Report of the trustees for the year ending 31 March 2025.

The Trustees present their annual report and accounts for the year ended 31 March 2025.

Our Aims

New Leaf Alresford was registered as a CIO on the 4 March 2020 and this is the Trustees fifth annual report.

The charity operates under the New Leaf Alresford Constitution dated 10th August 2024 to comply with the requirements of the Charities Act 2011. The Constitution was updated during this year to recognise the addition of another trustee: J. Cridland.

The objects of the charity are to promote, for the benefit of the public, the conservation and improvement of the physical and natural environment. This is achieved by providing information and guidance, improving environmental awareness and promoting sustainable living.

New Leaf Alresford aims to provide local information and advice, to help the community adopt the positive changes needed to tackle climate change, promote sustainability and protect our environment through the New Leaf Website: www.newleafalresford.org and via Facebook and Instagram. We participate locally on projects which help to tackle climate change, reduce waste and boost biodiversity.

Our Objectives

Our objectives are set to reflect our aims of promoting sustainability and waste reduction, tackling climate change and boosting biodiversity.

Our objectives for the year included:

To continue work and to grow and develop membership and links with other community groups.

To continue to support the verges management pilot in Alresford.

To reduce waste and increase recycling locally.

Promoting greener, more sustainable living.

Review of Activities and Achievement

To Grow and Develop New Leaf Membership

We continued to hold the monthly 'New Leaf Natter' which offers a social gathering for our supporters with the opportunity to meet other members, discuss topics and plan projects. The New Leaf WhatsApp group allows key supporters to collaborate and communicate outside of meetings and now has 18 members. A separate Community Growing Whats App group has 12 members.

Community Awareness, New Leaf Website and Social Media

The charity continues to maintain and update the New Leaf website, providing information as well as adding new content, which is promoted through social media, to encourage people to visit the website. This year we introduced a feature on local sustainability champions, where local community members talk about the changes they have made in their own lives to be more sustainable.

A New Leaf Alresford trustee continues to participate in the Neighbourhood Plan Advisory Group supporting adoption of measures within the plan to help tackle climate change, enhance biodiversity and future-proof the town. This work is ongoing.

3 New Leaf Alresford Trustees attended an evening with the Alresford brownies where we engaged the brownies in a number of activities to educate about topics including water conservation and food waste.

In May 2024, New Leaf Alresford held a stall in the first dedicated 'Eco area' at the Watercress Festival in the town. The stall offered educational material on display boards and games to promote energy saving and recycling.

'Six Inches of Soil' Film showing

In September 2024, as part of Winchester Green Week, New Leaf Alresford hosted a screening of the film 'Six Inches of Soil' at the Perins School. 120 people attended including four panellists who agreed to take part in the post-film question and answer session, Perins' Geography teachers and pupils and interested members of the community.

The film followed three producers in their first year using regenerative farming methods and featured relatively simple changes that enabled them to be better custodians of their land and animals. A lively discussion took place following the screening with questions and view points put forward by the audience to the panellists. The local MP attended and spoke to the audience at close the event.

Sustainability in Business Event

In November 2024, thirty local businesses owners, managers, and interested parties, attended the second 'Sustainability in Business' event to hear from two very different

businesses. The first was Dave Annette from local ethical bee farmers Honey Bee Happy. He explained how their entire business has sustainability at its heart. Their business, similar to any relying on a natural product, is directly affected by our changing climate and weather patterns. They give a great deal of thought to the materials they use and soon their items will be entirely plastic-free. They are constantly reassessing and looking for better solutions. This was followed by Adam Holden from the oldest English wine institution Berry Bros and Rudd spoke to us about a very different type of business. Berry Bros and Rudd turns over £250M per year and employs 420 people. Berry Bros and Rudd is keen to focus on the aspects of their business they can influence. This included transportation within the UK, where they have moved their fleet of vehicles to 40% electric, and are using Hydrotreated Vegetable Oil (HVO) to fuel the remaining diesel vehicles which are still needed for their range. They have also worked to highlight the link between better viticulture practices and better taste, and make the case for the use of natural cork.

Reusable Plastic Cups

In 2022, the charity received approximately 2000 unwanted Alresford Music Festival branded reusable plastic cups. The charity continued operating a cup hire scheme which generates some income and reduces single plastic consumption.

Thermal Camera Loan Scheme

In December 2022, New Alresford Town Council purchased a thermal imaging camera to help Alresford residents reduce their carbon emissions and winter fuel bills. The camera allows residents to identify areas of heat loss in their homes, so that they can do something about it. The charity continued to administer the camera loan scheme for the town.

Community Growing

The community growing project has continued to go from strength to strength. A grant from the Winchester Round Table saw the purchase and installation of a greenhouse to sit alongside the shed. The year saw the first full growing season and a team of established volunteers exists with communication working well through the utilisation of a new What's App group.

Future Plans

To continue its work and to grow and develop its membership and links with other community groups.

To continue to develop the community growing project and offer opportunities for participation within the community.

To hold future community events using the experience, volunteers and materials we have garnered from the events held this year.

Our Finances

The charity received a grant of £400 from Winchester Round Table and a private donation of £482 to support the Community Growing project including purchasing a greenhouse and materials as well as holding of events including the Sustainability in Business event.

The charity made approximately £280 profit from the film screening event.

The charity also made a small profit from fundraising activities at various events, hiring out the reusable plastic cups and selling reusable Alresford shopping bags.



Review of Activities and Achievement

To Grow and Develop New Leaf Membership

The monthly 'New Leaf Natter' has become an established event held on the second Thursday of the month throughout the year. It offers a social gathering for our supporters with the opportunity to meet other members, discuss topics and plan projects. In June 2023, we started a WhatsApp group for supporters to collaborate and communicate outside of meetings.

Community Awareness, New Leaf Website and Social Media

The charity continues to maintain and update the New Leaf website, providing information as well as adding new content, which is promoted through social media, to encourage people to visit the website. These have included informative posts on sustainable healthcare and news about New Leaf events.

In July the charity conducted a food waste survey of shops and businesses in the town. A survey was distributed to over 20 businesses within the town and approximately 13 responses were received. The data showed that food waste is very low with several examples of good practice observed.

New Leaf Alresford provided a trustee for the Neighbourhood Plan Advisory Group supporting adoption of measures within the plan to help tackle climate change, enhance biodiversity and future-proof the town. This work is ongoing.

The charity took part in the town's Christmas late night shopping and arrival of Father Christmas event with a stall selling reusable Alresford bags.

New Leaf presented to the Bishops Waltham Sustainability Group and loaned the group promotional materials to support their Eco Fair.

Alresford Eco Fair

New Leaf Alresford won a grant from Winchester City Council to hold two community events. The town's first community Eco Fair was held in November 2023. The fair had 16 stalls provided by New Leaf, other local charities and commercial organisations. Stalls included: WinACC and Buildpass on home energy; the community town bus, Wayfarer Bicycle Services and Cycle Winchester on active travel; the Hampshire and IOW Wildlife Trust on chalk streams and wildlife gardening; a Waste Prevention Champion, clothes swap and local zero waste refill shop on waste reduction; Alresford Men's Shed focussing on repairing and repurposing; plant-based food; reusable bags; recycling and carbon friendly games.

Stalls provided a mix of information, products for sale, free children's bike checks and interactive games to raise awareness of environment, sustainability and tackling climate change. There was also a programme of presentations covering: Solar Panels, Heat Pumps, Chalk Streams, Wildlife Friendly Gardening and Sustainable Fashion.

We held an Eco Poster competition for local school children with a prize for the best poster demonstrating how to look after our planet. Children also decorated envelopes filled with wildflower seeds, which were given as prizes at the fair.

320 members of the public attended the Eco Fair and a number also attended the presentations. 20 people volunteered with New Leaf Alresford to help host our first event and this helped strengthen our volunteer base and engagement. 15 junior school eco club members participated in the seed envelope decorating and poster competition.

Sustainability in Business Event

The second event facilitated by the grant was a 'Sustainability in Business' event held in January 2024, with a programme of three speakers.

The Pollinator, a business consulting service based in Hampshire who provide businesses with assistance in gaining 'B Corp' certification, explained the process, the benefits and how companies can become a B Corp certified company.

Simon Burvill from Hampshire based furniture company Gaze Burvill spoke about some of the management ideas adopted by his company and their journey to becoming a B Corp.

Stuart Mills from WinACC spoke about the financial support available to companies particularly around energy surveys and installing solar panels.

New Leaf provided display material and information focusing on the support available to businesses for installing solar panels and switching to electric company vehicles.

26 representatives from local businesses attended the event.

Reusable Plastic Cups

The charity received approximately 2000 unwanted Alresford Music Festival branded reusable plastic cups. The charity continued operating a cup hire scheme which generates some income and reduces single plastic consumption.

Thermal Camera Loan Scheme

In December 2022, New Alresford Town Council purchased a thermal imaging camera to help Alresford residents reduce their carbon emissions and winter fuel bills. The camera allows residents to identify areas of heat loss in their homes, so that they can do something about it. The charity continued to administer the camera loan scheme for the town.

Biodiversity and Verges Management

Following on from New Leaf Alresford working with other local groups interested in the management of roadside verges and our participation in the consultation on the District's Biodiversity Action Plan in September 2020 where we asked for changes in verge management to be included in the plan, Alresford was selected for a pilot scheme which saw the number of cuts for roadside verges reduced, with two verge locations being

allocated for just two cuts per annum. The charity continued to support the pilot throughout the year providing information to the community as well as carrying out photographic surveys.

Community Growing

In December 2023 New Leaf Alresford acquired an allotment plot which has been registered with Incredible Edible. The vision for this project is an inclusive community growing enterprise, which we hope might ultimately include children's groups and social prescribing elements. The Allotment Society kindly donated their old shed which has been repaired and rebuilt by New Leaf volunteers. The charity has received secondhand tools and water butts donated by the community, and the first crop of vegetables has been successfully cultivated and harvested.

Future Plans

To continue its work and to grow and develop its membership and links with other community groups.

To establish the community growing project and offer opportunities for participation within the community.

To hold future community events using the experience, volunteers and materials we have garnered from the events held this year.

Our Finances

The charity received a grant of £1050 from Winchester City Council to hold two events, an Eco Fair and a Sustainability in Business event.

The charity also made a small profit from fundraising activities, hiring out their reusable plastic cups and selling reusable Alresford shopping bags.



New Leaf Alresford aims to provide local information and advice, to help the community to adopt the positive changes needed to tackle climate change, promote sustainability and protect our environment through the New Leaf Website: www.newleafalresford.org and Facebook group. We participate locally on projects which tackle climate change, increase recycling and boost biodiversity.

Our Objectives

Our objectives are set to reflect our aims of promoting sustainability and recycling, tackling climate change and boosting biodiversity.

Our objectives for the year included:

To continue its work and to grow and develop its membership and links with other community groups.

The charity will continue to support the verges management pilot in Alresford.

Reducing waste and increasing recycling locally.

Promoting greener, more sustainable living.

Review of Activities and Achievement

To Grow and Develop New Leaf Membership

In November 2022 we held our first social gathering to provide our supporters the opportunity to come along, meet other members, discuss topics and plan projects. The event has become an established monthly meeting called the New Leaf Natter which is held on the second Thursday of the month.

Community Awareness, New Leaf Website and Social Media

The charity continues to maintain and update the charity's website providing information as well as add new posts, which are promoted through social media, to encourage people to visit the website. These included informative posts for Food Waste Action Week, Global Recycling Day, No Mow May, The Big Plastic Count, Save Every Drop, local events, and relevant news.

New Leaf Trustees presented to the Lydia Group - a local group which meets monthly.

The charity participated on the organising committee for the Queens Platinum Jubilee "Party in the Park" event which was a free event attended by approximately 2000 local people. The charity's contribution was to ensure that wherever possible the event was sustainable and the impact on the environment was kept to a minimum. As part of this we supplied our reusable plastic cups on a deposit scheme. In addition the charity had a stall at the event which raised awareness of the group.

In September 2022, New Leaf Alresford had a stall at the Alresford Agricultural Show. The stall provided games and educational material relating to reducing your carbon footprint, waste and recycling, home energy and gardening for wildlife.

In the Autumn of 2022 the charity produced a flyer with information promoting solar energy for businesses, offering information on the benefits and the support available. Approximately 30 businesses on Alresford's industrial estate were visited in person and provided with the information.

Reusable Plastic Cups

The charity received approximately 2000 unwanted Alresford Music Festival branded reusable plastic cups. The charity is now operating a cup

hire scheme which generates some income and reduces single plastic consumption. The cups were used at the Jubilee 'Party in the Park' event, The Alresford Show, and Petersfield Eco Fair.

Thermal Camera Loan Scheme

In December 2022, New Alresford Town Council purchased a thermal imaging camera to help Alresford residents reduce their carbon emissions and winter fuel bills.

The camera allows residents to identify areas of heat loss in their homes, so that they can do something about it. Examples include installing additional insulation, draught excluders, radiator reflectors, thermal curtains, double or triple glazing.

The council donated the camera to New Leaf Alresford, and the charity administers the loan scheme for the town. In the first 3 months of 2023 approximately 15 local residents borrowed the camera.

Biodiversity and Verges Management

Following on from New Leaf Alresford working with other local groups interested in the management of roadside verges and our participation in the consultation on the District's Biodiversity Action Plan in September 2020 where we asked for changes in verge management to be included in the plan, Alresford was selected for a pilot scheme which will see the number of cuts for roadside verges reduced with two verge locations being allocated for 2 cuts per annum. The charity continued to support the pilot throughout the year providing information to the community as well as carrying out photographic surveys.

Future Plans

The charity plans to continue its work and to grow and develop its membership and links with other community groups.

The charity will support the verges management pilot in Alresford.

The charity plans to apply for a grant to allow it to undertake community planting projects.

Our Finances

The charity received a donation for presenting to another community group and a personal donation from a supporter to cover the pitch fee to attend The Alresford Show.

The charity also made a small profit from fundraising activities and also hiring 'reusable plastic cups' to other groups, at The Alresford Show and the Alresford Queens Platinum Jubilee events.



New Leaf Alresford

Report of the trustees for the year ending 31 March 2021.

The Trustees present their annual report and accounts for the year ended 31 March 2016.

Our Aims

New Leaf Alresford was registered as a CIO on the 4th of March 2020 and this is the Trustees' first annual report.

The charity operates under the New Leaf Alresford Constitution dated 3rd March 2020 to comply with the requirements of the Charities Act 2011.

The aims of the charity are to promote for the benefit of the public the conservation, protection and improvement of the physical and natural environment by the provision of information and guidance, improving environmental awareness and promoting sustainable living.

New Leaf Alresford aims to provide local information and advice to help our community adopt the positive changes needed to tackle climate change, promote sustainability and protect our environment via the New Leaf website: www.newleafalresford.org, Facebook group and Instagram account. We participate in local projects which aim to tackle climate change, increase recycling and boost biodiversity.

Our Objectives

Our objectives are set to reflect our aims of promoting recycling, tackling climate change and boosting biodiversity.

Our objectives for the year included:

Raising our profile within the community and growing the membership of our Facebook group.

Establishing links with other groups within the community including local authorities, businesses, other community groups and charities.

Reducing waste and increasing recycling locally.

Promoting greener and more sustainable living.

Tackling climate change through planting trees.

Review of Activities and Achievement

Community Awareness, New Leaf Website and Social Media

The New Leaf website was launched in January 2020 and the charity has continued to maintain and update the information as well as add new posts, which are promoted through social media, to encourage people to visit the website. We were awarded a Mayor of Winchester's Award for this achievement.

Throughout 2020 we ran a series of monthly posts entitled 'Grow It Yourself' which aimed to support those growing their own fruit and vegetables and gave advice on the tasks that needed undertaking each month. This led to the formation of a breakout 'Alresford Growers' Facebook group with members swapping seeds and seeking and sharing advice.

We started a 'Recipes' section containing 'tried and tested' vegetarian and vegan recipes to help those trying to eat less meat. We appealed to our membership to submit their 'tried and tested' vegetarian recipes which we added to the website.

The charity continued to feature local businesses that were making efforts to be more sustainable and champion them through the website and social media. This included Face Matters Skin Health Studio, and two new low waste shops 'Earthian' and 'Juniper'.

During Winchester Green Week in September 2020 the charity wrote an article published in the Forum Community Magazine, entitled 'Greenest Town in Hampshire' in which we set out a vision of what the greenest town might look like. We also ran a series of energy saving advice posts on social media featuring a different area of activity including transport, laundry, heating and lighting each day.

In October 2020 New Leaf Alresford made a representation to New Alresford Town Council to request that they consider making Alresford a 'Pesticide Free Town'. In February 2021 the charity campaigned for support of the Godsfield Solar Farm application.

Membership of the New Leaf Alresford Facebook Group stood at 370 on 29/05/20 and had grown to 450 by March 2021. The charity began an Instagram account in March 2020 and had 268 followers by the end of March 2020.

The Pandemic

The pandemic and resulting lockdowns impacted severely on the charity's abilities to develop links with other community groups. Initial meetings had taken place with the Perin's school 'Eco Club', Alresford Rotary and The Itchen List just prior to the start of the pandemic but lockdown prevented any follow up opportunities during the year.

However, the lockdown did result in two unexpected opportunities when the charity was approached by the Hairy Plant Pot Company and Mill Hill Farms. The businesses were stuck with plants, hedging and trees which they were unable to sell due to the lockdown. The stock was at risk of going to waste.

New Leaf Alresford was able to offer the stock to the community in exchange for donations to the two respective companies and the charity's volunteers delivered plants, hedging and trees to the community. In total, 475 hedging plants and trees were planted in the Alresford area and 740 plants were delivered to local people.

In July 2020 New Leaf Alresford volunteers took part in a litter pick in collaboration with The Alresford Pigs.

In December 2020, New Leaf Alresford met with the Watercress Line charity which runs the heritage steam railway based in Alresford. We discussed a variety of suggestions for reducing the environmental impact of the railway's operations and opportunities for educating visitors on sustainable living. New Leaf Alresford provided the Watercress Line charity with a summary report containing the results of its research and advice.

Recycling

In part as a result of campaigning by the charity, the district received its first Tetrapak recycling bank in April 2020.

In September 2020, two New Leaf Alresford members made a deputation at a Hampshire County Council decision day to request the council restore pedestrian and cycle access to the Alresford Waste and Recycling Centre. Pedestrian and cycle access had been suspended as a result of the COVID19 measures and the charity continues to press for this to be restored as unnecessary barriers are reducing accessibility to recycling and forcing individuals to use a car over lower emission alternatives.

Biodiversity and Verges Management

New Leaf Alresford has been working with other local groups interested in the management of roadside verges and set up a forum which includes the Wild Valley Verges and Worthy's Conservation groups. A series of meetings were held to share experiences, learning and information.

In September 2020 the charity took part in the consultation on the District's Biodiversity Action Plan and asked for changes in verge management to be included in the plan. As a result, Alresford was selected for a pilot scheme which will see the number of cuts for roadside verges reduced from 9 per annum to 4 with two verge locations being allocated for 2 cuts per annum.

Tree Planting

New Leaf Alresford requested more trees for the town from Hampshire County Council. Surveys were undertaken by a volunteer and in January 2021 24 new trees were planted on verges in Alresford.

New Leaf identified three other potential areas for the planting of new trees. A charity volunteer conducted surveys of the proposed sites and attempts were made to identify the landowners. Leaflets were distributed to householders living adjacent to two of the proposed sites and volunteer tree custodians were found for each for the trees at the Benenden Green site. An application was made to Winchester City Council by New Leaf Alresford and in February 2021 four trees were planted on the site at Benenden Green.

Future Plans

The charity plans to continue its work and to grow and develop its membership and links with other community groups.

The charity will support the verges management pilot in Alresford.

The charity plans to apply for a grant to allow it to undertake community planting projects.

Our Finances

A donation to New Leaf Alresford was received from the Alresford PIGS charity and this was used to pay for the charity's annual insurance which was required for participation in the litter pick.

In addition, two of the trustees provided donations to cover the website hosting fees.

Our accounts have been subject to external scrutiny by Cathy Booth.
