  - We provide lifetime support to all our adopters
  - We also offer education and advice to both current owners and prospective new owners.

We continue to increase our following on a number of social media platforms, as well as our website. This has helped SCAR to engage with a larger number of the general public, offering the above services. The number of people asking for advice continues to increase.

Where possible we can offer help and advice to enable owners to keep their family pet and not have to surrender to rescue.


