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# Accounts

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**Objective 3 - Provide English lessons within Lesotho for minimum of 6 weeks**

In Maseru, Lesotho, we implemented an English language initiative at a primary school, delivering eight-week-long English lessons to three separate classes. Additionally, we conducted sports sessions for the entire school every Wednesday, integrating English language practice into these sporting activities. This holistic approach aimed to enhance both language proficiency and physical fitness among the students.

**Objective 4 - Develop or more organised system for suitcase storage and packing**

In Nottingham, UK, our suitcase collection effort resulted in the acquisition of over 30 suitcases for our trip. To ensure suitability, we measured the smallest suitable cases and utilised these dimensions for future advertisements, enabling us to gather only appropriate cases. During packing, we meticulously recorded all items packed into each case, maintaining both paper and digital logs for record-keeping. We strategically organised items into cases with pre-determined destinations. Each case was labelled with three stickers containing a unique case number for easy identification. This comprehensive list was retained and utilised when applying for tax-free status certificates required for travel into South Africa, ensuring smooth logistics and compliance with regulations.

As a charity, we've faced challenges due to the impact of COVID-19, resulting in a decline in our outreach efforts and fundraising activities in the United States. Consequently, we redirected our focus towards the United Kingdom, where we organised events and appeals to sustain our operations.

Despite these challenges, we secured sponsorship from a local care company, recognising our commitment to supporting vulnerable individuals, with a generous contribution of £1000.

To bolster our resources, James Murray travelled to the United States to engage with two longstanding donors, successfully securing additional donations totalling £2225 for the charity.

Looking ahead to 2024, our strategy involves reaching out to local schools, inviting them to participate in presentations and fundraising initiatives within their communities.

Reflecting on our fundraising performance in 2023, we acknowledge that it fell below expectations. Therefore, we are committed to enhancing our efforts next year by increasing the number of events and total donations to ensure the sustainability of our vital work.
