### Chair's Report

Grateful thanks to all the volunteers who have helped so much to make this another very successful year for our community and our club. You are essential to everything we do, and if anybody felt they can help in any way, you will be made most welcome.

In add-on I would like to thank the WRT trustees, all of whom are also volunteers. These include 5 representatives from the Parish Council, and 4 representatives from the local community. The latter will be standing down and the vacancies are subject to election at this meeting, in line with our Constitution.

The club is open regularly on Friday and Saturday evenings and Sunday afternoons, and is well attended by Community Club members and their guests. We have our own skittles team that plays on a Tuesday evening, and also host games from different leagues. Throughout the year we host additional activities, such as Takeaway nights, Bingo nights and the Tikka van, which have all proved very popular.

I am delighted to announce that this year we also saw the welcome return of the Football teams, and we will be continuing to improve the facilities for the teams in the coming year.

We also hold a number of themed events throughout the year, which are very popular. This year we had a very busy Fun Day, despite the wind and rain and having to pin the marquee down in the afternoon. Other popular events now in our regular calendar include Easter egg hunt, Halloween, and Christmas Party. The Easter and Halloween events incorporate trails for the youngsters around the village with lots of local participation, in a truly community event. We also host a variety of entertainers during the year, and having the field available has helped expand these during the summer months, weather permitting!

Several local organisations now use our Club hose for their events, which is also booked for private parties and events.

Our Membership has increased again this year to 76 Annual membership cost is £10 for a family membership if resident in Winsham.

Improvements Completed and Planned

This year we had a full refurbishment of our kitchen facilities, which will reduce operating costs and provide better facilities for the various activities we hold.

We have also had new rubberised floors in the kitchen and toilet areas which will make it safer, and a new total building water softener.

Going forward, we have a grant for an outdoor table tennis area. We are also going to upgrade the marquee which should solve the vandalism issue, and move the smoking shed to be 5m from the building and around the front. We are also looking into grants for our major expense, the electricity, which might mean moving to eco friendly alternatives.

We now move to the section of community members to the WRT. 2 of the existing members are standing down, and 2 others have said they are happy to continue. We have 2 members (Claire Hodder and Mike Slyfield) who are standing for the vacant positions. As there is the same number of vacancies as potential candidates we do not need to go to an election if the assembled members are happy.

The assembled members voted to elect the 2 candidates.



### **Treasurer's Report**

### **Chair's Report:**

I want to thank all the volunteers, of which there are many so I will not name as I fear I would miss someone – but without the volunteers we would not be able to deliver the many events that for the community and the club members.

- WRT Trustees – overseeing the facility – this is made up of 5 representatives from the PC and 4 elected members from the club members – and later those trustees will formally step down and the members will re-elect their representatives for the next year. I need to thank those representatives for the time and energy they have put in on the WRT.

Volunteers are the driver behind all we do here, and we would welcome anyone if they would like to come along and help – we meet once a month to plan events organise Secretary, bar & food, cleaners, Hedge Cutters, general maintenance and all those who have contributed time and effort to Community Club Building improvements and maintenance, refuse & recycling.

The Club is open regularly every weekend Friday and Saturday 7pm – 11pm and on Sunday from 2pm – 6 pm and is well attended by Community Club members and their guests. Killer Skittles usually takes place on Fridays and all club members, and their guests are welcome to join in.

The Club has its own Skittles team which plays on a Tuesday evening. We also host several skittle games from different leagues. Alongside the club openings we facilitate regular social activities such as Takeaway Nights, Bingo Nights and the Tikka Van.

**Annual Events** – the club has built a great reputation for our annual events:

Easter – thank you to residents (true community event)

Fun day

Halloween – thank you to residents (true community event)

## Childrens Christmas party

The easter and Halloween events are extremely popular at the last events over 100 children and their families attended – again this is a true community event and is supported by the residents of the village.

Music and Bands – we have also hosted several bands and getting a reputation as a music venue especially in the Summer – with the amazing field facility.

Community Club Members – membership is now 62 of which 14 are family members (temporary memberships-non-members signed in by members)

Local organisations have held their AGM in the Club, i.e Horticultural Society. The club can be booked for private parties, we have had children partes, birthday parties and we have also facilitated celebration of life gatherings.

**Improvements – completed and planned:** Improvements have continued to be made to both the Clubhouse and the external area to improve the facilities available to Club Members and the wider community.

Since the last AGM improvements have included:

- New front doors
- New club house furniture
- New lighting in club house and bar
- Re decoration of the club house
- New flooring in the toilets and kitchen
- Complete new kitchen – which we needed to do to ensure we meet H & S standards
- Water softening system

The WRT invested in a large Marquee which has been very beneficial in supporting the events. This can also be hired for any events future.

It came in very handy to support the school PTFA as the inclement weather posed a threat to the summer fair – we were able to offer the use of the marquee and club house to support this valuable fundraising event for the village school.

The WRT are always looking to improve facilities and are currently looking, following a club members request, at a smoking/vaping shelter. The removal of the old sheds to be replaced with better storage.

The WRT have been successful in securing grant funding to purchase and install a permanent outdoor table tennis table – we are looking at where this will be situated. We have also secured funding to support the annual fun day – we do this so we can provide a community day at little to no cost for residents and their families.

## Other Updates

The WRT and PC are working together to ensure the very outdated lease is renegotiated and the WRT ICO is working to set up a subsidiary company in line with the Charity Commission and voted on last year.

The charity commission are fully aware of what we are doing and we are working with them moving forward.

We will now move to the election of four representatives from the Club members to join the WRT Trustees for the next year.



### Treasurer's Report

#### Chair's Report:

**Purpose:** I want to open by just reminding everyone of the purpose of the Winsham Recreational Trust (see Purpose slide) and to headline that the WRT operates the Upper Recreation Ground Playing Fields and Winsham Community Club on lease from Winsham Parish Council in pursuit of the WRT purpose.

**Thanks:** I now want to thank in general the many Winsham residents who make the delivery of that purpose possible. I am not going to name names because many people prefer that their good work goes under the radar. However, those people know who they are and therefore, in general I want to thank the following for their hard work, dedication and positive contribution to the success of the WRT and the Winsham Community Club:

- Trustees
- Volunteers: Club Co-ordinator, Booking Secretary, Membership Secretary, Volunteer Committee, Bar & Kitchen Staff, Events Organisers, Cleaners, Hedge Cutters and all those who have contributed time and effort to Community Club Building improvements and maintenance
- Community Club Members
- Winsham Parish Residents attending WRT/Community Club events

**Trustees Update:** A number of Trustees have changed since the 2022 AGM. Lucy Millar, Chloe Adams and Emma Pike have all stepped down from their dual roles as Parish Councillors and WRT Trustees. We thank them for their service to the WRT, in particular Lucy for the work she did as WRT Secretary. Chloe and Emma continue to contribute to the Community Club as active volunteers and members. Gerry Earl and Fiona Vickers

have joined as Parish Councillors and hence new WRT Trustees. I have continued in the role of Chair and Henk continues to serve as our dedicated Treasurer. The role of Secretary has remained gapped since Lucy's departure as none of our Trustees wished to fill this role; however, special thanks must go here to Jacqui Wellar who, though not a Trustee, has temporarily stepped into the gap to take the minutes at WRT meetings. Looking forward, assuming the resolution to adopt the proposed WRT & Community Club constitution is endorsed, we will look to change the Trustee structure to five nominated Councillors from Winsham Parish Council and four trustees elected by WRT & Community members from among the Community Club membership.

**Membership Update:** The last membership renewal/application window took place in September 2023. The total Winsham Community Club membership is currently 57 in total, a mix of single & family memberships, an increase on the numbers reported at the 2022 AGM. A healthy number and new applications are always welcome. Annual membership is £5 for a single membership and £10 for a family membership. Application forms are available here at the club and also from the Winsham Village Shop.

Non-members must be signed in by a club member to use the Community Club Bar. Non-members pay a £1 guest fee on each occasion; using the bar five times as a non-member will be equivalent to joining as a single member for the year and a number of people have joined as members as a result.

There are exceptions regarding use of the bar by non-members for any public events run by the Community Club for which the Club holds an events licence or by visiting teams provided they sign in (e.g. for skittles matches). Also anyone using the Club (but not the bar) solely as a 'warm hub' facility is exempt from membership requirements provided they comply with the reasonable behaviour expectations of the club.

**Volunteer Group:** This is the driving engine behind the wide range of well-organised and successful events that run at the Community Club, including the 2023 Winsham Fun Day, as well as contributing to club improvements and channeling member views back to the WRT Trustees. The Volunteer Group meets approx. monthly and any Community Club member is welcome to join.

In addition to the volunteer group there are a number of other volunteers who perform critical roles in helping the club to succeed and operate across a range of areas, including staffing the bar, helping with catering, doing the cleaning and hedge cutting.

**Activity Report – events, bookings, hires:** There has continued to be a significant and positive increase in activity over the course of the last 14 months:

Winsham Community Club is open regularly every weekend Friday and Saturday 7pm – 11pm and on Sunday from 2pm – 6 pm and is well attended by Community Club members and their guests. Killer Skittles takes place on Fridays and all club members and their guests are welcome to join in.

The Community Club also has its own Skittles team which plays on a Tuesday evening. Community Club staples have included Takeaway Nights, Bingo Nights, Easter Egg Hunt, Halloween Party, Christmas Children's Party, Christmas Party, New Year's Eve Party and various music events; for some of these events the Community Club has been full to the seams which is great news. A number of local organisations have held their AGM in the Club. Private party bookings have increased significantly as knowledge of the excellent

facilities and service provided continues to spread through both word of mouth and the excellent Community Club newsletter and Social Media accounts, plus an efficient booking process. However, there is always plenty of scope for additional use/activities.

Whilst the football pitches and changing rooms remain largely unused for their intended purpose, it has been fabulous to see children's football coaching sessions take off through the initiative and dedicated commitment of Ed Gould. These sessions are proving popular amongst children in the parish and are a great example of the different ways in which the WRT & Community provides leisure and recreational facilities for the whole Winsham Community. Income from the football sessions is ringfenced in order to fund football playing equipment for the sessions.

The August Bank Holiday was a particularly successful weekend with first the use of the Playing Fields and the Clubhouse by the Winsham Horticultural Society on the Saturday for their Annual Show, followed by another very successful Winsham Fun Day for the whole community on the Sunday.

**Improvements – completed and planned:** Improvements have continued to be made to both the Clubhouse and the external area to improve the facilities available to Club Members and the wider community.

Since the last AGM improvements have included:

- The installation of Patio Doors from the Clubhouse out to the Outside Area, including decking to enable a level entry onto the Playing Fields. This has been a hugely valuable addition to the Club, particularly for summer functions, allowing easier access to the outside and a better flow of people in and out of the Club using both entrances, creating a better atmosphere for events.
- The Car Park has been resurfaced to provide a level parking area.
- Repainting; lights; kitchen fridge; internet and card payment machines (?); tables, chairs and bar stools.

The following potential improvements are at various stages of planning and some, particularly extension plans, will be reliant on securing grants for the work:

- Replacement of toilet and kitchen flooring; replacement of Bar Cellar Fridge & Freezer
- 
- Redecoration of Clubhouse interior.
- Community Club Refurnishing plans: continuing through Volunteer Committee
- Community Club Extension Plans - Options to:
  - Increase size of kitchen and add additional toilets;
  - Repurpose the changing rooms to include an accessible toilet
- Playing Field Improvement Plans: Pitchside Benches, Wooden Shed

## WRT & Community Club Constitution

It has been known for a while that the current WRT Constitution and Management Structure of the WRT & Community Club is not compliant with Charity Commission requirements and good governance practice, nor with both the existing constitution itself or the Community Club rules. The key issue is that at present the WRT Trustees manage the Community Club when, in accordance with the current rules, the Community Club should be run by its own Management Board which reports in turn to the WRT; equally the WRT as a charity cannot, under Charity Commission rules, earn its main income from alcohol sales which is currently the case. Therefore, after significant research and discussion over the past year, including with the Charity Commission, the WRT Trustees have agreed a proposal to ensure compliance with Charity Commission requirements and put the WRT and Community Club on a more secure footing; that proposal will be voted on by Community Club members as part of this AGM.

Two options are available:

**Option 1: Recommended.** To adjust the WRT Constitution to match the Charity Commission Association model to ensure that Community Club members are properly recorded as the voting members of the WRT. Mapping the Constitution and the Community Club rules against each other so that the rules are compliant with the WRT Constitution. Adjusting the Trustees section of the Constitution so that Trustees include both Winsham Parish Council representation and Community Club member representation in a ratio of 5:4 to maintain 9 trustees on the WRT Management Committee, the same as now. This will make the WRT indivisible from the Community Club, as is current practice. However, the consequence of this – and the next step if members endorse the proposal – is that the WRT & Community Club will need to set up the Bar as a trading subsidiary run by volunteer directors in order to comply with Charity Commission rules.

**Option 2: Not recommended.** To keep the WRT and Community Club as separate entities with the Community Club reporting and passing profits to the WRT. This would mean no change to the WRT structure but a change to the WRT Constitution to a Foundation Model with no voting members and all Parish Councillors remaining as WRT Trustees. The Community Club would have to set up a Management Board from amongst its membership to run the Community Club as an unincorporated organisation. This Management Board would run the Community Club and the bar and would be responsible for paying an agreed share of profits to the WRT, with the remainder being reinvested into Community Club provision. The key disadvantages of this option, and the reason why the WRT Trustees are not recommending it, is that it would require a number of Community Club members (in most cases separate from the WRT Trustees) to volunteer to be elected to a Community Club Management Board to run the Community Club and, as an unincorporated organisation, members of the Management Board would hold personal liability for the Club's activities and operation. The key advantage would be that no trading subsidiary to run the bar would be required.

## Other Updates

- Premises License: We continue to look into a Premises Licence which would enable the WRT & Community Club to host more than 10 public events a year and reduce our costs per event. This continues to be on hold due to a backlog of work in the Licensing Authority.

- WRT Lease: Once the WRT & Community Club Constitution has been updated, the next organisational issue will be to update the lease agreement with Winsham Parish Council in order to put the WRT & Community Club on a secure and transparent foundation with which to continue to deliver their purpose successfully for the Winsham community. This should be the priority of the WRT & Community Club Chair to be elected at the next meeting of the WRT & Community Club Trustees.
- The Parish of Winsham continues to be an excellent place to live due to the wide variety of organisations, facilities, initiatives and events it hosts and operates successfully within and across a relatively small community. Key to that success is those different organisations, facilities, initiatives and events working collaboratively together to support each other and enable all to be successful for the benefit of the whole community. Wherever possible, the WRT & Community Club has and will seek to work collaboratively and coherently with all across the Winsham Parish Community.

In summary the WRT & Community Club have continued to grow positively in activity and impact over the past 14 months, supported by a healthy and improving financial position. Strong plans are in place to sustain that activity and financial position and enable future development for the benefit of Winsham Parish residents.



## **WRT/Community Club AGM 7 November 2022: WRT Chair's Report**

**Purpose:** I want to open by just reminding everyone of the purpose of the Winsham Recreational Trust (see Purpose slide) and to headline that the WRT operates the Upper Recreation Ground Playing Fields and Winsham Community Club on lease from Winsham Parish Council in pursuit of the WRT purpose.

**Thanks:** I now want to thank in general the many Winsham residents who make the delivery of that purpose possible. I am not going to name names because that would land me in trouble with the many people who prefer that their good work goes under the radar. However, those people know who they are and therefore, in general I want to thank the following for their hard work, dedication and positive contribution to the success of the WRT and the Winsham Community Club:

- Trustees
- Volunteers: Booking Secretary, Membership Secretary, Volunteer Committee, Bar Staff, Events Organisers, Cleaners, Hedge Cutters
- Community Club Members
- Winsham Parish Residents attending WRT/Community Club events

**Trustees Update:** The Trustees have changed since last year's AGM. All are Winsham Parish Councillors and are consequently WRT Trustees. Since October 21, Chloe Adams, Emma Pike and I have joined the Parish Council and become WRT Trustees. Trevor Harris, Judith Hill and Jenny Clampett have departed and we thank them for their service to the WRT. Steve Weller assumed the Chair from Trevor on his departure and in July 22 I took on the role of Chair from Steve who became the Deputy Chair. Henk and Lucy remain as Treasurer and Secretary respectively.

**Membership Update:** The last membership renewal/application window took place in September 2022. The total Winsham Community Club membership is currently 47 in total, a mix of single & family memberships. That is a decrease on last year but nonetheless a healthy number and new applications are always welcome. Annual membership is £5 for a single membership and £10 for a family membership. Application forms are available here at the club and also from the Winsham Village Shop.

Non-members must be signed in by a club member to use the Community Club Bar. From 1st January 2023 there will be a new requirement for users of the Community Club Bar who are not Community Club members to pay a £1 guest fee on each occasion. I should point out that the Community Club has a rule that non-members should use the bar a maximum of three times and that if they wish to use the bar again they should apply to become members; using

the bar five times as a non-member will be equivalent to joining as a single member for the year.

There are exceptions regarding use of the bar by non-members for any public events run by the Community Club for which the Club holds an events licence. Also anyone using the Club (but not the bar) solely as a 'warm hub' facility is exempt from membership requirements provided they comply with the reasonable behaviour expectations of the club.

**Volunteer Group:** I'd just like to highlight the key role of the Community Club Volunteer Group over the last year. This group has really grown in both size and contribution over the past year and has been critical to the success of many WRT/Community Club routine and special events, in particular the Winsham Fun Day in August which was a great success, due largely to the energy and commitment of the volunteers involved.

The Volunteer Group also has a growing role in considering and recommending club improvement initiatives, including currently for example the potential replacement of our internal furnishings – chairs, tables, sofas, lighting etc

The Volunteer Group meets every four to six weeks and any Community Club member is welcome to join.

In addition to the volunteer group there are a number of other volunteers who perform critical roles in helping the club to succeed and operate across a range of areas, including staffing the bar, helping with catering, doing the cleaning and hedge cutting.

**Activity Report – events, bookings, hires:** There has been a significant and positive increase in activity over the past year:

Winsham Community Club is now open regularly every weekend Friday and Saturday 7pm – 11pm and on Sunday from 2pm – 6 pm and is well attended by Community Club members and their guests. Killer Skittles takes place on Fridays and all club members and their guests are welcome to join in.

The Community Club also has its own Skittles team which plays on a Tuesday evening. Other Community Club events have included Takeaway Nights, Bingo Nights, Quiz Nights, and a Halloween Party; for some of these events the Community Club has been at full capacity which is great news. There are also some regular daytime classes (for example, Yoga) and events in the Community Club and plenty of scope for others.

Sadly, from the WRT perspective, Winsham United Football Club chose, as is their right, to play their matches at Thorncombe for the 2022/2023 season. A clear update on this situation was communicated earlier in the year so I will not dwell on that here, except to say that the WRT is open to future negotiations for the use of the Upper Recreation Ground Changing Rooms

and Playing Fields for next season or beyond and that we wish Winsham United Football Club every success in this current season in their new home.

Moving back to more positive news, the Winsham Fun Day run for the whole Winsham Community across the afternoon and evening was a great success with hundreds of people across the Community attending all or part of the event. The MacMillan Brave the Shave event held in early October was also a great success, raising in excess of £2000 for charity. Other fundraising events included Blood Bikes and Prostrate Cancer. Other events held included a Children's Christmas Party, Jubilee Celebrations, and an opportunity for people to pay their respects to HM Queen Elizabeth II by watching her funeral together in the Club.

There has also been a notable increase in private hire bookings, for parties and family events including a naming ceremony. This is partly down to increased awareness of the excellent and improving facilities available at the Community Club and Playing Fields and an improved bookings process. This has also been helped by improved communications through an excellent monthly newsletter, an active Facebook page, a Google Business listing so we appear in searches, a much improved advert for the Joint Parish Magazine and a dedicated booking email address.

Lastly in terms of current activity, I just want to highlight the opportunity for anyone in need of a 'warm hub' that they are welcome to attend the club when it is open for normal activity and make use of the 'warmth' of the building to relax and help themselves to a free tea or coffee from the kitchen. Unfortunately use of the bar is precluded unless they are a member. If there is clearly identifiable demand for further 'warm hub' support, the WRT will consider how it can support this need.

Looking forward, the following events are planned for the rest of this year alongside normal opening hours:

- WHS AGM 18 November
- Craft Fair (one venue) 19 November
- Toilet Twinning Quiz: Fundraiser 19 November
- Rockin Ronnie: 10 December
- Family Christmas Party and Santa's Grotto 16 December
- New Year's Eve: Brad's Disco & Cocktail Specialist

**Improvements – completed and planned:** There have been significant improvements to the Club and Playing Fields over the past year and more planned for the future to make the facilities even better than they are now.

Over the past year improvements have included:

- Changing Rooms: Decorated; Non-slip floor; Shower fittings
- Community Club: TV; PA System; Bar Fridge; Toilet Sinks; Alarm System; CCTV; Picnic Tables; Bench

- Playing Field: Regular grass cutting and hedge cutting.

The following potential improvements are at various stages of planning and some, particularly extension plans, will be reliant on securing grants for the work:

- Community Club Refurnishing plans: in progress with Volunteer Committee
- Community Club Extension Plans - Options to:
  - Increase size of kitchen and add additional toilets;
  - Create a door through to a patio area;
  - Increase the Community Club floor area
  - Extend the changing rooms to include an accessible toilet
- Playing Field Improvement Plans: Pitchside Benches, Wooden Shed
- WUFC Goalposts kindly left in place by WUFC for the benefit of the Community. Also the WUFC Metal Shed.

### **Other Updates**

- Premises License: We are looking into a Premises Licence which would enable the WRT & Community Club to host more than 10 public events a year and reduce our costs per event. At present this is on hold due to a backlog of work in the Licensing Authority.
- WRT Lease & Constitution: There is a clear need to review the WRT Constitution, the WRT & Community Club structure and the WRT Lease with Winsham Parish Council in order to ensure we are fully compliant with Charity Commission requirements, good governance practice and have a clear and updated lease agreement with Winsham Parish Council so that the WRT and Winsham Community Club have secure and transparent foundations on which to continue to deliver their purpose successfully for the Winsham community. We have done some initial scoping work but now need to take this forward and this area of work will be my priority as Chair for the year ahead; I intend to report back with substantial progress to next year's AGM.
- I want to emphasise that the Parish of Winsham is an excellent place to live partly due to the wide variety of organisations, facilities, initiatives and events it hosts and operates successfully within and across a relatively small community. Key to that success is those different organisations, facilities, initiatives and events working collaboratively together to support each other and enable all to be successful for the benefit of the whole community. Wherever possible, the WRT & Community Club has and will seek to work collaboratively and coherently with all across the Winsham Parish Community.

I want to draw my Chair's report to a close by re-emphasising that the WRT & Community Club has seen a positive growth in activity and impact over the past year and that strong plans are in place to sustain that activity and enable future development for the benefit of Winsham Parish residents.


