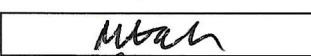
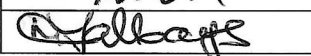

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

This is the fifth annual report for the charity, having been constituted and registered by the Charity Commission in February 2020. As a fundraising charity that awards grants we have used this year to continue fundraising efforts, forge partnerships and award grants.

Our Defibrill18 Campaign continues to fund defibrillators for sports clubs for children and young people in the areas we cover. STF have continued to work in partnership with registered charity AED Donate who provide essential first aid services through the placement of Defibrillators through community fundraising. This venture allows us to utilise AED Donate's expertise in sourcing, installing and training around defibrillators and STF's funds. Applicants for funding for defibrillators complete an STF application form and Trustees consider applications in line with the charities Grant Giving Policy.

Funds have been raised this year via:

Events – a Charity Golf Day in Bristol (Steve's hometown) which raised funds and awareness via this event.

Individual giving – a small number of financial gifts were received throughout the year by individual donors. The gifts have been used as fundraising prizes at the Bristol golf and Miller dinner events.

Merchandise – a range of shirts and hoodies were designed and sold to raise funds.

Corporate giving – our charity partnership with Miller Insurance continued this financial year. Our fourth annual fundraising dinner with Miller also took place.

During 2024/25 the following grants were awarded:

Toby Richardson via Make Them Smile Charity – Toby has trained tirelessly and now has made the UK Paralympics team. So we gave him a further donation this year to support with his on-going training.

Hannah Evans – Single mum of four children that needed support with the children's swimming lessons after falling on financial hardship whilst divorcing her husband.

Twickenham Tigers – Have run a number of football camps over Easter on behalf of the charity and STF have funded places for under privileged children/young people

Hampton Wick Royal Cricket Club – Heathfield Junior School have been running cricket camps for girls and boys – encouraging the sport in schools that would not normally offer cricket – STF have funded 2 days in October where 40 children benefitted.

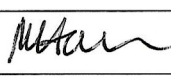

During 2023/24 the following grants were awarded:

Panathlon Foundation – for a third year we continued to fund the delivery of a sports programme for disabled children at The Children's Trust in Surrey

Rudy Talboys (Wakeboarder) - to help with costs of training, travel, insurance and competition for the year 2023/2024 enabling Rudy to compete at the highest level, to represent Team GB. This application posed a conflict of interest for Trustees, so the charity commission was consulted and advice followed.

Wey Island Trust – our grant helps the Trust to continue to support over 1000 deprived children from Inner London boroughs each year at their secluded riverside activity centre in Surrey. In partnership with AED Donate we also funded two defibrillators for use during activities.

Make them Smile Foundation - STF fund coaching, equipment and travel for 14-year-old Toby Richardson from Gloucestershire who is a wheelchair rugby and basketball player and a wheelchair racer and athlete. This is the first of a two-year commitment to fund these costs via Make them Smile Foundation.

We would like to thank our individual supporters and donors, and Miller Insurance for the funds they have most generously donated to the charity during this period.

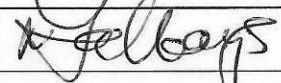

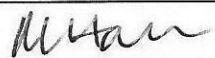

During this period the charity has extended its geographical area to include Surrey, Greater London, Bristol and Gloucestershire. Having previously only covered Surrey, this means we can give more funding/grants to sports clubs and individuals across more areas.

Our Defibrill18 Campaign continues to fund defibrillators for sports clubs for children and young people in the areas we cover. STF have continued to work in partnership with registered charity AED Donate who provide essential first aid services through the placement of Defibrillators through community fundraising. This venture allows us to utilise AED Donate's expertise in sourcing, installing and training around defibrillators and STF's funds. Applicants for funding for defibrillators complete an STF application form and Trustees consider applications in line with the charities Grant Giving Policy.

Funds have been raised this year via:

Events – we ran our first Charity Golf Day (July 2022) in Bristol (Steve's hometown) and raised funds and awareness via this event.

Individual giving – a small number of financial gifts were received throughout the year.

Merchandise – a range of shirts and hoodies were designed and sold to raise funds.

Corporate giving – our charity partnership with Miller Insurance continued this financial year.
