- Rehoming Akitas from private individuals.

- We carry out Akita temperament assessments.
- We offer education and advice to both current owners and prospective new owners.
- We provide lifetime support to all our adopters.

We have increased our following on a number of social media platforms. This has helped Second Chance Akita Rescue to engage with larger numbers of the general public, offering the above services. We have seen an increase people asking for advice and support, both through our social media platforms and through our website.

We provide help and support to enable owners to keep their family pet and not have to surrender to rescue where possible.




