To Empower: Another component of our vision is to produce Christian media which will empower, encourage, and edify believers in their Christian faith. People today have preferred modes of consuming media, whether in video format, text format, audio format, or even in person. We want to make the Good News of Jesus Christ available in all formats so that people would be able to be empowered in their daily walk of faith.

To Serve: We seek to serve both churches and Christian-based charities in their God-given missions, in whatever way we can. We have spiritual gifts, skills, talents, and cash to support God's work here on earth. We want to partner with and support all expressions of God's love towards humanity here on earth.

Overview

Over the past year, our church has experienced significant growth, with an increasing number of people attending our Sunday services. As a result, we expanded our meeting space and now rent a larger venue at St. Edward's Christian School in Poole to accommodate our growing congregation.

Despite the change in venue, our weekly activities continue to thrive. We hold Bible study courses every Wednesday and prayer meetings every Monday. In addition, we launched a new online youth Bible course that takes place every Tuesday, providing a valuable space for young people to grow in their faith.

Our media presence remains active, with regular sermon uploads and consistent engagement across our social media platforms, allowing us to reach both our local and online communities.

A significant highlight of the year was the retreat we hosted in December 2024 at a Christian centre, where we welcomed around 50 participants for three days of worship, teaching, and fellowship. We were blessed to sponsor and welcome guest speakers from the United

States, Lithuania, and Russia, who brought powerful messages and encouragement to all who attended.

Throughout the year, we also organized various events, including a women's conference and Christmas parties for the church community, during which every child received a gift.

In addition to our local efforts, we were privileged to support multiple charities by donating to both local and international churches and Christian organizations, furthering our mission to serve and bless others beyond our immediate community.

Prayer Meetings

Our Monday night prayer meetings have continued as always. We have seen an increase in the number of people attending. Our main prayer points remained as follows:

The Government: We have been keeping our UK governmental authorities (both national and local) in our prayers so that they may make wise decisions in such a challenging time as we find ourselves. Both wars abroad and the economy at home are very tough challenges for our leaders and therefore we keep them in prayer, always.

Individual's Needs: We would always prioritise individual's needs during our prayer meetings. If anybody needed a job, or in need of healing, or just emotional support, we always prioritised our visitors as well as members' immediate needs. We had a few testimonies about people we prayed for finding new jobs, feeling much more peace about the future, and emotional wellbeing. We believe prayer works and have seen great results.

The Local Residents: We always intercede before God for the local residents of Poole, Bournemouth and Christchurch. We desire that the light of God's love would shine brightly in this conurbation. We pray for our streets, for safety, for peace, etc.

Bible Study

Our Wednesday night Bible study sessions continued in-person, and also, we have seen an increase in the number of attendants.

We have seen a clear and constant increase in the number of attendants as well as the willingness to learn. We believe that Bible studies are a crucial tool to help people get established in the truth and liberty that Lord Jesus has to offer, but also in the knowledge about God's love.

We will continue to advertise, invite and reach people through this aspect of our ministry so that members of the public would come to know God's love for them, closer.

Media Production

YouTube: The YouTube content has grown significantly over the last year. We have been publishing our Sunday morning services there and have seen a gradual increase in views.

Our hope is that the YouTube content will help to reach people with the Good News of God's love. We have had a few testimonies about how people enjoy it and find the content encouraging.

Worship

Our worship meetings (Sunday meetings) have been going strong and have been such a blessing for all attending.

We have gained a few regular attendants who are blessed each time they come. They leave feeling much more encouraged and positive.

We always ensure the Word of God is preached during our Sunday meetings and people have found it very encouraging and empowering.

One of the vital parts of our Sunday morning service is spending time together over a meal after the service. We feel that activity enforces togetherness and the sense of community. Our visitors really enjoy it, and we intend to keep it.

Community

One of the great needs we see around us is the lack of community and belonging. By and large, many people live separate lives with very little sense of togetherness and belonging. This negatively affects people's mental health and emotional balance.

Our focus has always been on building communities where people can interact with each other and spend time together. The pandemic has hindered this particular ministry, but when the lockdown was lifted, we again restarted our community get-togethers.

Activities Overseas

There isn't much to report on the overseas ministry front. We have helped financially some ministries in Israel and Lithuania. But that is about all the activities abroad we had this last year.

Public Benefit

4. Financial Review

The financial year ended on the 2nd March 2025. At the end of the financial year, the charity bank and cash account showed a balance of £27,130. All funds that came in during the year have come in as unrestricted funds.

All the funds that have come in over the year have been from donations. The donations have come from the activities attendants.

Given the closing balance from the previous year being £18,975., our finances have gone up by £8,155 (42.98%).

During the year, the trustees have voted in favour of some expenditure on various items to help with the conducting of our Sunday services.

Also, as mentioned before, some money has been donated to visiting speakers as well as overseas humanitarian relief.

It is important to note that no money at all has been expended on salaries or personal expenses to individuals whilst on ministry activities.

Reserves Policy

Our aim is to build up some reserves with the view to rent or lease a building for our regular meetings. Therefore, the trustees are very careful with any expenditure. Given that none of the trustees are dependent financially on the charity nor do we have any paid staff at the moment, the expenses are very minimal. However, for us to further our objects and achieve success in our mission, we need to have a regular place of meeting where we can provide the public benefit described in our objects. Therefore, the plan going forward is to continue to build our reserves and ensure that the charity is in a good financial position from which it can carry out its activities. This year we are much nearer to that vision than last year, given that our finances have increased again with the increase from £18,975 to £27,130 in reserve. The policy has been met by the steady increase and will achieve the goal in the coming years.

We have been fervent in propagating God's Word, the Good News of salvation in Jesus Christ and generally helping the attendants to go deeper in the Bible and their knowledge of God.

Prayer Meetings

Our Monday night prayer meetings have continued as always. We have seen an increase in the number of people attending. Our main prayer points remained as follows:

Our focus through the year has been God's Healing Power and our make-up of Spirit, Soul and Body. We have also done a Bible Study course which focuses on how to grow in the knowledge and love of God as well as the ways in which to communicate our faith with the community at large.

We have seen a clear and constant increase in the number of attendants as well as the willingness to learn. We believe that Bible studies are a crucial tool to help people get established in the truth and liberty that Lord Jesus has to offer, but also in the knowledge about God's love.

We will continue to advertise, invite and reach people through this aspect of our ministry so that members of the public would come to know God's love for them, closer.

Media Production

Our media production has stayed more or less the same over the last year as we are praying about a new strategy for it.

The Blog: The blog on our website has not grown much over the last year, but we are planning to work on it in the near future. We are looking at different series of content that could go on it.

YouTube: The YouTube content has grown significantly over the last year. We have been publishing our Sunday morning services there and have seen a gradual increase in views.

Our hope is that the YouTube content will help to reach people with the Good News of God's love. We have had a few testimonies about how people enjoy it and find the content encouraging.

There is still work to be done in our media production endeavours. The podcast channel has not yet been launched, and we have some other ideas which we are hoping to launch in the year ahead.

Worship

Our worship meetings (Sunday meetings) have been going strong and have been such a blessing for all attending.

We have gained a few regular attendants who are blessed each time they come. They leave feeling much more encouraged and positive.

We always ensure the Word of God is preached during our Sunday meetings and people have found it very encouraging and empowering.

One of the vital parts of our Sunday morning service is spending time together over a meal after the service. We feel that activity enforces togetherness and the sense of community. Our visitors really enjoy it, and we intend to keep it.

We finally moved into a hired venue. We hire from St. Edward's School, a classroom and is going very well so far.

Community

One of the great needs we see around us is the lack of community and belonging. By and large, many people live separate lives with very little sense of togetherness and belonging. This negatively affects people's mental health and emotional balance.

Our focus has always been on building communities where people can interact with each other and spend time together. The pandemic has hindered this particular ministry, but when the lockdown was lifted, we again restarted our community get-togethers.

Loneliness is a big problem in our society and the pandemic has exacerbated it even more. People were locked in their homes for undetermined amounts of time. For many it wasn't easy. But we feel that we have made a difference in this aspect at least with the people that we interacted with, and we will continue to include people and spend time with them in the effort to reduce loneliness in our community.

People today have preferred modes of consuming media, whether in video format, text format, audio format, or even in person. We want to make the Good News of Jesus Christ available in all formats so that people would be able to be empowered in their daily walk of faith.

We have spiritual gifts, skills, talents, and cash to support God's work here on earth. We want to partner with and support all expressions of God's love towards humanity here on earth.

Overview

Since the COVID-19 pandemic limitations were completely removed, we were able to once again, meet freely from house to house and conduct our routine activities of Bible Study, Prayer, Worship and helping and supporting the people within the community.

The war in Ukraine, whilst a great tragedy, it has afforded us some opportunities to minister to Ukrainian refugees that have come to the area. More about it later.

Over the last year we have seen a modest growth in the amount of people attending our meetings and for that we are greatly thankful to God and the newcomers for the opportunity to serve and share God's love with those around us.

Overall, it has been a good year. We have seen God's hand by way of new people coming into a real knowledge of Jesus Christ, we have seen God's healing power manifest among us as well as emotional and mental health healings.

We have been fervent in propagating God's Word, the Good News of salvation in Jesus Christ and generally helping the attendants to go deeper in the Bible and their knowledge of God.

Prayer Meetings

Our Monday night prayer meetings have continued as always. We completely moved away from Zoom and fully restarted the in-person prayer meetings every Monday. Our main prayer points remained as follows:

The Government: We have been keeping our UK governmental authorities (both national and local) in our prayers so that they may make wise decisions in such a challenging time as we find ourselves. Also, as things started to ease off, we were praying for businesses and establishments that wisdom would be granted to them to make right decisions helping the economy to come out of the pandemic.

Individual's Needs: We would always prioritise individual's needs during our prayer meetings. If anybody needed a job, or in need of healing, or just emotional support, we always prioritised our visitors as well as members' immediate needs. We had a few testimonies about people we prayed for finding new jobs, feeling much more peace about the future, and emotional wellbeing. We believe prayer works and have seen great results.

The Local Residents: We always intercede before God for the local residents of Poole, Bournemouth and Christchurch. We desire that the light of God's love would shine brightly in this conurbation. We pray for our streets, for safety, for peace, etc.

Ukraine: As the war in Ukraine began at the beginning of 2022, we found ourselves praying for the conflict and the people affected. We were also praying for guidance about ways in which we could help support the displaced Ukrainian people. We made the decision to allocate some finances to relief work carried out by various charities and organisations.

Bible Study

Our Friday night Bible study sessions continued in-person again, and also, we have seen an increase in the number of attendants.

Our focus through the year has been discipleship. We have started a Bible Study course which focuses on how to grow in the knowledge and love of God as well as the ways in which to communicate our faith with the community at large.

We have seen a clear and constant increase in the number of attendants as well as the willingness to learn. We believe that Bible studies are a crucial tool to help people get established in the truth and liberty that Lord Jesus has to offer, but also in the knowledge about God's love.

We will continue to advertise, invite and reach people through this aspect of our ministry so that members of the public would come to know God's love for them, closer.

Media Production

Our media production has stayed more or less the same over the last year as we are praying about a new strategy for it.

The Blog: The blog on our website has not grown much over the last year, but we are planning to work on it in the near future. We are looking at different series of content that could go on it.

YouTube: The YouTube content has grown significantly over the last year. We have been publishing our Sunday morning services there and have seen a gradual increase in views.

Our hope is that the YouTube content will help to reach people with the Good News of God's love. We have had a few testimonies about how people enjoy it and find the content encouraging.

There is still work to be done in our media production endeavours. The podcast channel has not yet been launched, and we have some other ideas which we are hoping to launch in the year ahead.

Worship

Our worship meetings (Sunday meetings) have resumed again in accordance with government guidance and have been such a blessing for all attending.

We have gained a few regular attendants who are blessed each time they come. They leave feeling much more encouraged and positive.

We always ensure the Word of God is preached during our Sunday meetings and people have found it very encouraging and empowering.

One of the vital parts of our Sunday morning service is spending time together over a meal after the service. We feel that activity enforces togetherness and the sense of community. Our visitors really enjoy it, and we intend to keep it.

Community

One of the great needs we see around us is the lack of community and belonging. By and large, many people live separate lives with very little sense of togetherness and belonging. This negatively affects people's mental health and emotional balance.

Our focus has always been on building communities where people can interact with each other and spend time together. The pandemic has hindered this particular ministry, but when the lockdown was lifted, we again restarted our community get-togethers.

Loneliness is a big problem in our society and the pandemic has exacerbated it even more. People were locked in their homes for undetermined amounts of time. For many it wasn't easy. But we feel that we have made a difference in this aspect at least with the people that

we interacted with, and we will continue to include people and spend time with them in the effort to reduce loneliness in our community.

Activities Overseas

There isn't much to report on the overseas ministry front. We have helped financially some ministries, especially humanitarian relief types of ministries, given the war in Ukraine and its affects elsewhere. But that is about all the activities abroad we had this last year.

Public Benefit

The trustees have adhered to their duty for due regard towards the guidance on public benefit published by the Charity Commission when exercising their authority and duties.

The trustees have always endeavoured to plan the charity activities in accordance with sections G3 and G2 from the Charity Commission's General Guidance on Public Benefit (Jn 2008).

The paragraphs above demonstrate our activities, achievements, challenges, and successes that we had in the past year. We mainly achieve our objects and purposes through worship, Bible study, prayer, media production and practical help, activities which are directly related to the aims of the charity and are fully compliant with the Charity Commission Principles on Public Benefit.

4. Financial Review

The financial year ended on the 2nd March 2023. At the end of the financial year, the charity bank account showed a balance of £13,655.63. All funds that came in during the year have come in as unrestricted funds.

All the funds that have come in over the year have been from donations. The donations have come mainly from the trustees in the way of tithes and offerings.

Given the closing balance from the previous year being £10,895.91, our finances have gone up by £2,759.72 (23.33%).

During the year, the trustees have voted in favour of some expenditure on musical instruments to help with the worship services.

Also, as mentioned before, some money has been donated to visiting speakers as well as oversees humanitarian relief.

It is important to note that no money at all has been expended on salaries or personal expenses to individuals whilst on ministry activities.

Reserves Policy

Our aim is to build up some reserves with the view to rent or lease a building for our regular meetings. Therefore, the trustees are very careful with any expenditure. Given that none of the trustees are dependent financially on the charity nor do we have any paid staff at the moment, the expenses are very minimal. However, for us to further our objects and achieve success in our mission, we need to have a regular place of meeting where we can provide the public benefit described in our objects. Therefore, the plan going forward is to continue to build our reserves and ensure that the charity is in a good financial position from which it can carry out its activities. This year we are much nearer to that vision than last year, given that our finances have increased again.

Given the pandemic and the aftermath of it, flying has remained almost impossible unless absolutely essential, hence our activities in impoverished communities overseas remained completely stopped during the last year. There is nothing to report in that regard, but we have kept in touch with the people over Zoom and have made a couple of donations towards the relief in the work to support the work of restoration after COVID-19 (see the Accounts section further on, for details of the donations).

4. Financial Review

The financial year ended on the 2nd March 2022. At the end of the financial year, the charity bank account showed a balance of £10,895.91. All funds that came in during the year have come in as unrestricted funds.

All the funds that have come in over the year have been from donations. The donations have come mainly from the trustees in the way of tithes and offerings. We have had some little money come from non-trustees.

Over the course of the year, we have registered 2 outgoings (expenses):

1st donation - we made a donation to Faith Life Church, Inc. USA of \$1,400.00 (which equated at the time to £1,048.09) towards their work, which includes media production and practical help towards the poor and the destitute. Also, given that we use much of their resources, it made sense for us to partner with them in their endeavours for the benefit of mankind.

2nd donation - we made a donation to a visiting minister from the Church of Praise, Siberia, Russia. We made the donation as cash-in-hand and the transaction is registered as a £300 withdrawal on the statement. The Church of Praise are investing heavily into their youth work within the City of Tomsk hoping to reduce the amount of drug addictions amongst the youth and we decided to bless the visiting speaker who blessed us by sharing with our congregation an encouraging us all word from The Word of God (although he expected nothing in return).

Reserves Policy

Our aim is to build up some reserves with the view to rent or lease a building for our regular meetings. Therefore, the trustees are very careful with any expenditure. Given that none of the trustees are dependent financially on the charity nor do we have any paid staff at the moment, the expenses are very minimal. However, for us to further our objects and achieve success in our mission, we need to have a regular place of meeting where we can provide the public benefit described in our objects. Therefore the plan going forward is to continue to build our reserves and ensure that the charity is in a good financial position from which it can carry out its activities. This year we are much nearer to that vision than last year, given that our finances have overall increased by £6,112.91 over the year.

TO ADVANCE THE CHRISTIAN RELIGION WORLDWIDE, FOR THE BENEFIT OF THE PUBLIC, IN PARTICULAR BUT NOT EXCLUSIVELY, THROUGH THE HOLDING OF PRAYER MEETINGS, BIBLE STUDIES, CONFERENCES, SUPPORTING OTHER CHRISTIAN CHARITIES, PRODUCING AND/OR DISTRIBUTING LITERATURE AND MEDIA ITEMS TO ENLIGHTEN OTHERS ABOUT THE CHRISTIAN RELIGION AND PROMOTING UNITY AND HARMONY AMONGST CHRISTIANS OF ALL BACKGROUNDS, ALL IN ACCORDANCE WITH CHRISTIAN PRINCIPALS.

3 Annual Report

1.3 Activities

Vision and Values

Our primary mission is to see people walking in the freedom that Jesus Christ has purchased for them on the cross, with His own life. And that is because of His great love for the world. The team here at Hearts United Ministries are dedicated to unite, to empower, and to serve anyone who would like to walk into their God-given destiny. We know from personal experience that only Jesus Christ can transform your life and give you the assurance of salvation.

To Unite: It is our vision, mission, and passion to bring unity among Christians of all backgrounds and nationalities. We seek to remove the boundaries between Christians set by their nationalities, cultures, worldviews, and their general background.

To Empower: Another component of our vision is to produce Christian media which will empower, encourage, and edify believers in their Christian faith. People today have preferred modes of consuming media, whether in video format, text format, audio format, or even in person. We want to make the Good News of Jesus Christ available in all formats so that people would be able to be empowered in their daily walk of faith.

To Serve: We seek to serve both churches and Christian-based charities in their God-given missions, in whatever way we can. We have spiritual gifts, skills, talents, and cash to support God's work here on earth. We want to partner with and support all expressions of God's love towards humanity here on earth.

COVID-19

Hearts United Ministries was registered in March 2020, and the next month the UK (and the whole world for that matter) entered the most severe lockdown known for decades. We had to respond and adapt given the government guidance and our overall responsibility towards people's safety.

We switched entirely to online meetings using Zoom. Snezana and Slava assumed the running and cost (for which we are all very grateful) of our Zoom subscription. Snezana as the administrator organised all the meetings and the invites.

Once meeting outside was permitted, we met outside in open spaces just to continue the very vital in-person interaction which was so very needed.

Prayer Meetings

Our Monday night prayer meeting switched to online Zoom meetings. We had visitors from Bournemouth, Southampton and of course Poole. Our focus in prayer has always been:

The Government: We keep our UK governmental authorities (both national and local) in our prayers so that they may make wise decisions in such a challenging time as the pandemic.

Individual's Needs: We would always prioritise individual's needs during our prayer meetings. If anybody needed a job, or in need of healing, or just emotional support, we always prioritised our visitors as well as members immediate needs.

The Local Residents: We always intercede before God for the local residents of Poole, Bournemouth and Christchurch. We desire that the light of God's love would shine brightly in this conurbation.

Bible Study

Our Friday night Bible study session moved online as well, and we had it on Zoom. We had some amazing times, and we learnt a lot. It was primarily led by Andrei, but at times all other members were given the chance to bring whatever God put on their hearts.

We completed a couple of series such as Biblical Finances, God's Promises, and others.

There were times when we had approximately 10 Zoom windows into different households, and other times when it was much less. Either way, we continued to teach God's Word, and the pandemic was unable to stop the hope found on the pages of the Bible from being propagated into people's hearts.

Media Production

Our media production has taken some steps forward during the last year.

The Blog: We started a blog which is available on our website. The blog aims at providing encouraging content for those who prefer it in written format. There was a delay in starting it due to the work on the website, but eventually it was up and running and it looks and reads very nice.

YouTube: We also started a YouTube channel. We are using it for publishing many of the Zoom meetings that we had, and any series we did during our Bible study sessions. Looking forward, we want to organise it more into playlists of Sunday worship videos, teachings, etc. We have had very positive feedback from people that do not attend our meetings about the material posted on YouTube. It is having the desired impact on people's lives.

There is still work to be done in our media production endeavours. The podcast channel has not yet been launched, and we have some other ideas which we are hoping to launch in the year ahead.

Worship

Our worship meetings pretty much stopped during COVID-19 but we continued to worship God in the comfort of our own home within the circle of our own families. We also continued to worship God in action by offering prayer and support to people around us, even if it was mainly on Zoom.

Community

One of the great needs we see around us is the lack of community and belonging. By and large, many people live separate lives with very little sense of togetherness and belonging. This negatively affects people's mental health and emotional balance.

Our focus has always been on building communities where people can interact with each other and spend time together. The pandemic has hindered this particular ministry, but when there were some lockdown respites, we were able to meet outside on the beach, go for walks and find out how everyone was doing.

Loneliness is a big problem in our society and the pandemic has exacerbated it even more. People were locked in their homes for undetermined amounts of time. For many it wasn't easy. But we feel that we have made a difference in this aspect at least with the people that we interacted with, and we will continue to include people and spend time with them in the effort to reduce loneliness in our community.

Activities Overseas

Given the pandemic and how flying was almost impossible unless absolutely essential, our activities in impoverished communities overseas completely stopped during the last year. There is nothing to report in that regard, but we have kept in touch with the people over Zoom.

Public Benefit

The trustees have adhered to their duty for due regard towards the guidance on public benefit published by the Charity Commission when exercising their authority and duties.

The trustees have always endeavoured to plan the charity activities in accordance with sections G3 and G2 from the Charity Commission's General Guidance on Public Benefit (Jn 2008).

The paragraphs above demonstrate our activities, achievements, challenges, and successes that we had in the past year. We mainly achieve our objects and purposes through worship, Bible study, prayer, media production and practical help, activities which are directly related to the aims of the charity and are fully compliant with the Charity Commission Principles on Public Benefit.

1.4 Financial Review

The financial year ended on the 2nd March 2021. At the end of the financial year, the charity bank account showed a balance of £4,783.00. All funds that came in during the year have come in as unrestricted funds.

All the funds that have come in over the year have been from donations. The donations have come mainly from the trustees in the way of tithes and offerings. We have had some little money come from non-trustees.

Over the course of the year, there seems to have been no expenditure at all. No money has been spent on anything at all. As mentioned above, the Zoom subscription was taken on by Snezana & Slava. All other expenses were assumed by the trustees from their own pockets.

Reserves Policy

Our aim is to build up some reserves with the view to rent or lease a building for our regular meetings. Therefore, the trustees are very careful with any expenditure. Given that none of the trustees are dependent financially on the charity nor do we have any paid staff at the moment, the expenses are very minimal. However, for us to further our objects and achieve success in our mission, we need to have a regular place of meeting where we can provide the public benefit described in our objects. Therefore the plan going forward is to continue to build our reserves and ensure that the charity is in a good financial position from which it can carry out its activities.
