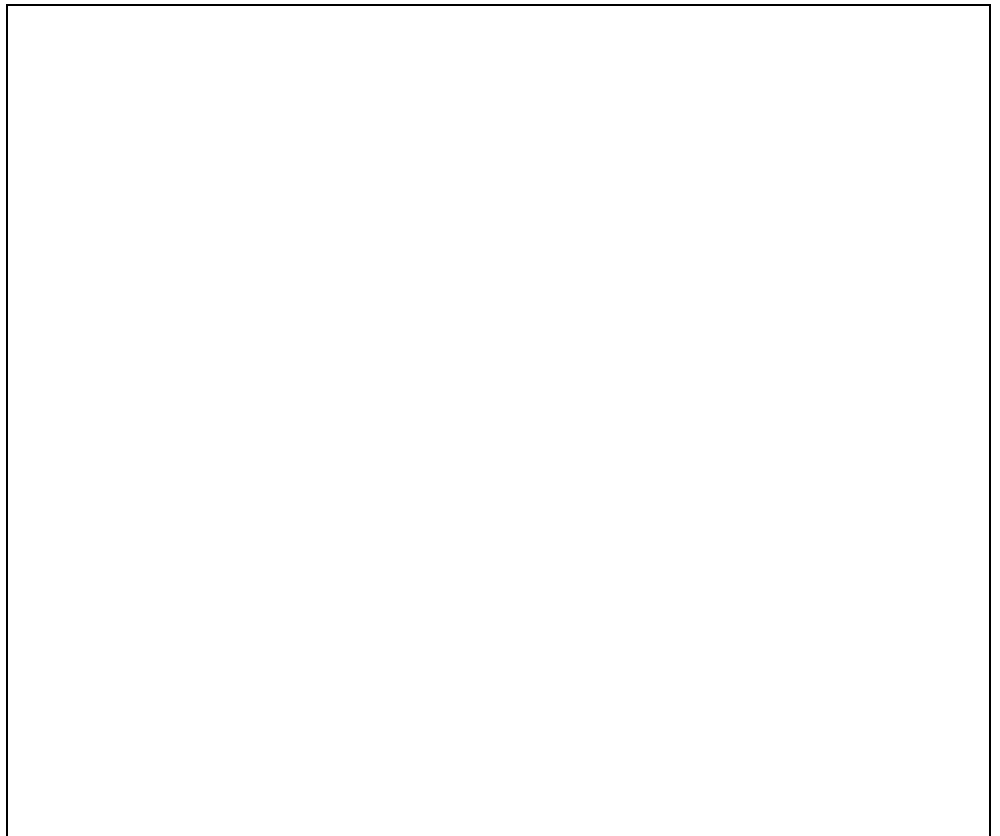

During the last 5 years we have developed Sleepsafe Selby exponentially from its initial starting point.

To build Sleepsafe we needed the support of the local community to raise the funds needed and to bring our ideas to life. This included being involved with local fundraising events.

Raising awareness within the community we built our name and reputation and also gathered the funds to start the project.

As Sleepsafe Selby has grown we have increased staffing to enable us to offer much more structured support, not only to the residents but to anyone at risk.

We have now developed a good reputation within the community and work closely with other organisations to create a strong network of available support to our clients.

We recently worked with Community First Yorkshire to update all of our policies and develop the core structure of the Charity.

The National Lottery has been a great support to us over the last 3 years and recently the Lloyds Bank Foundation has offered tailored support to further our development.

We have developed support plans and data systems and have employed staff with the knowledge and experience to implement structured and consistent support to our clients.

Many of our clients return to volunteer at Sleepsafe Selby to give something back and offer lived experience to add another level to the support on offer.

Our goals: to expand and create more available bedrooms. We currently provide 10 bedrooms and have supported 145 individuals out of homelessness and into permanent housing.

To grow and learn: to maintain the steady growth of Sleepsafe Selby whilst reducing our carbon footprint and keeping running costs to a minimum.

To find new ways to support and engage with our clients.

Fundraising is through donations of clothing which is sold on Vinted. Other fundraising events take place, for example at the Selby Fun Day. Sleepsafe Selby is constantly working to improve facilities and providing help and support for those in need.

Independent Examination Report for Sleepsafe Selby, Charity Number: 1189035, for the period from 01/01/2020 to 31/12/2020

1. The Charity

Sleepsafe is a charity in Selby North Yorkshire, with an aim to prevent poverty and provide temporary housing to those in need.

The charity has 6 individual accommodations available with shared facilities. At the time of the visit, the site was well maintained and all rooms were occupied. There were some working carrying out by volunteers to extend the storage areas and make good of the site.

The charity aims to provide the accommodations for a period of 6 to 8 weeks and also works with individuals to seek a more long-term solutions, including jobs and housing.

2. The Finance

2.1 Income - The charity reported an income of £39.5K for the period from 01/01/2020 to 31/12/2020, majority of the income was from the on-line sales of items donated by general public. There was also a small proportion of cash donations.

2.2 Expenses - For the same period, the charity reported a total expense of £35.5K, the biggest single item expenditure was an accrual for a solar panel project of £10K, this was to allow costs for the installation of solar panel on site to reduce the reliance on electricity and gas supplies. The project has since been completed in 2021.

Other expenses included the purchase of a container which was utilised to provide more accommodation. In total, £11K were spent on site maintenance, repair and the provision of facilities.

2.3 - Asset, the charity has an asset with a net book value of £11K, this was made up of the containers purchased.

3. Future Projects

Included in the accounts was an accrual for a solar panel project, this was completed in 2021. The charity also seeks to expand its capacity and provide

more accommodation. There are also on-going projects to improve the on-site facilities.

4. Summary

The charity has been providing good quality care, support and accommodation to its users and is well received by its residents and general public.

Financially, the charity was able to self-fund using the donations received from general public. The charity is currently seeking more public funding to support its operation and expansion.

The charity is solely ran by its Chair with the assistance from 2 part time employees and volunteers, the feedback from its residents were positive.

5. Limitation of this report.

It was noted that there is no inventory list, all non-cash donations received, if in re-saleable conditions were listed online, therefore no stock check was carried out. Some items were provided to its residents directly, again, no record as available. It was suggested to the charity that an inventory list will be desirable.

Due to the high turn-over of its residents and client confidentiality, it was unable to verify some expenditures relating to clients' support. The feedback from the charity is that if such detailed recording was required, it would have consumed a high proportion of the very limited man-power that is available to the charity and further delay the provision of its services which should be the main purpose of its operation. Furthermore, individual residents may be reluctant to utilise the support hence reduce the utilisation of the charity.

All financial information was provided by the charity, when expense receipts were not available, explanations were provided by the charity and all were reasonable and in line to its operations.

No contact was made to the general public who made the donations, therefore unable to verify the amounts and items received, all donations via the charity bank accounts were accounted for.

No contact to other 2 trustees were available; all communication was directly from its Chair.
