Para 1.17 and 1.19	During Lockdown of 2020 the charity volunteers prepared an application for funding to the Small Charities Challenge Fund to secure project funding for a two-year project to increase sustainability and support an alumni network. Unfortunately Born to be Beautiful was unsuccessful in its application but was invited to submit more information and reapply. The SCCF and FCDO merged and reduced their funding applications and B2bB did not benefit. The charity sent a small amount of funds £263 [which was raised for this reason] to the beneficiaries to ensure their sustainability during the series of international lockdowns and to enable reporting to continue.
