Summary of the charity's main activities and achievements

See appendix for full report.

Financial review

During the year income increased by £20,440, to £52,880, with £5,200 of the increase relating to recovered gift aid. Expenditure increased by £420, to £51,710. As a result the cash held by the charity increased by £1,170, to £26,170, of which £25,170 is unrestricted and can be used for any charitable purpose.

Reserves policy

The trustees have determined that the charity should aim to hold unrestricted cash of no less than 3 months of unrestricted expenditure (which equates to approximately £13,000) so that the charity could continue to operate should income and / or expenditure vary adversely. At the year end, the charity held unrestricted cash of £25,170 and the charity is complying with its reserves policy.

Governance

Responsibility for setting policy and for making operating decisions rest with the trustees who meet regularly to monitor the activities of the charity. New trustees (who are members) are recruited and appointed by the existing trustees.

Safeguarding

Our current policy is that all trustees should have safeguarding training as a first priority, and all of our trustees have received safeguarding training. Our next priority is to get our evangelists to also receive training. We hope to address this early in 2026.

Responsibilities of trustees

Charity law requires us as Trustees to prepare financial statements for each accounting year which record the receipts and payments of the charity for the year.

We are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charity and enable us to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Charities Act 2011.

We also have a responsibility to safeguard the assets of the charity and to take reasonable steps to prevent fraud or any other irregularities.

1 Accounting policies

General funds are unrestricted funds which are available for use at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of the general objectives of the charity. Designated funds comprise unrestricted funds that have been set aside by the trustees for particular purposes. Restricted funds are donations which are to be used in accordance with specific restrictions imposed by donors; they include donations received from appeals for specific activities or projects.

The Trustees have pleasure in submitting the Report and Accounts for the year ended 30 April 2025.

Objects of the charity

The charity is governed by a constitution and is constituted as a charitable incorporated organisation. The object of the CIO is, for the public benefit, to advance the Christian faith in such ways as the Charity's Trustees may from time to time decide.

Our purpose statement at the M16 Revival Foundation:

'To Revive the Great Commission'.

In review of the charity's main activities and achievements to further the above objectives and vision, the charity's main activities and achievements were as follows:

Introduction:

This fiscal year represents a landmark period of growth and spiritual impact for the M16 Revival Foundation. Under the leadership of Lead Evangelist Kristian Lythe, the charity successfully met its primary objective of mobilizing the Church for mass evangelism. By transitioning from vision-casting to a high-output training and mission model, M16 Revival continues stir believers and evangelists towards soul-winning and proclaiming the Gospel in the United Kingdom as well as a growing desire to see an impact in the Nations.

May 2024

OPERATION 100 REPORT & CELEBRATION

In May we hosted a Special M16Revival Operation 100 Celebration in Lighthouse Church with **40 people** from our team as we reached the goal of Preaching the Gospel and running missions at **100 London Tube Stations** in 1 year. It was a key time for testimonies and stories from the 100 Missions that we led outreaches outside Tube Stations from March 2024 to March 2025. We had set out a plan to mobilise evangelists to lead worship, share Jesus one to one, publicly preach and pray for people. This was done by collaborating with 75 different evangelists who teamed up to collaborate together. Here is the list of Tube Stations that we reached during that period:

The next aim is to reach every London Tube and Train Station in London with the Gospel. During this time, we saw hundreds hear the Gospel and pray with an evangelist on the streets and we saw over **150 make a Documented Decision for Jesus**. During the Operation 100 we were able to bless one of the new evangelists with a new Gospel speaker from the Obadiah Fund so he can continue to preach the Gospel.

Impact Report: The Impact of Operation 100 has been huge as we have a group of **75 evangelists** who are collaborating together to preach the Gospel all over London. In 1 year, **they had planned 100 missions to 100 London Tube Stations**, preaching the Gospel to staff and passersby. This was birthed from being a little frustrated that we were not seeing enough of the evangelists from the conference pioneering missions in the UK, so we decided to challenge them to be involved in this annual project to reach **100 stations**. It's been amazing to see people turned from hearing about the vision to accomplishing the vision together of saturating London with the Gospel.

Harlow Mission Visit

On 30th May, Kristian Lythe took a small team to mobilise **20 Evangelists and believers** from the church into Harlow where they hit the streets sharing Jesus one to one. It was the first time the church hit the streets and did one to one evangelism. Later we had a meeting with the leaders afterwards to discuss the possibility of leading an evangelism workshop there in Harlow later in the year. We saw **8 people respond to follow Jesus at the service and 2 people** respond to the Gospel on the Streets.

Ministry Partnership Events

Trafalgar Square with Walking Like Jesus Ministries

On 4th May, we had the awesome opportunity to partner with Walking Like Jesus Ministries as they gathered **2000 Evangelists and believers** in the heart of Trafalgar Square for live worship, praying for the nation and preaching the Gospel. Kristian had the opportunity to serve as part of the team to proclaim the Gospel on the live stage and many M16 team members took part in the outreaches that blitz London with the Gospel. Hundreds responded to the call to accept Jesus and came forward at the altar Call when Ev Chand gave the Call.

Impact Report: This one-day event which gave us the opportunity to partner with Evangelists right across the Country which made national headlines and united Evangelists and those passionate about spreading the Gospel across the Nation. This also encouraged more churches, evangelists and believers to pioneer similar events in their own towns and cities. Since then, many others have hired Trafalgar Square and Parliament Square for significant Gospel Prayer and Proclamation Events to mobilise the church.

June 2024

THE EVANGELISTS CONFERENCE – WEMBLEY

This year as a team, we had a powerful time hosting the M16 Evangelists Conference in the heart of Wembley at Harvest Church. The Evangelist's Conference has grown in its influence and impact across the Evangelistic Community. Kristian organised and led the conference with the team as we hosted various speakers who are influencing many to be bold about their faith with key speakers such as Jonathan Oloyede, Daniel Chand, Dominic Muir and CFAN UK evangelists. **We had 245 Evangelists** attend the conference over 3 days with Evangelism happening every day in the afternoons across the city. We hit **16 Tube Stations** with the Gospel, increasing our impact across London by sending out teams from the conference each day. We specifically targeted the Jubilee Line and hundreds of people heard the message of the Gospel as we recorded **75 Documented Decisions for Jesus**.

Impact: The Evangelists Conference has grown in its impact and has people attending from all over the UK. This gives M16 Revival the opportunity to connect and partner with leaders, evangelists, churches and believers from the diverse Christian Community across the UK. One of the main keys to bringing the Gospel to the UK is going to be mobilising the Saints into every corner and corridor of society. We see the

importance of the conference each year to gather and keep that momentum going as we join hand in hand with other Evangelistic Ministries to see an impact for Jesus across the UK and beyond.

Ministry Partnership Events

Fire camp Ilford London

We continue to partner with Christ For All Nations (CFAN) in the UK. We had the opportunity to join the team for the London Ilford Fire camp where we had the opportunity to work alongside other CFAN Evangelists and train **60 new Evangelists** in preaching the Gospel. We saw **130 people make decisions to follow Jesus** over the two outreaches and the 60 Evangelists trained were sent back to their Churches to make an impact. Toyin Lythe, Rodel Perez some of our team members graduated as trained Fire camp Evangelists. This CFAN week of training also gave M16 Revival the opportunity to partner for missions with other evangelists across the UK. The Fire camp was based in East London so we had the opportunity to share Jesus in Ilford and also extend our reach across London Tube Stations on the east part of the city.

Impact: One of our main priorities as a charity is to train evangelists; partnering with CFAN UK helps us to achieve this and to extend our impact to influence evangelists and missionaries from other towns and cities across the UK.

Sunday Base Gathering

From February to June 2024, we gathered evangelists and local believers weekly on Sundays. This was a special season as it allowed us to strengthen the relationships we have built over the years. As a team we decided to pause these as it was stretching us a little too far as we needed to keep pioneer mission's projects on the weekends. These meetings were very powerful times and many evangelists from our team across the country came by to meet, fellowship and receive prayer. We know we will move into building a strong community locally at some point but we decided to put this on hold until the time is right. During the 4 months we baptised 1 person and **gathered 35 different evangelists**. The attendance began to decrease during our busy season in June when we launched the Evangelists Conference, we felt we could not ask the same people to attend and build Sundays and be out helping at conferences on Friday and Saturdays. In order to move this local project, forward we will need an assistant leader to help do the day to day manage and pastoral care for those who are gathering.

Impact Report: These last 5 months have given evangelists and local believers a place to attend and connect. Many encountered the Lord and went back to their towns and cities to keep building their evangelism teams and local believers have been encouraged to preach the Gospel.

July 2024

REVIVE ABERDEEN

We sent Ev Kristian, our lead evangelist to visit Aberdeen earlier in the year to meet with Pastor Ediosa, Love Bridge Church, Pastor Blessing and Pastor Hope to discuss the possibility of setting up a Citywide Evangelism Training Day for local churches in

July 2024. During the time there Kristian had the opportunity to minister in 3 local churches.

From Thursday July 18th to Sunday July 21st, we sent a team of 12 people to Aberdeen for a powerful revival mission and citywide evangelism training called **REVIVE ABERDEEN**. We partnered with several local churches, including Hope Church, Love Bridge, Church of God Mission, CFAN and the RCCG Churches. **100 Evangelists and believers** were trained in bold evangelism and one-on-one witnessing on Saturday 20th July 10am – 4pm. During the sessions, we hit the streets with live worship and the proclamation of the Gospel, reaching people at train stations, bus stops, and shopping centres across the city. **40 people made documented decision for Christ**, and countless lives were touched through prayer and healing! We are thrilled by what God accomplished and the team unity we all shared during meals at the hotel. This is just the beginning for Aberdeen; churches were stirred, and local believers shared powerful testimonies on Sunday regarding the mission's impact.

Impact: For some churches this was the first time their members were trained in evangelism and shared the gospel. This was the first time an M16Revival mission took place in Scotland; the impact we made on the churches was so significant that they would like us to return.

August 2024

M16 SUMMER RAMPAGE MISSION

The M16 Summer Rampage Mission successfully saturated **25 strategic London stations over ten intensive days**, bringing the Gospel directly to the heart of the city's transport network. Through bold preaching and live worship, hundreds of commuters stopped to hear the gospel message, resulting in numerous documented decisions and powerful moments of prayer. By re-digging the wells of revival across these high-traffic hubs, our team effectively stirred the spiritual atmosphere and ignited a fresh fire among local believers. We deployed **40 Evangelists** across the City in key commuter hubs. This mission marked a major milestone toward our 100-station goal, strengthening the foundations in the team for future citywide outreach.

Impact Report: The summer rampage helped us increase our aim towards reaching 100 Tube Stations with the Gospel and our long-term aim of reaching every station in London.

September 2024

5TH Anniversary Celebration

On Sunday 15th September we gathered the M16 Team, families and partners for a Celebration of Thanksgiving at the South Oxhey Baptist Church outside Watford, UK. It was a special time as many of the newly trained evangelists shared testimonies of the impact Kristian and the team have had on their lives. We had a great time of fellowship with **75 Evangelists and families**, cutting cake and eating together afterwards. We **baptised two people** from one of the outreaches launched in Milton Keynes, which was a special time.

Impact Report: These special team gatherings strengthen team unity and encouraged team members towards the M16 Vision. They also give a space for the team and evangelists to share testimonies from the year.

M16 Media News

On September 17th, the M16 Revival mission reached a significant milestone as our lead evangelist, Kristian Lythe, was featured in a live interview on the Betty King Ministries TV Show, THE CRY, broadcast globally on God TV. This appearance provided a strategic platform to share the vision of M16 and our passion to pray for Revival in the United Kingdom and to declare the vision to a larger audience. We are so thankful to Betty King Ministries for this opportunity and their support as we continue to bring the gospel to the UK and help equip churches to share the gospel.

Impact Report: This episode has helped us reach a wider audience across the UK we wouldn't usually impact. This has also challenged us to re-think how we can upgrade our media to impact more people in the churches and also create more content for reaching those not in the church.

October 2024:

M16 Strategic Month of Prayer – A Day to Seek the Lord!

On Saturday 19th October, the M16 Revival team gathered at Wembley Christian Centre for a pivotal day of prayer and intercession. Our primary focus was to cry out to the Lord of the harvest, specifically petitioning Him to raise up a new generation of bold evangelists to reach the lost. This was a dedicated time of seeking God's heart, as we laid our plans before Him and asked for divine wisdom regarding the next phase of our mission and the mobilisation of evangelists in the city. We felt we had the peace of God to move forward with our mission to launch the next Evangelists Academy in November where we trained another **19 Evangelists**.

Impact Report: These days of prayer and intercession are pivotal days in our decision making process. These also provide important times of training for the team to wait, listen and hear from God before we put into practice what He is saying to us.

Watford Mission with Tough Talk

On Saturday 14th October, we led another local outreach to Watford with special guests Tough Talk and collaborated with the evangelists from the Evangelist's Academy. We saw **30 evangelists and believers** join us on the streets for the outreach and **14 people made a documented decision to follow Jesus**. We launched our Follow Jesus coffee meet up and saw 7 people attend over a few weeks so we could make sure they were connected to a local Church.

REVIVE SHREWSBURY

In October Ev Sean Carr and a small team of people from M16Revival pioneer their second mission to Shrewsbury. They led evangelism training in the Baptist Church and saw more than **25 people respond to Jesus** on the streets to the Gospel.

Impact: This second mission has helped churches start to unite together for the Gospel and to send teams to the streets and there is momentum building in the churches.

November 2024

Trinity Church, Wembley

Our lead evangelist Kristian Lythe visited Trinity Church in Wembley on Saturday 9th November to collaborate with Evangelist Keya and Pastor Mitel. During this strategic visit, the congregation was challenged to take full responsibility for the Great Commission, and we had the opportunity to present the M16 Revival vision through videos to inspire the believers.

Impact Report: Since then, the church has gone from strength to strength, consistently evangelising on the streets each week. Furthermore, members have actively participated in the Evangelists Conference and other key events with M16 Revival, demonstrating a lasting commitment to citywide transformation and soul winning.

Watford Carols

On November 14th, we held a strategic "warm-up" event at the Watford Shopping Centre during the Mayor's official Christmas tree lighting. At the invitation of the shopping centre management, we organized a choir and mobilised our team to engage with over **100 parents and schoolchildren**. This was a significant opportunity to introduce M16 Revival to the local community, and the turnout far exceeded our expectations. The success of the day was instrumental in building vital town-wide relationships and strengthening our partnership with the shopping centre.

Impact Report: Following the positive impact of this event, we were officially given the go-ahead to host the M16 Revival: Shine Your Light campaign on December 14th, 2024. This event was expected to be a major platform for us to proclaim the Gospel through dance, personal testimonies, and the distribution of gift invites. We are excited to build on this momentum and reach even more people in Watford with the message of Christ during the Christmas season.

M16 Evangelist's Academy (Nov – Dec)

In November 2024, M16 Revival pioneered the 2nd M16 Evangelist Academy, running a five-week intensive training course for evangelists from the 19th of November to the 12th of December. This strategic period, covering two Sundays, 2 Saturdays and 2 Fridays, saw 20 evangelists register to be equipped in bold Gospel proclamation, one-on-one outreach, and how to launch local church evangelistic outreaches. Supported

by a dedicated team of 8 senior M16 trained evangelists who provided mentorship and teaching, the academy achieved an outstanding success rate with **19 out of the 20 evangelists successfully graduating**. We sent these 19 to pioneer 19 new missions throughout London and the UK in order to graduate the Academy. The training focused on practical activation, moving participants from theory to high-impact public ministry in the heart of the city. Each of the graduating evangelists were given the opportunity to join M16 as Partner Evangelists and to collaborate with us on future initiatives and events.

Impact Report: The impact of the academy was felt immediately as students moved from the preparation phase to active missions across the London. Notable breakthroughs included an evangelist overcoming the fear of man to preach at a London tube station for the first time, while another successfully spearheaded a powerful mission in his local town of Bletchley. Throughout the five weeks, students led various outreaches at London tube stations in collaboration with their local churches, resulting in many people accepting Jesus Christ as their Saviour. This 2nd M16 Evangelists Academy was very successful and has firmly established the academy as a key strategy for M16 Revival to multiply labourers and expand the reach of the Gospel through the UK. To impact future evangelists is what M16Revival is all about, seeing them get excited about the Gospel, becoming bolder and more confident about sharing Jesus with others. We have now trained a total of **46 Evangelists** through our two Evangelists Academy since 2023.

December 2024

M16 Revival Shine Your Light Event

On Saturday, December 14th, we hosted the M16 Revival Shine Your Light Watford mission at Atria shopping centre Watford, creating a vibrant atmosphere of worship and outreach in the heart of the shopping centre. The event featured a dynamic collaboration between the M16 Revival team, the Beecham Grove Choir, Watford City Band, and local church singers, alongside a special appearance by the Tough Talk team. Their powerful presence, combined with prizes and high-energy engagement, successfully entertained and drew large crowds of shoppers, boldly preached the Gospel with Evangelist Kristian Lythe and a team of **20 Evangelists** from M16Revival. As the team shared the message of hope, volunteers were active on the floor, handing out gifts to passers-by and engaging in fruitful one-on-one evangelism.

Impact Report: This strategic mix of powerful testimonies and direct outreach transformed the busy shopping environment into a place of divine encounter, reaching hundreds of people with the love of Jesus. We have been inspired to look at other ways we can utilize the shopping centre space to bring the Gospel in other seasons.

January 2025

PRAYER & FASTING MONTH

From 10th – 24th January we launched 10 days of Prayer and Fasting for the year with different team members ministering online. This was so effective as it helped release

team members to lead prayers and have an opportunity to teach and preach laying a good foundation for the year ahead.

CFAN UK ALLIANCE RE-UNION

On January 20, 2025, our lead evangelist, Kristian Lythe, had the honour of leading the Christ for all Nations (CfaN) Evangelism Alliance Reunion for the United Kingdom. This landmark gathering brought together **80 influential evangelists** who are currently impacting towns and cities across the nation. The assembly represented a diverse geographical spread, with leaders traveling from Scotland, Wales, Manchester, Birmingham, the Midlands, and both the East and West of the UK. This event served as a strategic platform for Kristian to establish vital connections and partnerships with key evangelists who share a common mission of saturating the United Kingdom with the Gospel of Jesus Christ. The event featured esteemed guest speakers, including Jonathan Oloyede from the National Day of Prayer and CFAN's UK Director Luke Cartwright, both of whom delivered keynote messages.

Impact Report: A pivotal moment of the reunion occurred when Kristian, leading on behalf of CfaN, had the opportunity to minister and lead two of the key ministry sessions. The impact of this gathering has been immediate and far-reaching; Kristian has now successfully collaborated with new evangelists in various regions in partnership with CFAN and M16 Revival will continue to serve CFAN's vision in the UK.

February 2025

CFAN EVANGELISTS GATHERING, FLORIDA

In February 2025, our lead Evangelist Kristian Lythe was sent by M16 Revival to attend the Christ for all Nations (CfaN) Evangelism Alliance Congress in Orlando, Florida, joining **300 evangelists** from the global CfaN Evangelism Alliance. During this powerful week of meetings, Kristian had the opportunity to collaborate with international leaders to strategize for upcoming crusades in Africa and establish M16 ministry partnerships for 2025 and 2026. The gathering was marked by a heavy presence of God and deep encouragement from the ministry of Evangelists Daniel Kolenda, Peter Van Den Berg and Levi Lutz, alongside the entire CfaN team.

A significant highlight of the Congress occurred when the evangelists divided into groups by continent to pray specifically for revival across Africa, Asia, Europe, and the rest of the world. Kristian also got two days to spend with the CFAN UK team that was in Orlando at the same time to establish stronger connections for evangelism ministry in the UK.

Impact Report: This focused time of intercession left Kristian supercharged and full of faith for the future of M16 Revival. Following this impartation, the ministry is more committed than ever to its vision of bringing the Gospel to the United Kingdom, Europe, and the ends of the earth.

March 2025

WISBECH MISSION

M16 Revival recently conducted a powerful mission to Wisbech, UK, on the 29th of March in a strategic partnership with Pastor Femi and the local Redeemed Christian Church. The mission began with intensive training for the congregation, where believers were equipped through a Christ for all Nations (CfaN) evangelism workshop, focusing on one-to-one witnessing and bold public preaching. Kristian Lythe and Sean Carr were the trainers on the day.

The impact was immediate as the team and the **50 newly trained evangelists and believers** took to the streets to share the Gospel. In one remarkable instance, a man who had just finished his shift at a local tea shop felt a supernatural urge to visit a church; as he walked, he was stopped by the sound of the Gospel being preached, was touched by the Holy Spirit, and surrendered his life to Jesus on the spot. Additionally, a group of young people gathered around the team, resulting in six of them praying to receive Christ. In total, **we saw 11 documented responses to the Gospel**, which led to a time of joyful celebration and testimonies back at the church before the team shared a meal of Greek food to reflect on the Lord's work.

Impact Report: One of the aims of M16Revival is to train evangelists in local UK towns and cities. This mission has extended out influence in another town of the UK. Pastor Femi is also keen to work together on other missions.

April 2025

On Saturday 19th April 12:00-15:00, we hosted another local mission in the heart of Watford. It took place at St Mary's Church steps with Tough Talk and our M16 Worship Band. We had **50 Evangelists** and local believers join us for the mission from different churches across the town. **Many shared testimonies for the first time.** More than **15 people made a documented decision for Jesus.** We also preached the Gospel with dance solos and short testimonies in the shopping centre and had Live Acoustic Worship 16:00 – 18:00. It was amazing to see so many people stop and listen and other believers joining in and lifting their hands in worship as many shoppers passed by. We also led small missions to Ilford, South Oxhey and Watford train stations.

Impact: These regular missions to the town which we host 2-3 times a year are causing a rippling effect of outreach across the town and Christians are starting to be mobilised for missions. One of the next aims is to do an Evangelism Workshop in every church in Watford and the surrounding locations.

Conclusion

This year we saw the advance of the Gospel across London and the UK especially in Wembley, Watford, Aberdeen, Wisbech, Shrewsbury and Ilford as well as spreading the Gospel to **100 different London stations.** We accelerated in the training part of our vision with **2nd Evangelist's Academy.** We have seen new evangelists released and trained across the UK and London as the Gospel continues to advance through

M16Revival. We continued the **Evangelists Conference** in the heart of Wembley, London with **245 Evangelists** and continued to extend our reach across London through **Operation 100 by reaching 100 Tube Stations** by March 2025. The Summer Rampage Mission was a fantastic plan which caused us to reach 25 Stations in 10 days. We established the **M16 Evangelist's Academy** as a major training resource for new grassroots evangelists training **46 Evangelists**; we will continue this each year as time allows. We did not get to pioneer an M16 International Mission but we made many connections through CFAN Fire camp partnerships, new conferences and the congress impacting over **600+ Evangelists** in the UK. We also needed to pause the Base Gatherings on Sundays. We have a long-term aim to launch a mission and a crusade in the heart of Africa with Christ for All Nations and other partners.

Facts, Figures and Goals Achieved from April 2024 – May 2025

During this period, we:

- Launched 100 Missions at 100 Different London Tube Stations across the city Operation 100 Project with 75 Evangelists.
- Trained and impacted over 600+ Evangelists
- Trained 245 Evangelists at our 5th Evangelists Conference.
- Trained 19 more Evangelists through our 2nd Evangelists Academy
- Increasing our total to 46 Evangelists.
- Trained 100 Evangelists, Churches and Believers in Revive Aberdeen.
- Trained 120 Evangelists through partnering with CFAN Fire Camps
- Saw 475 Documented Decisions for Jesus through all the events and missions.
- Participated in the Trafalgar Square National Event which saw 2000 Evangelists Mobilised.

In planning the activities, the Trustees have applied the guidance on public benefit issued by the Charity Commission.

Strategic Achievements & KPI' for April 2024 – May 2025

A. Operation 100: Reaching 100 London Stations for Jesus.

- The charity's premier achievement was the completion of **Operation 100**. M16 Revival successfully pioneered and led **100 missions at 100 different London Tube Stations** within a 12-month cycle.
- Mobilising a **Workforce of 75 evangelists** with monthly and quarterly coordinated missions. **The result was** thousands of commuters were reached via public gospel preaching, establishing a blueprint for citywide saturation.

B. Training & Labourer Multiplication

- The Foundation achieved a major milestone in its mandate to train evangelists: **The Evangelist Academy** our intensive 5-week evangelists course saw a **95% graduation rate** taking our total number of trained evangelists to 46.
- **During the year of leadership development, we** ministered to and worked with over **600+ evangelists** through our national conferences (Wembley), Fire Camps, CFAN Re-unions and regional training days.

C. Regional & National Impact

M16 Revival expanded its geographic footprint to reach other parts of the UK.

- **Scotland:** Executed the first-ever M16 mission in Aberdeen, training 100 believers and recording **40 documented salvations**.
- **English Regions:** Conducted high-impact missions in **different UK cities & towns** totalling over **475 documented decisions for Christ** nationally.

D. Forward Strategy (2025–2026)

The Foundation's roadmap focuses on **Total Saturation and Global Expansion:**

- **Total London Saturation:** Reaching every remaining train and tube station in the Greater London area.
- **M16 Revival Base:** Establishing a permanent headquarters to serve as a weekly spiritual "engine room" for UK evangelists.
- **African Crusade:** Finalizing plans for a **mass Gospel Crusade in Africa** in partnership with CfaN.
- **The Academy Blueprint:** Standardising the Evangelist Academy as a recurring national training resource.

Final Conclusion

The M16 Revival Foundation has exceeded its primary goal of **100 stations** and has effectively "multiplied" itself by training **46 formal graduates** and impacting over **600+**

others. This reporting period marks a historic year for the M16 Revival Foundation successfully transitioning from local outreach to a national mobilization movement.

Review of the charity's main activities and achievements

Financial review

During the year income decreased by £3,600, to £32,400, and expenditure increased by £16,400, to £51,300. As a result the cash held by the charity decreased by £18,900, to £25,000, of which all is unrestricted and can be used for any charitable purpose.

Reserves policy

The trustees have determined that the charity should aim to hold unrestricted cash of no less than £11,000 (which equates to about 2-3 months of unrestricted expenditure) so that the charity could continue to operate should income and / or expenditure vary adversely. At the year end, the charity held unrestricted cash of £25,000 and the charity is complying with its reserves policy.

Governance

Responsibility for setting policy and for making operating decisions rest with the trustees who meet regularly to monitor the activities of the charity. New trustees (who are members) are recruited and appointed by the existing trustees.

Responsibilities of trustees

Charity law requires us as Trustees to prepare financial statements for each accounting year which record the receipts and payments of the charity for the year.

We are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charity and enable us to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Charities Act 2011.

We also have a responsibility to safeguard the assets of the charity and to take reasonable steps to prevent fraud or any other irregularities.

Objects of the charity

The charity is governed by a constitution and is constituted as a charitable incorporated organisation. The object of the CIO is, for the public benefit, to advance the Christian faith in such ways as the Charity Trustees may from time to time decide.

Our purpose statement at the M16 Revival Foundation:

‘To Revive the Great Commission’.

In review of the charity's main activities and achievements to further the above objectives and vision, the charity's main activities and achievements were as follows:

April 2023

‘The Call To Prayer Nights’ Watford

In early April, we received a “Call to Prayer” and after discussing with our team in May we launched a ‘Revival Prayer & Intercession’ initiative for Watford and the local Churches. We had the opportunity to utilise a local Church called Garston Community Church and after 4 weeks we hired the Luther Blisset Centre in Watford. We began to have a burden to pray for the town and all the local Churches, the prayer meeting continued for 4 months and grew. Throughout this period of time, some of our team members visited local Churches to build relationships and encourage local leaders. **We had 23 people** at the prayer meeting and people came as far as Bournemouth to join in. We also explored ‘spy out missions’ and ‘prayer walks’ in other nearby towns such as South Oxhey, Berkhamsted, and Aylesbury. We continued this prayer meeting and launched weeks of prayer and fasting, equipping nights and then the Evangelist’s Academy was born, through which we trained people and expanded missions and prayers across the town.

Impact: This had a great impact on our M16 Revival Team including solidifying relationships. After hosting prayer and intercession across the town, we made further in-roads and partnerships to work with local Church leaders as well as creating a launch pad for other initiatives.

May 2023

May 2023 Watford Mission:

On the 5th May we hosted another local mission in the heart of Watford, where the M16 Revival Foundation is based. We hosted an Evangelistic ministry named Tough Talk in the High St. We played Gospel Music; Tough Talk did a Weightlifting

presentation and shared stories about Jesus. **20 Evangelists** came together on the day to pray for the town and partner with us. We also had a live Worship band and many others shared testimonies. Many made responses to the Gospel and one man came forward with his family to receive Jesus at the end of the message.

Impact: These regular missions to the town, which we host 2-3 times a year, are causing a rippling effect of outreach across the town and Christians are starting to be mobilised for missions.

June 2023

CFAN Fire camp, London

We continue to partner with another Evangelistic Charity called Christ For All Nations (CFAN) in the UK. We joined the team for the London Fire camp UK where we had the opportunity to work alongside other CFAN Evangelists and train **80 new Evangelists** in preaching the Gospel. We saw **150 people make decisions to follow Jesus** over the two outreaches and 80 Evangelists trained and sent back to their Churches to make an impact. This CFAN week of training also gave M16 Revival the opportunity to partner for missions with other evangelists across the UK. The Firecamp was based in North London so we had the opportunity share Jesus in the Tottenham and Bruce Grove area.

Impact: One of our main priorities as a charity is to train evangelists; partnering with CFAN UK helps us to achieve this and to extend our impact to influence evangelists and missionaries from other towns and cities across the UK.

Equipping Nights Launch!

We launched our M16Revival Equipping nights in June 2023, where we hosted various speakers such as Evangelists Rodel Perez, Virginia Logan, Richard Bull, Jumoke Olumide and Nolan Runganathan. We had 15 people attending on Wednesday nights as we taught on prayer & intercession, consolidation, evangelism, faith and healing and other topics. June and July were months of initiating training and taking Evangelists deeper in their relationship with Jesus.

Impact: These equipping nights started to grow out of the prayer and intercession for Watford. The equipping nights helped us create a space where others could grow into their gifting and calling as evangelists and leaders. We saw new people start to join us as we pioneered these training nights. These were strategic in that it helped us create a base for missions.

July 2023

M16Revival Lead Evangelists Role

We officially employed Evangelist Kristian Lythe as our Lead Evangelist for M16Revival in July 2023, who takes up the role of developing evangelists and raising up teams as well as taking care of the day to day running of the ministry. We have arranged for HR, PAYE, bookkeeping and other services to go to be set up through a company called Connect Supply.

Mission Lebanon Report:

We sent Kristian Lythe on the 7th July to Beirut to spy out the land and to meet with Pastor Said Dib from the Life Centre and to find out how we can partner together for missions. Kristian stayed in the mountains on the outskirts of Beirut praying for Revival. The Life Centre is in the centre of Beirut and feeds thousands of refugees each month with food parcels and grains. On the Sunday Kristian preached the Gospel and many came forward to receive Jesus, including Muslims. The Life centre is having a great impact across Lebanon helping and serving so many people with the Gospel.

“As we prayed for the sick a lady testified immediately that her hip and body was pain free after 2 years of constant suffering. She even called the Pastors on Monday to testify how grateful she was to the Lord for healing her completely.” Testimony

- We took action points to:
 - Continue to pray for the doors of the Gospel to remain open in Beirut. There are many challenges in the country with the banking system and finances. Nevertheless, the Lord is moving and many are receiving Christ.
 - Continue to pray for Pastor Said and the family as they lead the Church.
 - Pray into the possibility of leading a retreat for evangelists in the future.

Impact: This was the first time M16Revival has visited Lebanon and the Middle East to find out what is happening for Missions. Kristian has known Pastor Said Dib for over 25 years and this mission gave us the opportunity to impact people we would have never had the opportunity to reach. We certainly looking at continuing to help the work in Lebanon in the years to come and raise awareness for others to go and help.

Revive Watford Evangelism Training Days:

On Friday 21st and Saturday 22nd July, we hosted another Revive Watford evangelism training where we hosted our first Revival Night with Evangelists Joshua Ziaina. On Saturday 22nd July we trained **40 evangelists in one-to-one evangelism** and hosted Children Can who inspired children on how to share the Gospel and they taught them a dance that they performed in the Revive Live Festival. We sent the delegates out to the town in the afternoon to preach the Gospel with people. CFAN evangelists Virginnia Logan and Jumoke Olumide also led sessions.

Impact: Local evangelism is something that we have on our heart and during 2023 we felt this was so important. This 2-day training helped us to release new people into evangelism and extend our impact across the town for the Gospel.

Revive Live Stage Truck & Festival

On Saturday 22nd July in the afternoon 12:00 - 16:00 we hosted our first live Stage Truck Gospel Outreach and Revive Live Festival with 7 Ministries & Churches. We hosted the event at the Pond in Watford. We had up to 100 people joining together to Worship Jesus in the town for over 4 hours in the rain. We had many different

evangelists preaching short Gospel messages during the day with Tobi Sanyaola and Dwaine Morgan leading the worship.

“One lady was shopping and she suddenly stopped as the Gospel was being preached. She started to weep and shake in the rain impacted by the power of God’s love. When the altar call was given, she walked all the way to the altar. She began to weep and shake as gave her heart to Jesus. We do it for the One, one person is so valuable to Jesus”

We saw 32 people that day pray to receive Jesus into their lives. There was 4 hours of worship, preaching and activities in the rain. This was our first stage truck event, and we thank God for all the He has done.

Impact: Launching the Revive Festival was a major victory for M16Revival as we seek to organise other events like these across the UK. Our team expanded as a result as we took on the challenge to be part of this faith venture. We had 5 Churches and 2 ministries from the town partner with us to preach the Gospel. Collaboration is so valuable in Gospel expansion.

August 2023

Equipping Nights:

On Wednesday 16th and 23rd August, we hosted Special Guests David Harris and David Chambers (Christ for All Nations) to minister to those who had been praying for Watford. We had 25 people in attendance as many encountered the Lord; it was so encouraging to see the group gel together.

Impact Report: The long term plan is to look at launching an Evangelist’s Academy for Evangelists including developing a place of worship where many can come together to encounter the Lord.

Impact Stories:

- A man who was arrested by the Holy Spirit in the rain and gave his life to Jesus while we preached the Gospel in Watford 1st May, was gloriously baptised at Garston Community Church during this time.
- A former Hindu who got radically saved in 2023 has been meeting up regularly for discipleship and is now attending church.
- We have seen over **50 recorded decisions** for Jesus over the last few months through the different events, training and services we have hosted.

September 2023

During the month of September, we hosted another equipping night on Intercession and Prayer at the Luther Blisset Centre and mobilised prayer and intercession for the month as we prepared to launch the Evangelist’s Academy.

October 2023:

CFAN Fire camp, Belfast Ireland

We had an opportunity from 2nd – 8th October to partner with Christ For All Nations UK for the Belfast Irish Firecamp. We trained **46 Evangelists** in Belfast and sent them out to preach the Gospel in different towns including the City Centre of Belfast. **Over 100 people were recorded as making a decision to follow Jesus** and were passed onto local churches for follow up. Some of the Evangelists that graduated the Irish Firecamp went on to study in the USA with CFAN to become CFAN Associate evangelists in Africa.

Impact: To impact future evangelists is what M16Revival is all about, seeing them get excited about the Gospel, becoming bolder and more confident about sharing Jesus with others.

Watford Mission with Tough Talk

On 14th October, we led our second missions outreach to Watford with special guests Tough Talk and partnered with the evangelists from the Evangelist's Academy. We saw 30 people join us on the streets for the outreach and **14 people made a documented decision to follow Jesus**. We launched our Follow Jesus coffee meet up and saw 7 people attend over a few weeks so we could make sure they were connected to a local church.

The New M16 Revival Evangelist's Academy Launch

We launched and ran the M16Revival Evangelist's Academy from October - November 2023 in Watford UK where we gathered Evangelists from different parts of the UK from as far as Bournemouth. The idea was to train new evangelists and to expand our reach across the UK and Ireland. The Academy was over 5 weeks that included 2 weekends and 5 Friday Nights. We had 33 registrations, and **27 Evangelists** made it to graduation on 10th November. Over the 5 weeks, we launched 20 outreach missions as students were asked to pioneer a local mission somewhere in the UK. We saw many of them become bolder and more confident about preaching the Gospel, grow in their leadership and pioneer a mission for the first time.

Impact Report: The launch of the academy was one of the highlights of 2023 as we endeavoured to take what we have been doing at the Evangelists Conference and turn it into a bit of a mentoring program for Evangelists who would like to go deeper. We now have a group of 27 evangelists who are part of M16Revival and are open to collaborate and work together across the UK.

December 2023

On 2nd December we held another Revive London Evangelism Training Day in Harvest Church Wembley where we had over 100 people gather to be trained in Evangelism.

We sent teams into different locations preaching the Gospel. Harvest Church, Wembley has become a base for M16Revival and their team has helped us move forward in the evangelistic vision God has given us.

We hit 12 locations with the Gospel of Jesus Christ including Baker Street, Oxford Street, London Bridge, Camden, Wembley Park, Harrow, Willesden, Kingsbury and few others.

Impact Stories:

- **100 Evangelists sent across London**
- 7 sound systems used over 2 hours of outreach
- Over 100 conversations
- **23 documented decisions for Jesus**

Baker Street Team

- One man was weeping receiving prayers when the team preached on the train.
- An Indian man got convicted on the train and gave his heart to Jesus.

London Bridge Team

- A man in London Bridge gave his life to Jesus and texted one of the evangelists on social media of how powerfully he was touched by her prayers.
- London Bridge Team had a Praise Party on the streets before preaching, dancing along to Eddie James and other worship songs. A crowd gathered to listen, and the Gospel was preached with power.
- One evangelist reported, “The amount of people we met today that said ‘I needed this today’ was more than normal. London needs the Gospel.”

Oxford St / Soho Team

- The team heading to Oxford St shared the Gospel on the train. One boy was wearing his earphones; he unplugged them and one of the team shared the Gospel with him. He said he was catholic, and he was about to do something bad with his friends. He repented after hearing the Gospel and received Jesus. The team took his contact details for follow up.
- The Team arrived in Soho and got into some debates then another team member stopped a man who testified he was backslidden. Since given his life to Jesus he had been going through a tough time and had backslid due to sleeping around. The team share the Gospel, and he dedicated his life to Jesus.

Camden Team

- One of the Evangelists going to Camden shared:

“My first time ministering at Camden Town yesterday. I was unsettled at first, but God took over & stepped in. The people were open to the good news & a few came up to listen, asked questions, some asked for prayers & we sowed the seeds. What a joy to share the love of Christ with others. I stepped out of my comfort zone. Glory be to God in the highest”

January 2024

From 10th – 24th January we launched 10 days of Prayer and Fasting for the year with different team members ministering online. This was so effective as it helped release team members to lead prayers and to have an opportunity to teach and preach.

February 2024

On the 4th February, we launched our Sunday Team Gatherings called the BASE. The vision of the gatherings is to gather evangelists and our team members from all over the country that are connected to the vision, to fellowship and build a sense of team. We invited guest evangelists and teachers to come together and minister to our team. February was a month of building up and encouraging our team for the next steps this year. We planned to continue these through the year to keep building stronger connections together.

March 2024

The New Revive London Conference Launch

The Revive London Conference was launched in March 2024 at Capstone Church, East London. We had been hosting one-day evangelism trainings called Revive London and decided to extend this for the 1st time to a 3-day event. **174 attended** the 3 days, from around the UK, some as far as Aberdeen, Scotland. We released evangelists and their teams to hit 16 stations with the Gospel of Jesus Christ on the Elizabeth Line from Ilford to Tottenham Court Road. We saw many people receive Jesus and many others rise up boldly to declare their faith.

During this conference, we launched the Vision called Operation 100, where we set a goal in 2024 to reach 100 tube stations with the Gospel by having preaching, worship, public prayer for the sick, and one to one evangelism at each station. We launched new a WhatsApp group with 50 evangelists agreeing to collaborate to reach London. Operation 100 has become such a key cog in the wheel of M16Revival as we aim to train and release evangelists across London. **60 Souls** made a documented decision to follow Jesus during the many outreaches we organised for the Revive London Conference.

Impact Report: Operation 100 has revolutionised the way we are training evangelists through our conferences, Revive London and the Evangelist's Academy. We are now solely focused on releasing new evangelists into the field of London, to reach more stations until every station is reached with the Gospel. The next phase to this will be collaborating with existing churches who have a heart to have a presence at a station so we can maximise the follow up process.

Conclusion

This year we saw the advance of the Gospel across London especially in Wembley, Watford and Ilford as well as spreading the Gospel to 28 different London stations. We accelerated in the training part of our vision with the launch of the Evangelist's Academy. We launched the M16 Revival Base, which serves to strengthen our team and connection with evangelists across the UK each week. We have seen new evangelists released and trained across the UK and London as the Gospel continues to advance through M16Revival. We launched a new conference in the heart of East London called Revive London and this conference caused us to birth Operation 100 where we have regular teams hitting London Tube stations with prayer, worship and sharing Jesus each month. As we look to the next year, we will be aiming to grow the M16 Revival Base and see where this new venture will take us and establish the Evangelist's Academy as a major training resource for new grassroots evangelists. We pioneered our first spy out missions to other countries and have a plan to re-visit Lebanon. We have a long-term aim to launch a mission and a crusade in the heart of Africa with Christ for All Nations.

Facts, Figures and Goals Achieved from April 2023 – May 2024

During this period, we:

- Trained and impacted over 500 Evangelists
- Led Missions to 28 different locations
- Launched our first Evangelist's Academy in Watford, graduating 27 Evangelists
- Launched our first Mission to Lebanon
- Launched our first Revive London Conference in Ilford
- Launched our first Revive London Evangelism Training Day in Wembley
- Launched a new initiative called Operation 100 to reach London Tube stations
- Hundreds of souls responded on the streets of the UK in partnership with local churches, conferences and other projects we initiated
- Partnered with CFAN at the Fire Camps where we helped mentor 120 Evangelists.

In planning the activities, the Trustees have applied the guidance on public benefit issued by the Charity Commission.

REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES
FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 APRIL 2023

The Trustees have pleasure in submitting the Report and Accounts for the year ended 30 April 2023.

Objects of the charity

The charity is governed by a constitution and is constituted as a charitable incorporated organisation. The object of the CIO is, for the public benefit, to advance the Christian faith in such ways as the Charity Trustees may from time to time decide.

Our purpose statement at the M16 Revival Foundation: 'To Revive the Great Commission'.

Review of the charity's main activities and achievements

To further the above objects and vision, the charity's main activities and achievements were as follows:

April 2022 Watford Mission

On the 25th April we hosted our first local mission in the heart of Watford, where the M16 Revival Foundation is based. We hosted an Evangelistic ministry named Tough Talk in the High St. We played Gospel Music; Tough Talk did a Weightlifting presentation and shared stories about Jesus. 20 Evangelists came together on the day to pray for the town and we hosted our first evangelism workshop in the Blessed Radio Station. 12 made a decision to follow Jesus and were followed up through local Churches. We now have a team of 20 people who are willing to run further missions locally and to spread to other local towns. After the mission we invited and hosted families for the M16 Revival Family BBQ on Sunday 1st May @ 2pm. This was a great opportunity for those who had responded to the Gospel on the streets to attend their first gathering where they could connect with the team and other believers.

June 2022

CFAN Fire camp, Norwich

Our East journey continued with being invited to partner with CFAN in the first Evangelists Fire camp in the UK. We had the opportunity to work alongside other CFAN Evangelists and trained 80 Evangelists in preaching the Gospel. We saw 300 people make a decision to follow Jesus over the two outreaches and Churches were stirred across the city of Norwich. This week of training also gave M16 Revival the opportunity to partner for missions with other evangelists across the UK.

M16 Revival Conference Woolwich

M16 Revival Foundation hosted its second Evangelists Conference in Woolwich UK on June 24-26, 2022. The Conference was hosted by Evangelists Kristian & Toyin Lythe and we had special guest evangelists, Andrew Cannon (Gospel Grenades), Reuban Morley (BGEA), Dominic Leo Muir (Now Believe), David Chambers (CFAN) and Ian McDowall (UK) who taught and inspired people. 207 Evangelists attended, were trained and sent out onto the streets of Woolwich, London to preach the Gospel. We saw 120 people make a documented decision for Jesus Christ, and each received a follow up booklet. Evangelists were anointed and sent back to their towns and villages to preach the Gospel. The long-term aim is to launch and multiply missions to other local towns in the UK and across London.

Watford Blessed Radio Rent-29th June

We launched the Watford Prayer Hour at the Blessed Radio Venue in Watford High Street, gathering Christians from across Watford to pray for Revival in the UK, 15 different people gathering for prayer, revival and sharing the Gospel on the streets.

July 2022 4th - 12th Kenya Mission- Conference

In July 2022 we partnered with Evangelist Samuel Ngungu for a Youth Fire Conference in Nairobi, Kenya. This was our first spy out mission as we sent Kristian Lythe to prepare the way for a possible Gospel crusade in the years to come. During the time there, we met with local pastors, preached the Gospel on trucks and prayed for many souls to be saved. On the Sunday Kristian Lythe preached and ministered with Evangelist Samuel at Kahawa West PEFA Church in Nairobi. Prayer went out for the Church to be stirred, souls to be saved and many responded to the call of Evangelism in Nairobi. In one Church after the conference, young people were crying out to God for the lost and for revival. Something of revival has been birthed in the hearts of the young people and there is a hunger to arrange more outreaches in the future. We also linked with the local CFAN representative to discuss children's material and Youth Crusades.

August 2022 Watford Month of Mission

From August 7th – September 7th, we hosted one whole month of outreaches in Watford doing local evangelism and mobilising Churches to preach the Gospel and to share the love of Jesus. We met with pastors from different denominations encouraging them to sign up for the Revive Watford Evangelism Training and missions we're hosting. Throughout August we hosted 10 Evangelists from all over London who came to Watford to preach the Gospel, we met with 5 Church leaders who encouraged us and agreed to participate in future training event. During the month we saw 30 documented decisions for Jesus Christ to whom we sent follow up materials to and linked with local Churches.

August 2022 Jesus at the Door – Wembley

During August we also partnered with CFAN UK in hosting and organising Jesus at the door ONE TO ONE evangelism trainings in London Ilford and London Wembley from 17-19 August in Wembley and 24-26 August in Ilford. During the 6 days of training, we saw 150 documented decisions for Jesus Christ and trained over 50 new evangelists in one-to-one evangelism.

September 2022 Revive Watford

After investing one month of Evangelism and four months of Prayer & Fasting for Revival in the Town, we decided to launch our first Evangelistic Event called "Revive Watford" to encourage the 5 Churches to bring the lost and those who needed to hear the message of the Gospel. It was a powerful night with 50 people in attendance, 10 young people were weeping in God's presence, surrendering to Jesus. Evangelist Joshua Ziaina shared his story about having an encounter with Jesus as a Muslim. One Hindu man fell to the ground during the prayer time. When he got up from the floor, a team member shared the Gospel with him and he gave his life to Jesus. Later he flew to India to ask forgiveness from his ex-wife and to share the Gospel with her.

Impact: This event had a great impact on building a team for M16 Revival and after hosting our first event we now have a solid group of volunteers who are willing to preach the Gospel locally and serve at our events.

October 2022 Watford Mission

On the 1st – 10th October we launched another 10 days mission into the heart of Watford Town hosting a number of evangelists who came to preach the Gospel. One notable person giving his life to Jesus was a man from India. He was a Hindu, he was searching for Jesus and was asking Jesus for a job. His friend was a Christian and he saw Jesus providing for his friend. He needed a job so he decided to pray to Jesus. He also told Jesus he was a Hindu and he couldn't make him Lord of his life. This is when he met Evangelist Kristian. Kristian shared the Gospel and he decided to surrender his life to Jesus. He now meets up with Christians regularly and wants to get baptised. Over the 10 days we saw 7 decisions for Jesus and 15 people mobilised for street outreach.

Impact: These ten days created another impact in the town amongst believers and we had opportunities to meet other local pastors for breakfasts, coffee chats and to encourage them towards sharing the Gospel.

November 2022 Leicester Mission

On November 19th – 20th we took a team of 15 people to Leicester to preach the Gospel, hosting our first national mission. We saw 30 documented decisions for Jesus over the weekend; each person receiving follow up material. Half of the Church, 25 people, responded to the altar call to surrender their life to Jesus and many were set free, including, a Muslim lady whose husband was invited the day before. After the mission was finished, we saw 3 other Evangelists preaching across Leicester for a whole week, seeing more people respond to Jesus Christ.

Story: A lady suffering from two months of pain and swelling in her arm was healed. Another lady who had a frozen arm and couldn't lift it, after prayers was able to lift it above her head and swing her arm around. People received the Holy Spirit and fell under the power of God and others were on their knees weeping. A man who bought an M16 Revival T-shirt, received a prophetic word and he began to weep in tears. The aim is to set up a mission's location in the heart of Leicester in 2023-2024.

December 2022

Revive Watford Evangelism Training Launch

We hosted our first Evangelism Training Day called Revive Watford on Saturday 3rd Dec with special guests Reuban Morley (BGEA) and Virginia Logan (CFAN). We had 50 people join; we sent these Evangelists to hit the streets with the Gospel in the afternoon. The building we used was packed and immediately as the team left for the streets, we saw an Evangelist leading a lady to Jesus Christ right outside the door of the venue. The Evangelists blitzed the streets and saw 10 documented decisions for Jesus Christ including young people who were not ashamed to pray on the streets calling on the name of Jesus.

CFAN Fire camp, Cardiff

After this on 4th-12th Dec, we participated in the CFAN Firecamp in Wales, UK where we partnered with CFAN to train 70 evangelists for 8 days and to send them out to preach the Gospel. During the 8 days we saw over 200 documented decisions for Jesus who received follow up materials. We now have the opportunity to partner and help mentor these evangelists for missions.

March 2023

After the success of our first two M16 Revival Evangelists Conferences in 2022, we decided to continue this strategy of gathering evangelists in March 2023 in Wembley, UK. Following 222 pre-registrations, we gathered 250 people including team members at the Leadership Training Centre in Wembley over the course of 3 days. The Conference was hosted by Evangelists Kristian & Toyin Lythe and we had special guest evangelists such as Daniel Chand (Walking like Jesus Ministries), Reuban Morley (BGEA), Dominic Leo Muir (Now Believe), David Chambers (CFAN) and Ian McDowall (Tough Talk) and Virginia Logan (CFAN) who taught on revival and evangelism. We released the delegates to the streets to share the Gospel and 54 people responded to the Gospel and were given booklets about following Jesus. Fifteen of the people who responded on the streets went on to attend the local Church- Harvest Church. The teams preached at bus stops, by walls, on platforms outside the station and restaurants. This time we saw queues of evangelists waiting to preach the Gospel publicly as many stopped to listen to this radical approach to evangelism. Alongside the conference we had a children's evangelism workshop on the Saturday where we saw 23 children trained in evangelism. Each of the children, the workers and the parents hit the streets seeing the children perform a dance, share the Gospel one on one and pray for the sick. This was one of the highlights seeing children preach publicly for the first time and see them pray for people to be healed in the streets.

Other major news and developments during this time:

- M16 Revival equipment purchase for events
- M16 Revival equipment purchased for street outreaches
- M16 Revival Facebook and Instagram developments
- RightNow media online platform to help disciple our followers
- Early morning Prayer Meetings and Equipping Nights for the Team.

Conclusion

This year we saw the advance of the Gospel across Watford, (our local town) where M16 Revival is based, preaching some sixty times on the streets of the town and mobilising Evangelists from across the UK. As well as local evangelism we have continued to pioneer works in Leicester and to gather five hundred Evangelists from the UK to be trained and encouraged at our conferences. The impact of these conferences has been amazing as we have sent people back to their towns and cities to do the same. The M16 Revival team has continued to build this year and we are seeing leaders join the team who are serving well at our conferences and events. As we look to the next year, we will be aiming to plant a mission's base where M16 Revival can grow further and establish a full training evangelism academy for Evangelists in the UK. We also pioneered our first spy out mission and ministry to Kenya and in 2023/2024 we hope to pioneer our first Crusade, and take a team there in the future.

Facts, Figures and Goals Achieved from April 2022 – May 2023:

- During this period, we trained and impacted over 500 Evangelists
- Led Missions to 10 different locations
- Launched our first international Mission to Kenya
- Launched our first Revive Watford Evangelism Training Day for churches across Watford.
- Hundreds of Souls responded on the streets of the U.K in partnership with local Churches.
- New partnerships in Bournemouth, Watford, Newcastle, Wales, Aberdeen for missions.
- Partnered with CFAN at the Fire camps where we helped mentor 120 Evangelists.

In planning the activities the Trustees have applied the guidance on public benefit issued by the Charity Commission.

Financial review

During the year income decreased by £3,820, to £36,080, and expenditure increased by £23,650, to £34,890. As a result the cash held by the charity increased by £1,190, to £43,850, of which £43,190 is unrestricted and can be used for any charitable purpose.

Reserves policy

The trustees have determined that the charity should aim to hold unrestricted cash of no less than £11,000 (which equates to about 4 months of unrestricted expenditure) so that the charity could continue to operate should income and / or expenditure vary adversely. At the year end, the charity held unrestricted cash of £43,190 and the charity is complying with its reserves policy.

Governance

Responsibility for setting policy and for making operating decisions rest with the trustees who meet regularly to monitor the activities of the charity. New trustees (who are members) are recruited and appointed by the existing trustees.

Responsibilities of trustees

Charity law requires us as Trustees to prepare financial statements for each accounting year which record the receipts and payments of the charity for the year.

We are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charity and enable us to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Charities Act 2011.

The Trustees have pleasure in submitting the Report and Accounts for the year ended 30 April 2022.

Objects of the charity

The charity is governed by a constitution and is constituted as a charitable incorporated organisation. The object of the CIO is, for the public benefit, to advance the Christian faith in such ways as the Charity Trustees may from time to time decide.

Our purpose statement at the M16 Revival Foundation: 'To Revive the Great Commission'.

Review of the charity's main activities and achievements

To further the above objects and vision, the charity's main activities and achievements were as follows:

May-21

Blackpool Mission

We launched our first M16 Revival Missions Team to Blackpool to participate in a public proclamation of the Gospel event on the streets with Pastor Adam Lee of the Cleveleys Elim Church. The team was led by Evangelist Kristian Lythe and they participated in preaching the Gospel on the streets, team prayers, handing out literature and ministering to the local church members on the Sunday morning. The aim is to launch M16 Revival Missions to other local towns in the surrounding areas.

These M16 Revival Missions were public and our aim was to do more in other locations but churches were slowly recovering from the impact of Covid 19.

Mar-22

M16 Revival Foundation Public Launch- The M16 Revival Evangelists Conference 24-26 March 2022

In March 2022 we launched the M16 Revival Foundation publicly by organising and hosting our first Evangelists Conference in the heart of Wembley, London. We gathered 250 people at the Leadership Training Centre in Wembley over the course of three days and raised over £20,000. The Conference was hosted by Evangelists Kristian & Toyin Lythe and we had special guest evangelists such as Andrew Cannon (Gospel Grenades), Reuban Morley (BGEA), Dominic Leo Muir (Now Believe), David Chambers (CFAN) and Ian McDowall (UK) who taught on revival and evangelism. This was very successful for our first public gathering and many people gave one off gifts online and signed up to become monthly partners.

We released 200 evangelists to the streets to share the Gospel and 75 people responded to the Gospel and were given booklets about following Jesus. Due to the success of this conference we developed relationships with other Pastors & Evangelists across the UK to set up missions and training where they live. We also set in motion plans for another Evangelists Conference in South London for June 2022.

Apr-22

First Watford Mission

On the 25th April we hosted our first mission in the heart of Watford, where the M16 Revival Foundation is based. We hosted an evangelistic ministry called Tough Talk in the High St. As we played Gospel Music, Tough Talk did a Weightlifting presentation and shared Jesus Stories. 20 Evangelists came together on the day to pray for the town and we hosted our first evangelism workshop in the Blessed Radio Station. 12 people made a decision to follow Jesus and are being followed up through local churches. We now have a team of 20 people who are willing to run further missions locally and to spread to other local towns.

Other major news and developments during this time were as follows:

- M16 Revival Website
- M16 Revival Facebook and Instagram pages
- Site Visits & Pastors Meetings for the Next Evangelists Conference June 2022.
- Evangelists Conference Planning Meetings.

Conclusion

The public launch of our First Evangelists Conference in Wembley London was very successful for us at the M16 Revival Foundation. We now have 250 Evangelists and 15 Churches that we have connected with nationally and who are engaging with our charity. We have 20 Evangelists across Watford and the surrounding towns to set up missions and training for the future. Despite some lockdown restrictions and churches coming slowly out of any remaining challenges, we still managed to launch publicly in 2022. It was a year of firsts: our first UK Mission to Blackpool, our first Evangelists Conference, our first Watford Mission and our First Watford Gathering.

In planning the activities the Trustees have applied the guidance on public benefit issued by the Charity Commission.

Financial review

During the year income increased by £24,700, to £39,900, and expenditure increased by £10,000, to £11,200. As a result the cash held by the charity increased by £14,000, to £42,700, of which £42,000 is unrestricted and can be used for any charitable purpose.

The charity is governed by a constitution and is constituted as a charitable incorporated organisation. The object of the CIO is, for the public benefit, to advance the Christian faith in such ways as the Charity Trustees may from time to time decide.

Our purpose statement at the M16 Revival Foundation: 'To Revive the Great Commission'.

Summary of the charity's main activities and achievements

To further the above objects and vision, the charity's main activities and achievements were as follows:

June 2020

100 days of Prayer & Fasting

We launched a series of 100 days of prayer and fasting and prayer training to train people in effective prayer. Through this initiative we had up to 50 people joining us for prayers for different parts of the UK and we started to make in roads in to new areas of the UK as a result of connecting with other charities and ministries across the UK. After this season of prayer and fasting which we continued until 250 days. This started in June 2020 and concluded in March 2021.

These gatherings were online due to the impact of Covid 19 otherwise these gatherings would have been in a public venue.

July 2020

The Evangelists Lockdown Conversations

The Evangelists Lockdown Conversations began where we gathered 14 different evangelists online to talk about the challenges we were facing during the lockdown and to equip each other with effective ideas and strategies to reach out to people in the nation with the gospel of Jesus Christ. This helped us to connect with other evangelists and charities who have a similar heart and vision as we do.

These gatherings were online due to the impact of Covid 19 otherwise these gatherings would have been in a public venue.

August 2020

M16 Revival HEALTH Event - Toyin & GB

We hosted an event online for NHS workers and doctors during the lockdown to support them through the challenges they were facing. We prayed with many of them and discussed some of the current challenges and future challenges that they may face during the lockdown. There were 30 NHS workers who tuned in online, we encouraged them to share the gospel and to focus on Jesus throughout this challenging time. The Event was hosted by our team Dr Toyin Lythe and Dr Abosede Ajayi.

Kings Lynn Mission

We took a Missions Team to Kings Lynn to participate in a public proclamation of the Gospel event with Evangelist Dominic Leo Muir from Now Believe and Jesus Fields. A team of 8 of us went up to the town of Kings Lynn and saw many people respond to the gospel on the streets of Kings Lynn. We also had a chance to meet with other people from across the UK.

St Peters, Broadstairs Mission

We took a Missions team of 10 to St Peters, Broadstairs where we connected as a team and inspired the church in evangelism. We saw a few people respond to the gospel as we linked with Pastor Alan Osborn from the local Elim Church.

October 2020

Africa Appeal for Burkina Faso

We raised funds on the Stewardship fundraising platform in October – November 2020 to distribute food grains in Burkina Faso with Pastor Osakue and Maria Akioya. We raised over £500 for this project. The project was put on hold as we were waiting for Pastor Osakue to establish a charity account. The amount is held in restricted funds until this matter is resolved.

January 2021

M16 Revival Foundation Online Launch

We officially launched the charity in January 29-31, 2021 with an online launch due to the impact of lockdown and the limitations introduced on most public gatherings in churches and charities across the UK.

We gathered 200 people online over the course of three days and raised over £5000. We had special guests such as Robert Liardon (USA), Marilyn Harry (Wales) and Ian McDowall (UK) who taught on revival and evangelism. This was a very successful first gathering and many people gave one off gifts and signed up to become monthly partners.

Other major news and developments during this time were as follows: M16 Revival Website, Facebook and Instagram pages.

Conclusion

This launch period has been challenging but successful for us at the M16 Revival Foundation. We now have 200 people that are engaging with our charity through the launch phase, plus 14 Evangelists across the UK for future partnership through our evangelists' conversation and 30 NHS workers we can continue to support through our charity objectives. Despite the lockdown restrictions on gatherings, we still managed to have some small team missions to different parts of the UK to spread the gospel.

In planning the activities the Trustees have applied the guidance on public benefit issued by the Charity Commission.

Reserves policy

This is the first year of operation and the trustees do not yet have a reserves policy. They are aiming to have a policy in place very soon.

Governance

Responsibility for setting policy and for making operating decisions rest with the trustees who meet regularly to monitor the activities of the charity. New trustees (who are members) are recruited and appointed by the existing trustees.

Responsibilities of trustees

Charity law requires us as Trustees to prepare financial statements for each accounting year which record the receipts and payments of the charity for the year.

We are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charity and enable us to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Charities Act 2011.

We also have a responsibility to safeguard the assets of the charity and to take reasonable steps to prevent fraud or any other irregularities.
