We are grateful to Councillor Alex Dale of Derbyshire County Council who gave us a grant of £300 from his pot for the "Members Community Leadership Scheme".

We were delighted that we were able to hold out first in-person concert with an audience on Saturday 18th December in Dronfield Parish Church. This was the first concert we have been able to have since 15 March 2020. It were very well; there was an audience of about 100 people in the church and another 22 watching online on a live stream.


