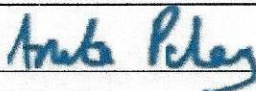
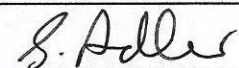

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year**Achievements:****1. Speaker Recruitment and Development:**

- 22 new potential speakers recruited to start training and development
- Mentoring and training process developed to include:
 - One-one mentoring
 - Training
 - Review process
- Threefold increase in the number of speakers ready to present from 2021
 - 15 qualified speakers completed development by end of 2020
 - 21 speakers continuing to develop their presentations

2. Providing speakers and resources for Holocaust education events:

- 5 qualified speakers delivering talks in 2020
- 60 presentations delivered to 4200+ people in schools, universities, religious and civic organisations throughout 2020
- 5 speaker resource packs developed to support educators to extend learning.
