped our website and added additional reading resources there to accompany our video releases.

The board has been encouraged by the generous support from members of the public who recognise the vision of Lineage Journey and the importance of providing good educational resources for the younger generations. The chairperson would like to thank the trustees and volunteers who have worked tirelessly to ensure the charities services are credible and in keeping with the strategic goals as stated.

These videos covered the time period from the birth of Jesus to 2000AD. Two of these videos were special projects and were longer and in greater detail than the others. These educational videos are used in churches, Bible classes and schools across the country and further afield. In addition to this the study guides that we produced in 2020 that were in digital format we converted into a printed edition for 2021. This book covered the time period of the Reformation from 300AD to 1800AD. This has been made for individuals to use as well as schools or churches and have been very popular. The topic matter covered the Protestant Reformation, the birth of the Methodist church, the Celtic Church and the Waldenses

In addition to this we also have worked on the translation of some of our videos and were able to release 175 videos what were dubbed into a number of other languages including Spanish and Italian.

Lineage operates a mentorship programme whereby young videographers and photographers are trained during projects. The mentorship covered the making of 21 videos in addition to photography. We were able to train two people in this intensive training in 2021.

Trustees report

The trustees present its annual report and the unaudited financial statements for the year ended 31st DECEMBER 2020.

We are incredibly proud of the work that we have been able to accomplish in the reporting year in reaching out to local, national and international communities as we have sought to the promotion of the Christian faith mainly but not exclusively by advancing education about the values of Christianity and its contribution.

In the reporting year we have 28 videos that covered a variety of historical topics were created and released via our online digital platforms. These videos covered the time period of 4000BC to 2000BC as well as 1500AD and 1900-2000AD. These educational Videos are used in churches, Bible classes and schools across the country and further afield. In addition to this Lineage Journey has produced 48 educational study guides that covered the time period of the Reformation from 300AD to 1800AD. These were made digitally and also designed for print and distribution amongst the churches. The topic matter covered the Protestant Reformation, the birth of the Methodist church, the Celtic Church and the Waldenses.

Lineage operates a mentorship programme whereby young videographers and photographers are trained during projects. This took place over a time period of 3 intense weeks of training in Greece and Turkey as well as ongoing on a weekly basis throughout the year. The mentorship covered the making of 14 videos in addition to photography. We were able to train three persons in this intensive training in 2020.

Lineage conducted 4 training weekends throughout the year (January, April, September, December) in local churches that focused on understanding our spiritual heritage, knowing our history and media training. We had a combined attendance of 350 at these events which were a combination of virtual and in person.

The board has been encouraged by the generous support from members of the public who recognise the vision of Lineage Journey and the importance of providing good educational resources for the younger generations.

The chairperson would like to thank the trustees and volunteers who have worked tirelessly to ensure the charities services are credible and in keeping with the strategic goals as stated.
