Para 1.20	<p>From April 2022 to March 2023, the charity successfully expanded its range of services.</p> <p>In the education sector, we experienced growth, increasing our student base from 90 to 100 students.</p> <p>Our weekend kids club, catering to children aged 5 to 12, continued to thrive. Here, children engage in a variety of games and activities, both mental and physical, and receive general advice and guidance from our teachers.</p> <p>Since September 2022, we've also engaged with the adult community, offering educational programs focusing on the life and teachings of the Prophet (SAW). These sessions have provided deep insights into the foundational aspects of our religion, highlighting the importance of understanding and valuing the Prophet's (SAW) experiences and narratives. The key accomplishments of these programs include:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Educational Enhancement: The new classes have enriched adult learners with in-depth knowledge about the Prophet (SAW)'s life. 2. Religious Reconnection: Participants have deepened their appreciation and connection to their religious roots through these teachings. 3. Individual Growth: The course content has motivated individuals to introspect and integrate the values and teachings exemplified by the Prophet (SAW) into their personal and social lives as a british citizen. <p>Finally, since December 2022 we have initiated a bi-monthly programme catering for the local community, and by extension the non-local community, to discuss any issues that may be a hindrance to their spiritual and religious progress.</p>


