No. s.5914/11335, which uses these funds to provide healthcare, schooling and other support to local communities.

Statement of directors' responsibilities

Shines Children (Uganda) UK Supporters provides funds on a discretionary basis to support the work of Shines Children's Foundation. None of the expenditure in these financial statements is incurred directly by Shines Children (Uganda) UK Supporters.
