#### Iftar Pack Distribution 2025 – Jamalganj, Sylhet

During **Ramadan 2025**, MP Foundation delivered essential iftar food packs to vulnerable households in Jamalganj, Sunamganj—an area frequently affected by flooding and food insecurity.

A total of **£150** was raised through PayPal donations, and 100% of this amount was spent on 10-day food packs for families most in need.

### Achievements and performance

#### Ramadan food pack - Bangladesh - April 23 2022

Low-income families' livelihood depends significantly on seasonal opportunities as high food prices remain the most significant and constant worry. More Households relied on coping strategies to keep food on the table. More than half of the households applied livelihood-based coping strategies such as borrowing money, selling productive assets, or going into debt to buy food.

In Ramadan 2022, our volunteers explored deep into rural areas in Bangladesh, searching for families eligible to receive an food pack. Every pack was guaranteed to be received by Orphans, disabled, widows and low-income families.

A donation of £25 Provided a food pack for a family of five for the whole month, and a £10 Donation pack provided food for a family of five for ten days, which was nutritious, quality food locally sourced in Bangladesh.

With generous donations, MPF was able to provide the following:

Ten disadvantaged families with £25 food pack.

20 Orphans, disabled, widows and low-income families with £10 food packs.

Flood affected victims in - Bangladesh June 19, 2022

The worst floods in Bangladesh in nearly two decades. Children were at increased risk of waterborne diseases, drowning and malnutrition due to extensive flooding in north-eastern Bangladesh.

Floods had significant social consequences for communities and individuals. The immediate impacts of flooding included:

- Loss of human life.
- Property damage.
- Destruction of crops.
- Loss of livestock.
- Deterioration of health conditions owing to waterborne diseases.

Sylhet and Sunamganj, Bangladesh, were most affected, with water flowing above dangerous levels. Agricultural land and critical infrastructure were submerged, including power stations and schools.

Diarrhea, respiratory infections, and skin diseases have already been highly reported.

MPF fundraised to support people in poverty affected by the devastating Flood in Sunamganj, Sylhet, Bangladesh. Our volunteers were on the ground, delivering food to the most affected victims.

With generous donations, MPF provided food and medicine to flood victims who fled to a shelter in a school in Issagori Sunamganj, Bangladesh.

Approximately 100 families received:

- Rice - 450kg
- Lentil - 175kg
- Potato - 210kg
- Onion - 160kg
- Paracetamol - 500 sheets
- Saline - 900 packs

### **Build a house project - April 1 2021**

In northeast Bangladesh, A hazardous home was falling apart with two older adults: an older man and his disabled wife. For many years, the family have been living below the poverty line, unable to build a secure home, and can't afford to repair the damage.

Thanks to generous donations, MPF was able to build a house.

The family now have security and protection. Sealed walls, a secured roof and lockable doors will give the elderly couple comfort and safety.

The family are protected from harsh winds, hot weather conditions and rain storms. The house and land were raised to protect the family from flash floods. The family are now sheltered and safe from the climate crisis in Bangladesh

### **Ramadan iftar pack COVID 19- May 4th 2021**

The coronavirus pandemic meant people were at risk of hunger in Bangladesh. With the help of generous donors, volunteers, and local community members, MPF handpicked and distributed food packs to people experiencing hunger, orphans, widows, elderly and low-income families and those unable to afford nutritious food. The essential food items were distributed to 66 low-income families. The Distribution was taken place in rural areas of Sunamganj, a district located in north-eastern Bangladesh within the Sylhet Division.

### **Urgent food pack appeal Gaza - June 6 2021**

Many families were struggling without food. MPF worked with volunteers to determine emergency food assistance needs for people living in GAZA. With the help of generous donors, MPF provided food and water aid to families in desperate need. Each box contains food for a month and feeds a family of 5.

## **Covid-19 lockdown food pack - August 4 2021**

COVID-19 lockdown has had severe consequences of food insecurity for disadvantaged communities and low-income families, resulting in hunger.

With the ongoing pandemic lockdown, people such as day labourers were the worst sufferers of this outbreak. Thanks to generous donations, MPF was able to distribute rice packs which made a significant difference to the day labourers affected by the Pandemic in Bangladesh. MPF continued to distribute food packs during the lockdown.

## **Water Project - Bangladesh -January 3 2022**

Mpf Volunteers in Bangladesh have located a village that urgently requires water. Access to safe water improves physical health, which helps diminish poverty. Sickness in Bangladesh is mainly due to drinking and washing with contaminated water. Proper hand washing effectively prevents viral illness and reduces the spread of viruses, including the coronavirus.

Thanks to generous donations, MPF provided clean water for 11 families, with 5 - 8 members in each household.

Engineers drilled 600FT deep into the ground for clean water. The water was tested in a laboratory and is free from ARSENIC POISONING. The village now has continuous access to 1000 litres of clean water for drinking, sanitation and hygiene.

## **Plans for future periods**

MPF continues to send our volunteers in Bangladesh to research each project and to do background checks. MPF volunteers are selected because they have personally suffered from poverty and can relate to the candidates. They help choose candidates and find the appropriate solutions to overcome the poverty crisis.

Our volunteers interview candidates from rural areas and perform background checks to find suitable poverty victims in the community. After seeing the matches, the volunteers carry out extra research for material needed for the relevant project. Over the last few years,

We have had several successful long-term and short-term projects, which have also come with lessons that had to be learnt, which were dealt with accordingly. It allowed us to update our policies and services, which resulted in improvement.

### **Achievements and performance**

#### **Ramadan Food Pack Distribution Report 2020**

We have completed the Ramadan food pack fundraising with all the funds raised. This meant that we could distribute food in rural areas of Sunamganj, a district located in north-eastern Bangladesh within the Sylhet Division. Our team in Bangladesh searched for the poorest people in over ten villages to receive the food packs, which contained enough food to feed a family of 5 for Iftar and Sehri for five days. With your help, we distributed enough food for up to 650 individuals. Most of those who received the pack were the elderly, widows, disabled, mentally ill, coronavirus affected and those with very low income.

#### **Qurbani distribution**

Mp Foundation has completed the Qurbani distribution, an Islamic ritual sacrifice in one of the poorest parts of Bangladesh; - villages consist mainly of riversides, with no help of support! The flooding has destroyed their homes, livelihoods, harvesting and cultivation, with many people displaced or missing from their families, alongside living under minimum shelter. Riverbanks are overflowing, and flood defences such as dykes, dams and sluices have been damaged because of the heavy monsoon rains, which has caused millions of lives to be affected; this predominately has been the worst throughout the last century. It is unfortunate to see many vulnerable Bangladeshis from all parts of the country having to deal with another terrifying disaster of flooding while already having a hard time coping with the corona-virus (covid-19). NOW, with continuous support from donors, we have been able to help over one hundred vulnerable people with meat.

#### **Blanket distribution**

Keeping Warm Makes a Huge Difference In a Poor person's life. With No Heating System, They Mainly Rely On Warm Clothing. We distributed 300 warm blankets in rural areas of Sunamganj, a district located in north-eastern Bangladesh within the Sylhet Division. Our volunteers in Bangladesh searched for the poorest people in over 12 villages to receive a warm blanket; those selected were mainly children and the Vulnerable elderly.

#### **Build a home project**

Like many families suffering in Bangladesh, Ashab Ali and his family needed urgent help: Ashab Ali is mentally disabled and unable to communicate. His wife separated, leaving two daughters one son living with the Ashab Ali. Children are not in education due to poverty. Father unable to work a permanent job and earns little money from cleaning. The family is unable to eat three meals causing malnutrition. Due to the damaged house, the family suffers from very cold nights; walls are only partially sealed. The family has no access to electricity, Heating, or Hot Water. Thanks to generous donors and a dedicated team of volunteers, we were able to Build a House for Ashab Ali and his family. The family are now safe and secure from any danger.

### **Medical care**

Mrs Begum hazardous home was falling apart; her husband was relying on handouts, they couldn't afford to repair her home. Mrs Begum, injured at work, hasn't stood up for 3 YEARS. Mrs Maleka Begum worked at a rice processing site earning £3 per day. She describes a hefty 25kg sack of rice falling from a height directly on her back. For the next few days off from work, she suffers from pain. They visited a homoeopathic doctor who prescribed her medicine and instructed her to rest. After a few days, slowly realizing she cannot sit up or stand but continues to take medication, hoping to recover. With no income, the elderly husband decides to beg. Three years later, with the lack of knowledge and financial support, Mrs Begum could not get the correct medical test or treatment and is fully bed-bound. Here at Mpf, our team decided to support this family and improve their quality of life. With generous donations, Mrs Begum visited an Orthopaedic Specialist called Dr Shonkor Kumar Roy at Osmani Medical College, Sylhet, Bangladesh. The spine's bone structure is good and saw no fracture or damage, but the spinal cord was possibly affected by accident. A physiotherapist has seen her and provided an exercise program. Our Volunteers will continue to support Mrs Begum to investigate further her spinal cord and provide a suitable treatment in the near future.

### **Build a home project 2**

We were also able to build a house for Mrs begum through generous donations raised by volunteers. The family will now have security and protection. For many years, the family have been living below the poverty line and unable to build a secure home. Sealed walls, secured roofs and lockable doors gave the vulnerable couple comfort and safety. The family are protected from harsh winds, hot weather conditions and rainstorms. We raised the house and land to protect the family from flash floods. The family are now sheltered and safe from the climate crisis.

### **Ramadan Food distribution 2021**

Mpf helped feed those below the poverty line and those that lacked access to basic food necessities in Bangladesh during Ramadan. Coronavirus pandemic meant even more people are at risk of hunger in Bangladesh. With the help from generous donors, volunteers and local community members, we handpicked and distributed food packs to the poor, orphans, widows, elderly and low-income families. The essential food items have been distributed to 66 low-income families suffering from poverty.

### **Food packs for Gaza**

Mpf helped deliver vital food boxes to those in need in Gaza. Protracted conflict, economic stagnation, limited trade and access to resources, coupled with high unemployment and poverty rates continue to pose severe challenges in Gaza. Children and women were suffering due to the lack of food and water. A £40 food pack helped a family for a month.
