4 Achievements & Performance

4.1 Outputs and Outcomes for the Charity's Beneficiaries

During 2024 the charity organised the fourth edition of the Mediterranean Machine Learning school.

The event took place from the 9th to the 13th of September 2024 and it was held in Milan, Italy in coordination with the Università degli Studi di Milano - Bicocca.

The speakers were selected among renowned researchers from industry and academia, providing attending students with state of the art information on machine learning and AI.

With respect to the previous edition, we were able to further expand the event to host more than 180 participants from more than 30 different countries, with an extraordinarily diverse breadth and depth of representation, ranging from Canada to China, from Nigeria to the Netherlands.

The participants got access to more than 22 hours of lectures, 10 hours of laboratories, presented more than 30 posters and had many opportunities to network during several breaks and social events. 52% of participants were PhD students, 26% master students and the rest coming from industry or faculty positions.

In line with the charity's goal of supporting diversity while providing high quality education, our speakers included 11 female speakers out of 20 total speakers. More than 20% of the attendees were female. Both ratios are well above the average in the current machine learning community.

4.2 How the Public Have Benefitted.

Student feedback collected over four years consistently indicates a high degree of satisfaction with the summer school, with 95.5% of respondents on average recommending the program.

The effectiveness of the organization and the supportive demeanor of the team were consistently highlighted. Organizers were frequently commended for their diligent work, kindness, and helpfulness, contributing to a positive learning environment.

The academic content and the quality of the speakers also received positive evaluations. Students reported significant knowledge acquisition and expressed appreciation for the expertise provided. Speaker ratings consistently demonstrated high satisfaction, averaging 96.9% of respondents rating them a 4 or 5 out of 5.

Beyond the curriculum, students noted the school's success in fostering community and facilitating networking opportunities. Many valued the chance to connect with peers and experts from various backgrounds. The inclusive atmosphere was a recurring positive theme, with an average of 96% of respondents rating the school's inclusivity a 4 or 5 out of 5.

The event was completely free of charge for all students ensuring we could reach all eligible students regardless of their financial situation and socio-economic status. We, instead, required a small fee for faculty and industrial attendees to help support scholarships for students.

In line with the charity mission to bolster high level education for students everywhere, whenever the lecturer gave their consent, we made sure to record the lecture and we published slides and video recordings in a freely accessible form on our YouTube channel:

5 Financial Review

5.1 Details of Any Funds Materially in Deficit

The Charity has no funds which are materially in deficit.

5.2 Policy on Reserves

The Charity's funds are to be applied for the purpose of promoting high-level education in the field of machine learning and artificial intelligence in accordance with the charity's objectives.

The Trustees acknowledge that the funds raised from sponsorships and donations in the future will potentially vary considerably over time and thus reserves must be held to ensure the charity can cover future expenses that may occur as part of the pursuit of the charity's goals.

For the year 2024 the Trustees decided most of the charity's yearly income to be held as reserve, to be used to cover future expenses in future years. These may include essential administrative expenses (for example cover the account examination costs, as required by law) and costs related to the organisation of future educational events in line with the charity's objectives (for example to minimise the cost of attendance for students, in particular from disadvantaged backgrounds).

As of 31/12/2024 the reserves amount to:

- 55,379.99 GBP
- 84,577.98 EUR, equivalent to 71,743.13 GBP at the exchange rate 1 EUR = 0.8482 GBP ([Average rate for 2024 from HMRC](#)).
- 1,000.00 USD equivalent to 782.04 GBP at the exchange rate 1 USD = 0.7820 GBP ([Average rate for 2024 from HMRC](#)).

All reserves are held in cash in the previously mentioned bank accounts.

5.3 Principal Sources of Funding and Outgoings

For the year 2024 fundings come from two main sources:

- Donations collected through Benevity¹ for a total of 2,735.62 GBP.
- Sponsorship for the Event for a total of 52,918.82 GBP, including sponsorships denominated in GBP, EUR (exchanged to GBP using the exchange rate 1 EUR = 0.8482 GBP ([Average rate for 2024 from HMRC](#))) and USD (exchanged to GBP using the exchange rate 1 EUR = 0.7820 GBP ([Average rate for 2024 from HMRC](#))).

During the financial year 2024, the Charity sustained outgoings in relation to the organisation of the school, mainly in providing catering, speakers' travel reimbursement and scholarship for students.

5.4 Remuneration of Trustees

All Trustees act in a voluntary capacity.

No trustee receives any payments for the services they provide to the charity.

Out-of-pocket expenses incurred necessarily, reasonably and incidentally in the course the charity's activities *can* be reimbursed at cost. However, no Trustees received any reimbursement of out-of-pocket expenses in the current financial year.

5.5 Financial Status

The charity reported a positive end-of-year balance. For operations denominated with currency different from GBP, their value in the records corresponds to the equivalent GBP using the 2024 year average exchange rate as provided by the [HMRC](#). Mismatch in currency conversion between

For the year 2023 fundings come from two main sources:

- Donations collected through Benevity⁴, Amazon smile⁵ and private donations for a total of 5,318.41 GBP.

4 Achievements & Performance

4.1 Outputs and Outcomes for the Charity's Beneficiaries

During 2021 the charity organised the first edition of the Mediterranean Machine Learning school.

The event took place from the 11th to the 16th of January 2021. Due to Covid-19 the event was held in virtual form, to minimise risks for students and speakers.

The speakers were selected among renowned researchers from industry and academia, providing attending students with state of the art information on machine learning and AI.

The event was attended by 361 participants from over the world. 51% of participants were PhD students, 21% master students and the rest coming from industry or faculty positions.

In line with the charity's goal of supporting diversity while providing high quality education, our speakers included 10 female speakers out of 21 total speakers. More than 27% of the attendees were female. Both ratios are well above the average in the current machine learning community.

4.2 How the Public Have Benefitted.

During 2021 the charity organised the first edition of the Mediterranean Machine Learning school. 361 attendees received lectures, practical sessions, mentorship sessions, keynote speeches, and networking opportunities with some of the leading researchers in machine learning world wide.

Feedback collected from attendees after the event was overwhelmingly positive: 97% were satisfied (4/5) or very satisfied (5/5) with the choice of speakers and 89% attended most or all lectures.

The event was completely free of charge for all attendees, ensuring we could reach all eligible attendees regardless of their financial situation and socio-economic status.

In line with the charity mission to bolster high level education for students everywhere, whenever the lecturer gave their consent, we made sure to record the lecture and we published slides and video recordings in a freely accessible form at <https://www.m2lschool.org/talks> and on our YouTube channel: <https://www.youtube.com/playlist?list=PLF-wkqRv4u1YRbfnwN8cXXyrmXld-sked>.

5 Financial Review

5.1 Details of Any Funds Materially in Deficit

The Charity has no funds which are materially in deficit.

5.2 Policy on Reserves

The Charity's funds are to be applied for the purpose of promoting high-level education in the field of machine learning and artificial intelligence in accordance with the charity's objectives.

The Trustees acknowledge that the funds raised from sponsorships and donations in the future will potentially vary considerably over time and thus reserves must be held to ensure the charity can cover future expenses that may occur as part of the pursuit of the charity's goals.

For the year 2021 the Trustees decided most of the charity's first year income to be held as reserve, to be used to cover future expenses in future years. These may include essential administrative expenses (for example cover the account examination costs, as required by law) and costs related to the organisation of future educational events in line with the charity's objectives (for example to minimise the cost of attendance for students, in particular from disadvantaged backgrounds).

As of 31/12/2021 the reserves amount to:

- 1,275.56 GBP
- 31,061.50 EUR, equivalent to 26,237 GBP at the exchange rate 1 EUR = 0.8447 GBP

All reserves are held in cash in the previously mentioned bank accounts.

5.3 Principal Sources of Funding and Outgoings

For the year 2021 fundings come from two main sources:

- Donations collected through Benevity (registration to the platform happened on 10/08/2021) for a total of 1,235.88 GBP.
- Income from charitable activities for a total of 31,121 EUR, equivalent to 26,288 GBP using the exchange rate on 31/10/2021 (1 EUR = 0.8447 GBP).

As mentioned in the [Bank accounts](#) section, because of Covid (most banks suspended applications from new clients) we managed to open the bank accounts only after the event we organised took place. In order to make the summer school possible, we collaborated with an established local Italian non profit called Lead the future. They handled sponsorships and expenses of the event, and we oversaw the organisation of the school. At the end of the school Lead the Future paid our charity for the organisation work we put in. This has been invoiced, with invoice #1/21 (11/10/2021) and represents the item under "Income from charitable activities".

During the financial year 2021, the Charity had sustained only administrative fees. The full report is provided in the [Statement of Financial Activities](#) section.

5.4 Remuneration of Trustees

All Trustees act in a voluntary capacity.

No trustee receives any payments for the services they provide to the charity.

Out-of-pocket expenses incurred necessarily, reasonably and incidentally in the course the charity's activities *can* be reimbursed at cost. However, no Trustees received any reimbursement of out-of-pocket expenses in the current financial year.

5.5 Financial Status

The charity reported a positive end-of-year balance. For operations denominated with currency different from GBP, their value in the records corresponds to the equivalent GBP at the end of the month of the corresponding transaction. 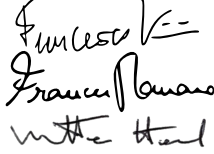
