TRUSTEES REPORT for the period 5th February 2020 to 31 March 2021

The trustees present their report and accounts for the period 5 February 2020 to 31 March 2021

Objects

The object of the charity is to relieve the suffering of dogs of any age or breed in need of care and attention, and in particular to provide and maintain a rescue and rehoming service for the reception, care and treatment of such animals in England, Wales and Cyprus who by reason of abandonment, neglect or mistreatment are in need of such care and attention.

Principal Activity

The principal activity of the charity is the rehoming of Dogs which have been mistreated.

Achievements & Performance

Despite the challenges of Covid 19, our charity was still able to support in the rescue and rehoming of 34 dogs between 1st January and 31st December 2020. Dogs were rescued in both the UK and Cyprus and all dogs were rehomed to carefully approved adoptive families in the UK.

We were very pleased to have been successfully in our application for a London Marathon Charity Ballot place for 2021 and this is being run by one of our volunteer fosterers, Caroline Brooks. We are grateful for the time and effort Caroline will apply to both the physical race and fundraising aspect of the event and wish her lots of luck in this event.

Financial Review

The Charity's main source of income has been raised by inviting potential owners to make a donation towards the costs involved in transporting the dogs and the veterinary inspections necessary to allow movement of the animals. Where appropriate, donors are invited to make their contributions through the Gift Aid scheme to enhance the value of the contributions made.

Just under 80% of total costs incurred relate to the veterinary inspections, boarding and transportation costs for the dogs rehomed.

At the end of the first period of operation, the Charity is left with a net working capital balance of £1,619.

Structure, Governance & Management

The charity is run by three Trustees, Alexandra Vipurs, Kane Vipurs and Hannah Wolverson, all of whom share a lifelong love of dogs. The Trustees are all actively involved in the rescue and rehoming process of the dogs that are helped by the charity. The charity provides a personal service in identifying suitable homes who will be able to meet the physical and behavioural requirements of each dog within our care.

Dogs are cared for in family foster homes while a suitable home is sought and no time limit is placed on the amount of time taken to find a suitable home for each dog.

In connection with our examination, no matter has come to our attention:


