The Kallipateira Moorhouse Foundation will increase the awareness of Stillbirth, support parents who have experienced the death of a baby and support research to help reduce the numbers of babies who die during pregnancy or birth.

For the period 06/04/2024 to 05/04/2025, all planned charity events and activities were successfully delivered in furtherance of the charity's objects and for the public benefit. These activities enabled the continued support of vital research aimed at helping to save babies' lives, alongside ongoing support for bereaved parents.

During this period, the charity continued its support of the Maternal and Fetal Health Research Centre in Manchester, contributing to partner-led research projects and the provision of baby monitoring vests, helping to improve outcomes in pregnancy and neonatal care.

The charity also maintained a strong commitment to raising awareness of baby loss and stillbirth. We played an active role in Baby Loss Awareness Week, achieving a high level of public and media engagement and continuing to lead awareness activities locally. This work has helped to reduce stigma, increase understanding, and provide reassurance and support to bereaved families.

As trustees and bereaved parents, we have had due regard to the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit and continue to go above and beyond in our efforts to raise awareness, support families, and advance research, in keeping with the promise we made to our daughter and in furtherance of her legacy.

During Baby Loss Awareness Week, we led local awareness activities, combining fundraising with remembrance and acknowledgement of all babies who have died.

Through these activities, the charity has continued to deliver meaningful outcomes for families, support research, and raise awareness, in line with its charitable objects.




