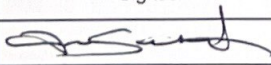

Brief statement of the charity's policy on reserves

The charity secured income of £108,439 during the period in donations and £15,001 in interest-free loans. We had expenditure of £134,749 which included the property purchase for investment totalling £125,000. Grants were £8,767 during the period. This resulted in a deficit of £11,309 which was met with prior year surpluses. At the end of the period we held surplus of £15,597 as unrestricted funds. The trustees do not have a policy to retain reserves for operational costs of the charity, but will retain the reserves for future charitable expenditure in furtherance of the objects.

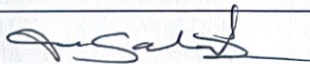
