Organised Mother's Day and Father's Day community events, supporting family wellbeing, single parents, widows, and promoting positive parenting values.


Conducted evangelism and outreach activities, inviting members of the public to participate in a supportive church community.

These activities reduced social isolation, supported vulnerable individuals, strengthened family relationships, and improved emotional and spiritual wellbeing within the community.

Youth, Student and Children's Development

Delivered monthly music and creative outreach events (held every last Friday of the month) aimed at young people and university students, encouraging positive life choices and personal development.

Supported the DLCC Bradford University Students Society, enabling students to influence their peers positively and live purposeful lives.

Delivered children's education and biblical teaching programmes, supporting moral development and positive values.

Implemented an empowerment and skills development programme, enrolling participants in intensive property training to promote financial literacy and long-term economic empowerment.

Public Benefit:

These programmes supported young people and students to develop confidence, purpose, life skills, and resilience, contributing to responsible citizenship and long-term social benefit.

Facilities, Equipment and Organisational Development

Secured a new church venue tenancy, ensuring stability and continuity of charitable activities:

Installed a church stage to support worship, teaching, and community events.

Invested in audio-visual and digital equipment, including large display screens and streaming equipment, to improve accessibility and engagement.

Purchased approximately 100 chairs to increase capacity for services and community activities.

Improved facilities through the purchase of chandeliers, table covers, and chair covers, creating a safe and welcoming environment.

Maintained church vehicle insurance and transportation support, including travel between London and Bradford to enable charitable activities.

These investments improved access to services, enhanced the quality and safety of community activities, and strengthened the charity's ability to deliver its objectives effectively.
