NEFOS enables communities to achieve enhanced socioeconomic status through optimal utilization of local resources for sustainable

<p>The key programs that the charity raises funds for include:</p> <p>Cultivation of reliant Crops: Promote improved and biofortified varieties of seeds.</p> <p>The approach is focused on working with groups or associations of farmers to increase access to improved seeds in the community based on local solutions.</p> <p>Capacity-Building Trainings: Develop the skills and knowledge of smallholder farmers to increase agricultural production and productivity, intensify sustainable agriculture based on agro-ecological principles, and manage natural resources sustainably.</p> <p>Agribusiness: Provide smallholder farmers with training in understanding the business demand and supply concepts and negotiating their products. Through this approach, skills will be developed not only for subsistence cultivation but also for agricultural businesses.</p>

During the year 2024, the charity supported four community-based organizations (CBOs) in Kenya to grow drought-resistant maize and moringa plants and beekeeping. This impacted over 50 families and 250 individuals. The charity also donated clothes to newborn babies and books to two primary schools, thereby improving their libraries.

NEFOS Charity maintains financial reserves to ensure the stability of its operations and the continued delivery of services to the community in the event of unexpected funding shortfalls or emergencies. The charity aims to hold reserves equivalent to **three to six months of normal operating costs**.

This level is considered sufficient to cover essential expenses such as staff, program delivery, and administrative commitments while alternative funding sources are sought. Reserves will be reviewed annually by the trustees as part of the budgeting and risk management process to ensure they remain appropriate for the charity's size, activities, and financial position.


