For the financial year ending 1st February 2025

1. Introduction

This report provides an overview of the activities and achievements of Fun Club during the financial year ending 1st February 2025. It outlines how the charity has worked towards its objectives and managed its resources.

2. Purpose and Objectives of the Charity

Fun Club works with young people to improve lives in the Burntwood, Lichfield, and Tamworth areas. Our mission is to support youth development through engaging activities, education, and community-building initiatives. The main objectives for the year were:

- To provide safe and varied spaces for young people to express themselves and develop skills.
 - To deliver programs promoting education, health, and wellbeing.
 - To build strong partnerships with local organizations to extend our reach and impact.

3. Activities and Achievements

During the financial year ending 1st February 2025, Fun Club successfully delivered a range of activities aimed at fostering community engagement and providing enjoyable experiences for our members. Key achievements include:

- Organising 343 sessions, which included motivational school workshops and club sessions, with the participation of over 6,777 young people.
- Launching new initiatives such as Tamworth Youth Club, which received positive feedback from participants.
- Building partnerships with Tamworth Borough Council, the Police Commissioner, schools, and other partners to expand our reach and resources.

- Securing funding from Tara Group, Tamworth Borough Council, the Police Commissioner, Lichfield District Council, Support Staffordshire, and local schools including Erasmus Darwin Academy, Burntwood. These funds enabled us to improve facilities and offer more activities.
- Receiving the Beacon Award in recognition of our exceptional support for young people in the local community.

These achievements reflect our commitment to creating a vibrant, inclusive environment where everyone can enjoy and participate in the activities we offer.

4. Financial Review

The charity's income for the year was £98,673.38, primarily from funders, grants, and some donations from the Community Lottery Fund. Expenditure amounted to £79,522.91, mainly on salaries for managers and self-employed staff providing motivational sessions in schools, as well as on resources for young people, including refreshments, food, outings, and trips. The charity ended the year with a balance of £37,971.58.

5. Future Plans

In the coming year, Fun Club aims to build on the good work already done by expanding further into schools and offering more motivational activities and workshops for young people. We also plan to ensure that all our staff receive the necessary mandatory training and to expand opportunities for staff to shadow managers and experienced team members. Additionally, we are seeking to recruit more volunteers, train young people to become mentors, and work on recruiting more trustees to strengthen our governance.

6. Governance and Management

The charity is governed by a board of trustees who meet twice yearly to oversee operations. In addition to these meetings, trustees discuss information, advice, and guidance regularly through emails and phone calls. During this year, we welcomed a new Safeguarding Trustee, Mr. Briggs, who is from Erasmus Darwin Academy (EDA) School. His expertise will strengthen our safeguarding practices and help ensure the safety and wellbeing of all young people involved with Fun Club.

7. Risk Management

The trustees have reviewed risks and taken steps to mitigate them. We have up-to-date risk assessments, public liability insurance, and other necessary insurances all maintained to ensure the charity operates safely and responsibly.

Motivations workshops

Having the friendly face over the summer workshops with young people and they see us in School when they start eases anxiety and worry. Delivery of Motivations working with the Pastoral Care Team to support young people through issues and raising awareness on a variety of topics, and opportunities they would not have received otherwise. This has increased our members intake who have joined the Clubs and started Volunteering and having FCH as a Placement for their DOE this would have been a slower process if we hadn't of built relationships with young people in a school setting

Tamworth club

The blend of face to face work and outreach approach to engage with young people when starting a new project, the on going effect of Covid has had as the cohort of young people are mostly home educated that the club is vital in giving young people a safe space to socialise and gain informal education.

Christmas Wellbeing bags

This was a need and a luxury for members in Club who are living on their own after leaving care, one young person commented that we had made her xmas and enjoyed packing the bags up for other young people .

Food donations from Greggs

This partnership with Greggs has been going strong for 6 years in Lichfield we pick up their donations and used to have some to give to the homeless, now young people are taking home for parents lunches, school dinners for the next day, we are still hoping we can set up something similar in the Burntwood area. We still continue to offer free hot drinks snacks at all clubs.

Supports Staffordshire Youth Awards

Is a great event for our Members here they are recognised for their achievements this supports them in taking the next steps in training to the next level .Brilliant for job interviews

New Juniors club in Lichfield

Identified the need to lower the age range to Primary School year 5&6 for the first hour Young leaders gain experience and the juniors enjoy socializing with other local young people they may be going to Secondary School with .

Case studies



Last academic Year T was very nervous about school and his friendships. Through spending time with T and chatting with him it became obvious he needed some extra support with this so he joined the 'Motivations' groupwork with Fun Club.

I asked T's mum for some thoughts about how this has made an impact on T.

My son has never been a massive fan of school, he had lost his confidence and motivation for learning and was also struggling socially. Miss Matthews introduced him to the fun club during the school day and it really helped him form friendships and build his confidence back up.

Within months he has enjoyed a residential trip away to Whitemore lakes, has signed up for his bronze Duke of Edinburgh awards and is volunteering as a youth councillor for Lichfield council.

He now spends time with years 5-6 volunteering with fun club on a Thursday night as he recognises how important it is to give back to your community.

Fun club provides a safe space for our youth to breathe, learn and discover new things.

I can't thank the team enough for all the work that they do!

T is now thriving in school; his confidence is evident and he is an active member of both the Academy and local community

Hi guys, this is just a quick email to say how much we appreciate everyone at the hub and what it brings for our girls .

As you know, both girls are home schooled and for the most part this works well for us, the only part we struggled to fulfil was the social side as most clubs are either aimed at younger children or cost the equivalent of selling a kidney on the black market (I'm saving that option for a rainy day).

For me the time and location are perfect. I love hearing about what the girls get upto each week and it brings fresh conversations (as we share a lot of our day, new experiences are limited).

The fact that the group is a welcoming safe space means the girls love going back each week. And it gives me peace of mind that they have adults they are comfortable chatting too if they have any concerns they struggle to share with me.

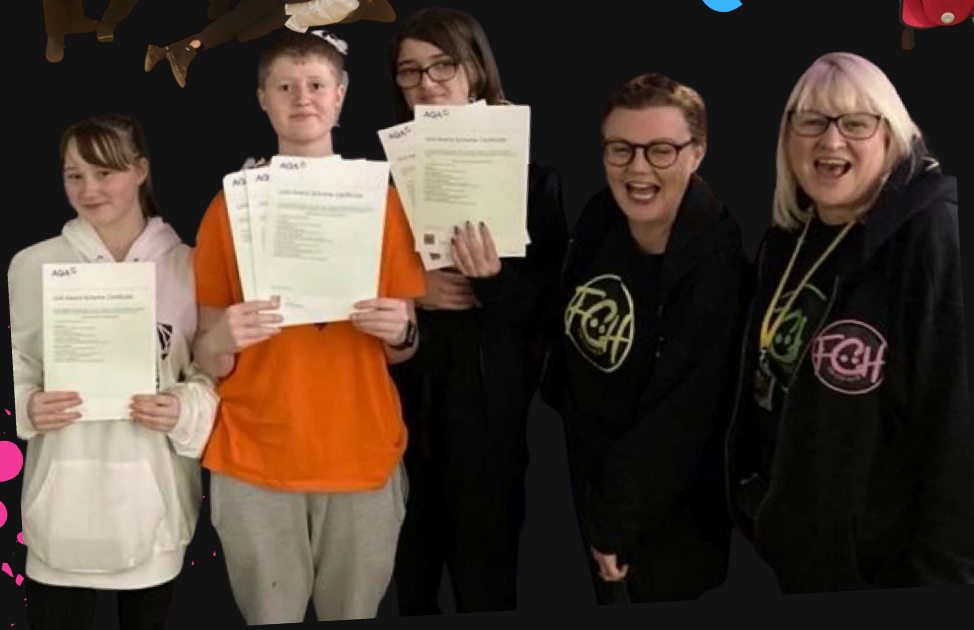

Trustees Report and Financial Accounts

Trustees Report 2021-2022

The past year has obviously been very difficult for our members, staff, and volunteers, but we managed to continue to provide services for local young people keep going. Due to Covid 19 the start of 2021 we adapted to the government's lockdown rules and stages, which meant that at the beginning of the year we went back to our regular Zoom sessions. This started from the 4th January, Where we spent time planning with our young leaders and volunteers.

Fun Club Hub adapted ways our usual way of working during the Spring 2021 lockdown, continuing to work from home, as we had a team of young volunteers and young people who relied on us. Within a week of this planning sessions we had a new way of working through the use of social media platforms. This included competitions, quizzes, zoom meetings, one to one support, and group work support. We have continued to provide a weekly programme, weekly team meetings, and awareness on current issues from Black Lives Matter to Mental Health Awareness.

We have been flexible in our approach and responded to the young people's needs. Delivering 3 sessions of Youth provision over three evenings a week whilst in lockdown, and on call 7 days a week for support.

During this period Fun Club Hub delivered 35 online sessions, engaging with 350 contacts. We decided to plan our sessions monthly to help us to be responsive to the constantly changing situation. We were also hoping to be able to go and re-start detached work as soon as possible. We were able to provide some fantastic activities online, as we had learnt from our experience of working in the pandemic in 2000, were already experienced from last year. These activities ran through January, February and March and included quizzes wellbeing sessions, and work around Chinese New Year. We also delivered 100 wellbeing bags to our regular members, so they were able to have a hands-on zoom experience, doing the activities, while watching us. These included Chinese New Year crafts, pancake making, Valentines Day activities and a range of crafts, talks, quizzes, as well as DJ and Karoke sessions.

During March we delivered the Juniors Young Leader skills sessions. These were on a Thursday and Staffordshire Council for Voluntary Services delivered these to our older group. All the Young People received certificates for their online learning, which of course we celebrated. We supported Molly our apprentice throughout her time with us and also our young people who had left care for the first time, with zoom sessions around wellbeing and support.

We secured funding for projects to start on 21st April in Lichfield and Burntwood called the HOPE PROJECT. The aim of this project was to support our young leaders, members and local community coming out of COVID and provide them with something to look forward to and feel good about themselves. This project was very successful with Art and Graffiti projects completed on the Skatepark in Burntwood and an Art Project in Lichfield, with support from staff. The project was fantastic, and the feedback from everyone involved was that they felt really involved and enjoyed it. We secured funding from the National Lottery. This was amazing news for the project, and we were able to share the news with members and their parents. During this time we started to use part of the funding for Motivations in EDA School and The Bridge Pupil Referral Unit (PRU). The Motivations project was also to deliver sessions and relationships and self-esteem, as well one to one sessions. These were so well received that EDA asked us to provide another day of sessions a week starting from September 2021. Received the funding from the National Lottery, meant more financial stability for the project which enabled Liz to give up her other career so that she can focus on the clubs and Schools work with Kerry.

In the summer holidays we secured funding from SPACE to deliver sessions in our clubs and in outside. Which we were able to do with the support of our Young leaders and volunteers. The sessions were for universal & targeted young people. They were promoted through our social media platforms and various Zoom meetings with partners as well as bymembers of the Youth Clubs and young people we worked with at The Bridge PRU, Erasmus Darwin Academy and The Friary School who were all part of our targeted cohorts.

HIGHLIGHTS

The Fun Club Hub has high levels of good will and respect among those it serves and the whole community. We are a well-respected and fundamental partner in the District supporting a partnership made up of statutory and non-statutory providers with the aim of retaining, developing and supporting colleagues to identify children and young people at risk. Fun Club Hub work in a co-ordinated and collaborative way by liaising with referrers, identifying needs and strengths of individuals and intervening early to ensure engagement and provide targeted support. Working with children's social care teams, schools, police, community safety and community organisations they are key partners who support the delivery of the police SPACE summer scheme, provide universal out of school activities and deliver motivational workshops in high schools with universal groups which deliberately include young people at risk of exclusion. Following those workshops, rapport and trust is gained with additional 'at risk' individuals so that motivational 1-2-1 work can begin.

LOWLIGHTS

We have had some obstacles to the group's programme, regarding access to two venues but we are working hard to try and overcome them. One of our venues of delivery is Burntwood Youth and Community Centre, as we were told it may have to close. Working with local partners and contacts we are hoping to find an alternative base in the locality. Despite many obstacles such as premises and location, etc we do persevere to continue delivery and retain engagement with those most at risk children and young people until such times to look for an appropriate site.

Our commitment to safeguarding has repeatedly seen the teamwork with young

people at risk, well outside of their normal operating hours. Whilst this has never been an obstacle to the group, it has meant that they have supported children and young people at unsociable hours to ensure their safety and enable concerns to be escalated in a timely manner. We continue to deliver above and beyond with complete commitment with no limits to our availability to young people and their welfare.

Trustees Report 2020-2021

The past year has obviously been very difficult for our members, staff, and volunteers, but we managed to keep going. Due to Covid 19 the start of 2021 we adapted to the government's lockdown rules and stages, so at the beginning of the year we started back on our regular Zooms starting from 4th Jan, planning with our young leaders and volunteers. We decided to take it month by month with planning online as we were hoping to get out to do detached work as soon as we could, we were able to have great activities online, as we were already experienced from last year. We organised, quiz's, wellbeing, Chinese new year throughout January, February and March and April, we delivered wellbeing bags to our regular members so they would be able to have hands on zoom experience while watching us, such as, Chinese new year crafts, pancake making, valentines, crafts, talks, quiz's, DJ's, and karaoke. Though March we delivered the juniors young leader skills sessions, on a Thursday and Staffordshire voluntary service delivered to our older group, they all received certificates for their online learning, which of course we celebrated. We also supported Molly our apprentice throughout her time, plus our young people who had left care for the first time, with zooms around wellbeing support. We had zoom calls in March with EDA schools to support students back to lessons and motivation techniques. We had partners such as Sexual Health Team deliver online live chats and wellbeing talks. We celebrated Birthdays, awareness days, just to keep people's morale up and positive mental health advice. We celebrated our Young Volunteers work in April. We had gained funding for projects to start on 21st April in Lichfield and Burntwood called the HOPE PROJECT to support our young leaders, members and local community coming out of COVID and giving them something to look forward to and feel good about themselves. This went really well with Art and Graffiti projects on the Skatepark in Burntwood and Art Project in Lichfield, with staff members coming back to support to.
