Second Chance Akita Rescue is dedicated to alleviating the suffering of Akitas through rescue, rehabilitation, and rehoming, regardless of the dog's age, health status, or sex. In accordance with our governing document, we ensure that every Akita in our care is treated with respect and dignity.

Our mission extends beyond rescue operations to include the provision of advice, support, and education to Akita owners and the wider public. We actively collaborate with like-minded organisations to promote the welfare and positive attributes of the Akita breed. Additionally, we advocate for responsible pet ownership, including the benefits of neutering and spaying, to help prevent unwanted litters.

SCAR operates across the United Kingdom, with our core activities including:

- Rehoming Akitas from private individuals.
- Assisting in the rehoming of Akitas from other UK-based rescue organisations, including local authority council pounds, dog wardens, police, social services, and Battersea Dogs & Cats Home.
- Conducting home assessments and temperament evaluations.
- Providing education and guidance to both current and prospective Akita owners.
- Offering lifetime support and full rescue backup for all dogs adopted through SCAR.

Our presence on social media continues to grow, enabling us to reach and engage with a broader audience. This expansion has facilitated increased public interaction, allowing us to offer advice and support through both our social media platforms and website.

Where feasible, we provide assistance to help owners retain their pets, which may include support with food and veterinary care. We remain committed to helping Akitas regardless of age, health, or behavioural challenges, and are proud to be among the few rescues that uphold this inclusive approach.

In 2024, Second Chance Akita Rescue successfully rehomed 51 Akitas across the United Kingdom. We remain committed to supporting every Akita in need, regardless of age, health condition, or behavioural challenges. This inclusive approach continues to distinguish SCAR as one of the few rescue organisations that does not discriminate based on these factors.

Our digital presence has grown significantly, enhancing our ability to engage with and support a wider audience. Our private Facebook group now exceeds 5,000 members, while our public page has grown to over 10,000 followers. This increased reach has enabled us to provide timely advice, resources, and support to both current and prospective Akita owners.

We continue to offer comprehensive post-adoption support, including behavioural guidance and ongoing assistance to adopters. This proactive approach contributes to our low return rates and ensures long-term success for both the dogs and their new families.





- We provide lifetime support to all our adopters.

Our social media platform audiences continued to grow. This has helped Second Chance Akita Rescue to engage with larger numbers of the general public, offering the above services. We continue to see an increase in people looking for advice and support, both through our social media platforms and through our website.

Where possible we offer support to enable owners to keep their family pet and not have to surrender them to rescue, and has included providing help with food and veterinary care.





SCAR operates throughout the United Kingdom. Our organisation is dedicated to the welfare and rehoming of Akitas, and our main activities include:


