Charitable Outcomes

1. Continued development and support of football in Chitipa, Northern Malawi.

Activities:

- March 2024 – Four U12 teams were training regularly. Each team had two older Young Girl Coaches trained to be able to coach the U12 Girls.



- April 2024 - project coordinator Coach Wachisa supervised the 8 trained Young Coaches as they delivered an U12 girl practice session for the 50 plus younger players.



- May 2024 - 1st ever U12 girls football festival. Seven teams attended and the 8 trained Young Coaches organised it.



- March/November 2024 – Kit recycling initiative collected 73 boxes of kit in total, taken to Dundee in December.



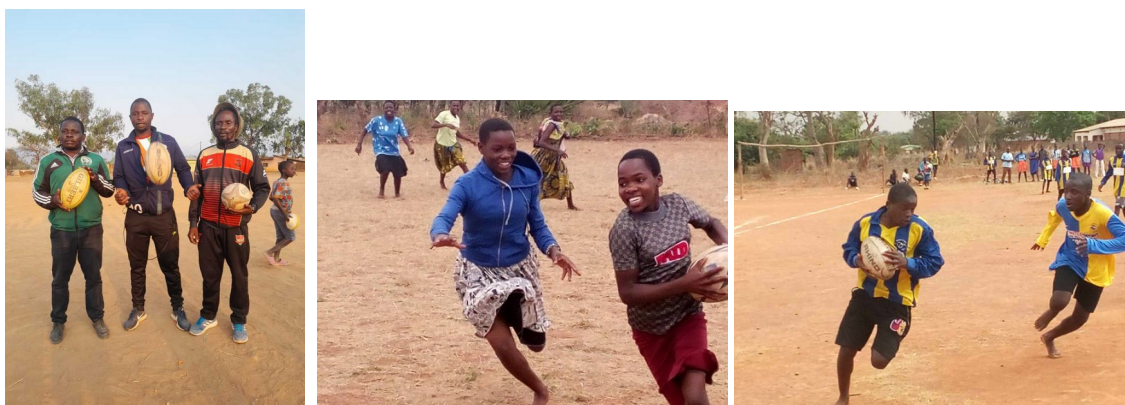
- August 2024 - £750 (£600 donations and £150 gift aid) was raised via a Cricket Challenge to fund sports training courses in Chitipa later in 2024.



- August 2024 – A netball coaching course in Kawale zone to identify potential netball Young Coaches to set up an U12 project. Over 50 young coaches attended over the 7 days in 3 different locations. The course was planned and delivered by qualified netball coach Allan Nkhonjera and evaluated by Chitipa District Sports Officer Rowland Harawa.



- October 2024 – Malawi National Rugby Development Officer Jack Mphande again visited Kawale zone. He spent two days supporting the teachers and players at the 4 centres already established. The final day saw a rugby festival held.



- November 2024, Community Sports Leaders Africa supported the Chitipa Queen's netball team to travel to Mzuzu for the Northern Regional Finals. The team came 2nd out of 8 teams.



- December 2024 – 3 Day Young Coaches Training Course held. 32 participants from 8 clubs attended.



- End of 2024 - U12 8 a side festival was held. Eight clubs took part.

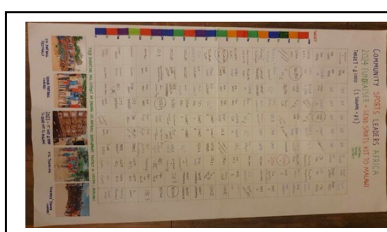
1. Continued development and support of football in Chitipa, Northern Malawi.

1. Continued development of Under 12 football in Chitipa, Northern Malawi.

Activities:

- A further Sensitisation Meeting held by the U12 Project Co-ordinator Wachisa Munkhondijah and the Senior Coaches from the 8 participating football clubs in Kawale zone, Chitipa – April 2021.
- Monthly U12 '8 a side' football tournaments were held. Most notably in December 2021 and January 2022.
- A 2nd Young Leaders in Football training course (3 days) delivered by Wachisa Munkhondijah in July 2021 attended by 18 more Young Coaches.
- Wachisa and several Young Coaches visited Chisenga Zone in August 2021 to deliver a Young Coaches training course at the William Stewart Foundation in Ibuluma.
- A delivery of kits, boots and training equipment arrived February 2022. Boxes were sent to Malawi on a Banana Box Trust container.



2. Continued support for Primary School Sports in Kawale Zone, Chitipa, Northern Malawi.

Activities:

- Softball cricket equipment presented to the 14 primary schools in October 2021 in an attempt to encourage schools to participate as a follow up to the September 2018 cricket coaching courses.
- 4 sets of junior netball posts were finished in February 2022 using the donated hoops.
- A Netball Young Coaches course delivered in August 2021 with 10 girls attending. Netball referees course delivered.

Charitable Outcomes

1. Continued development of Under 12 football in Chitipa, Northern Malawi.

Activities:

- Sensitisation Meeting attended by the Senior Coaches from all 11 football clubs in Chitipa – December 2020. Project co-ordinator Wachisa Munkhondijah held a meeting to brief the 8 clubs that attended on proposals for U12 development (training courses and equipment donations).
- Delivering a Young Leaders in Football training course in December 2020 attended by 12 young coaches from 8 clubs.
- Weekly mentoring sessions for the 27 trained young coaches delivered by Wachisa, through early 2021.
- Weekly U12 training sessions including girls teams held by the trained Young Coaches from each club.
- The construction of 2 sets of mini football goals (8x6 feet) to be used for training and festivals at a central location.
- Football kits x 2, boots x 11, balls x 2 and cones/pump for each Of the 11 participating clubs.



2. Continued support for Primary School Sports in Chitipa, Northern Malawi.

Activities:

- Sensitisation of the Head Teachers and Sports Teachers of the 14 Primary Schools – December 2020. Chitipa District Sports Officer, Rowland Harawa met the schools to outline the 2021 project and equipment donation.
- Football/Netball Training Courses – delivered by local senior coaches in October 2020 and attended by all 14 schools and by 28 teachers.
- 6 sets of football goals distributed to the clusters of schools in October 2020.
- Each of the 14 participating schools received a football kit, football, netball and a pump.

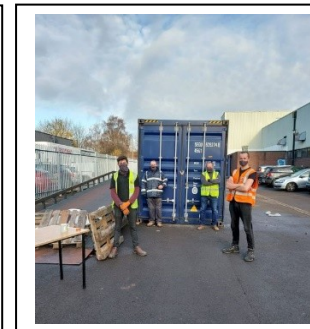


3. Equipment donated to support the 11 football clubs and 14 primary schools in Chitipa, Northern Malawi.

Activities:

- Northumberland, UK based sports kit recycling scheme – began October 2019. Kit donated included 40 + football kits, 150 pairs of football boots, 80 footballs, 30 netballs, 15 volleyballs, 20 rugby balls, 15 sets of softball cricket kit, tennis net/stand/balls/rackets x 20, 15 sets of cones, 30 pumps, netball kit/bibs, football training clothes, netball hoops/nets x 10, football nets x 12.
- ‘Cycle of Good’ Container left UK in November 2020 with our equipment inside.
- Container arrived in Blantyre, Malawi in April 2021.
- Sports kit transported 620 miles north to Chitipa.
- Kit presented to clubs and schools after participation in training courses.
