**Report of Trustees**

The Trustees present their report and financial statements for the year ended 30 April 2022.

Charity: Pregnant in West London: 1189389

**General Description of the Charity's activities**

The main aim of Pregnant in West London is the advancement of education in the subjects of pregnancy, labour and delivery, breastfeeding and neonatal care.

The preservation and protection of good physical and mental health and wellbeing among women during pregnancy and during the post natal period by providing information and advice designed to ensure that they are confident and supported to make well informed choices which will result in positive health outcomes for themselves and their babies.

Pregnant in West London provides free antenatal and postnatal birthing classes covering subjects including labour, birth nutrition, mental health, first aid, pain relief and coming home with baby. Applicants join one round at a time which consist of eight weekly sessions that cover all the topics mentioned above. All our speakers are registered professionals in their own field. We aim to continue these much-needed classes in West London, as we have an ever-growing demand, from constant referrals by the NHS midwives, NHS GP'S and social workers, who all highly recommend us.

Our sessions are all funded by the grants and donations that the trustees work hard to achieve throughout the year.

This year we have been running our classes with both face to face sessions and Zoom sessions as required.

**Risk Management**

The Trustees actively review the risk, which the Charity faces on a regular basis. The review of the controls of the financial systems will provide sufficient resources in the event of adverse conditions.

The Trustees have also examined other operational and business risks faced by the Charity and confirm that the Trustees have established systems to mitigate the significant risks.

**Statement of Trustees' Responsibilities**

Charity law require the Trustees to prepare financial statements for each financial year, which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the Charity and of its results for that period. In preparing those financial statements the Trustees are required to:

- Select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;

- State whether the policies adopted are in accordance with applicable accounting standards, subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements; and
- Prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to assume that the Charity will continue in operation.

The Trustees are responsible for keeping proper accounting records, which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time, the financial position of the Charity and to enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with relevant law. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the Charity and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud or other irregularities.

The Trustees meet and report regularly on operations for the year under review.


