Despite this setback we have continued to grow our membership year on year and now include a ladies workshop day which is well attended.

Our current membership level has required the shed to open an additional day each week and this is also an indicator that we are outgrowing the space that we have available

During the year we have been able to upgrade and replace machinery with the aid of grants and donations and the sale of goods made by the shed members.

We organise frequent visits to other sheds and visit a canal boat charity for canal rides throughout the year and organise trips to heritage railway groups and other like organisations. These are well attended and much appreciated by our members.

We also have links with local community groups and seek to work with them in promoting well being and safe places where we are able to meet and feel safe and be assisted in integration into society.
