### **Objectives and Activities**

Kettering Foodbank exists because no one should go hungry. We provide people with food and basic household items in a time of crisis and help to identify and resolve the underlying issues that cause them to fall into food poverty and to help prevent food waste by collecting short/out of date items from supermarkets.

To ensure we best serve our customers and supporters, Kettering Foodbank tracks usage of donations, this allows us to best allocate resources and help individuals become less dependant on using foodbanks.

### **Achievements and Performance**

At the start of 2025 we experienced the usual increase in demand for our services in January/February. We continue to do all assessments over the phone making it easier for those in the surrounding area and those with mobility problems to access our services. With Foodbanks very much in the news this year this has raised awareness of our needs leading to very generous financial donations from Businesses, Community Groups and Churches as well as tremendous support from individuals within the general public. Apart from Harvest Festival and Christmas, non perishable donations have gone down and we spent a total of £56,356.76 re-stocking essential food and household items and £2,340.00 on our annual subscription to FareShare. We received HSF Government grants in 2025 totalling £55,125. with grants from Local councils of £4,500. We have seen a reduction in the number people who were food bank dependant with most of our recipients now being new to the food bank although we often have to support over several weeks, demand is up on last year. We replaced our old van this year at a cost of £20,000. which we use to collect "Short and Out of Date" items from three local Super Markets on four days a week that we distribute on a "Help yourself" basis as part of our avoiding food waste commitment. With referrals from agencies, carers and even schools increasing plus we now supply the "Rough Sleepers" team with items. This now requires two people on the phones collecting client information in order to provide the best possible service. We have taken on more part time volunteers in order to keep up with the work load especially as we work towards finding lasting solutions rather than just sticking a plaster on the problem. Due to the generosity of especially business donors in the run up to Christmas and a local community drive we ended 2025 with good stock levels and financial income exceeding outgoings by £11,973.04 although this is well down on 2024 we are still in a strong position to continue meeting the needs of those in a crisis of food poverty in Kettering and surrounding area in the future.

## Financial Review

The trustees decided that an audit of the accounts was not required and that an independent review be carried out.

The total income for the accounting period was £120,676. of which £59,625. was in grants, with outgoings of £108,703.

The closing bank balance as of 31/12.2024 was £157,644. With £100,000. in a reserve fund, the foodbank is in a secure position to continue to serve those in food poverty in the future.



Kettering Foodbank exists because no one should go hungry. We provide people with food and basic items in a time of crisis and help to identify and resolve the underlying issues that cause them to fall into food poverty and to help prevent food waste by collecting short/out of date items from supermarkets.

To ensure we best serve our customers and supporters, Kettering Foodbank tracks usage donations, this allows us to best allocate resources and help individuals become less dependant on using foodbanks.

### Achievements and Performance

At the start of 2024 we experienced the usual increase in demand for our services in January/February. We continue to do all assessments over the phone making it easier for those in the surrounding area and those with mobility problems to access our services. With Foodbanks very much in the news this year this has raised awareness of our needs leading to very generous financial donations from Businesses, Community Groups and Churches as well as tremendous support from individuals within the general public. Apart from Harvest Festival and Christmas non perishable donation have gone down and we spent a total of £41,425.84 re-stocking essential food items and £2,288.00 on our annual subscription to FareShare. We received a grant from the Household Support Fund at the beginning of 2024 with one of the conditions of the grant being that some clients had to work with Citizens Advice to try and resolve their long term problems. This has resulted in a reduction in the number people who were food bank dependant, most of our recipients now being new to the food bank, with the demand now being slightly down on last year. With referrals from agencies, carers and even schools increasing we are spending more time on the phone collecting information in order to provide the best possible service. We have taken on more part time volunteers in order to keep up with the work load especially as we work towards finding lasting solutions rather than just sticking a plaster on it. Due to the generosity of donors and a big local community drive we ended 2024 with good stock levels and financial income exceeding outgoings by £57,679.37 putting us in a strong position to continue meeting the needs of those in a crisis of food poverty in Kettering and surrounding area in the future.

## Financial Review

The trustees decided that an audit of the accounts was not required and that an independent review be carried out.

The total income for the accounting period was £133,659.03 of which £60,094.00 was in grants, with outgoings of £75,979.66.

The closing bank balance as of 31/12.2024 was £245,671.23 leaving the foodbank in a secure position to continue to serve those in food poverty in the future.



We provide people with food and basic items in a time of crisis and help to identify and resolve the underlying issues that cause them to fall into food poverty and to help prevent food waste by collecting short/out of date items from supermarkets.

To ensure we best serve our customers and supporters, Kettering Foodbank tracks usage donations, this allows us to best allocate resources and help individuals become less dependant on using foodbanks.

### **Achievements and Performance**

At the start of 2023 we experienced a continued increase in demand for our services, this was in part due to the continued increase in the cost of living situation and the knock on effects of lockdown. We continued doing all assessments over the phone opening us up to a wider clientele resulting in a big increase in demand from outlying villages and those with mobility problems meaning an increase in the need to deliver parcels to the door step. With Foodbanks very much in the news this year this has raised awareness of our needs leading to very generous financial donations from Businesses, Community Groups and Churches and non perishable food items especially at Harvest Festival and Christmas. We have also had tremendous support from individuals within the general public and a local Taxi firm donating free taxis, never the less we spent a total of £26,927.73 re-stocking essential food items and £1,820.00 on our annual subscription to FareShare. Due to the steady increase in demand over the year, ending in an increase of 65% above the same period in 2022 and many more households having to be supported over a longer period. With referrals from agencies, carers and even schools increasing we have taken on more volunteers in order to keep up with demand especially in December when we struggled often having to carry requests over to the following day.

Due to the overwhelming generosity of donors and a big local community drive we ended a very busy 2023 with good stock levels and financial income exceeding outgoings by £48,736.71 putting us in a strong position to continue meeting the needs of those in food poverty in Kettering and surrounding area in the future

## Financial Review

The trustees decided that an audit of the accounts was not required and that an independent review be carried out.

The total income for the accounting period was £103,812.83 of which £6,055.00 was in grants, with outgoings of £55,076.21.

The closing bank balance as of 31/12.2023 was £187,991.85. leaving the foodbank in a secure position to continue to serve those in food poverty in the future.



Due to the overwhelming generosity of donors we ended a very busy 2022 with good stock levels and financial income exceeding outgoings by £70,714.42. putting us in a strong position to continue meeting the needs of those in food poverty in Kettering and surrounding area in the future

The trustees decided that an audit of the accounts was not required and that an independent review be carried out.

The total income for the accounting period was £101,137.35 of which £3,860.00 was in grants, with outgoings of £30,423.15.





Foodbanks have very much been in the news and this has raised awareness of our needs resulting in generous donations from Schools, Clubs, Businesses, Community Groups and Churches especially at Harvest Festival and Christmas. We also have tremendous support from the general public, never the less we spent £5,452.08 re-stocking essential items and £1,560.00 annual subscription to FareShare. There has been a three fold increase in demand over the year and many more referrals from agencies and carers resulting in the need to call on more volunteers in order to keep up with the demand. We ended a very busy 2021 with good stock levels and financial income exceeding outgoings by £24,105.33. putting us in a strong position to continue meeting the needs of those in food poverty in Kettering and surrounding area.

### **Financial Review**

The trustees decided that an audit of the accounts was not required and that an independent review be carried out.

The total income for the accounting period was £50,211.84 of which £3,000. was in grants, with outgoings of £26,106.51.

The closing bank balance as of 31/12.2021 was £68,907.01 leaving the foodbank in a secure position to continue to serve those in food poverty in the future.
