For the period 6/4/2023 - 5/4/2024 our planned charity official events and activities were successfully completed which enabled us to support research to help save babies lives and continue to support other bereaved parents when possible.

This included further supporting of the Maternal and Fetal health research centre in Manchester. This included supporting the successful project for Parents' psychological distress, post-traumatic stress, and emotional suppression in a pregnancy following a perinatal death.

Support and awareness of stillbirth were provided to a larger number of people through Baby Loss Awareness Week, and we continue to lead the way locally for the awareness week with the organising of the wave of light and working with the local authority for the awareness of the week. This continues to make a significant difference for bereaved parents.

As trustees during this time, we continue to go above and beyond with awareness of stillbirth and to do our absolute best to continue our daughter's legacy.




