Achievements and Performance of Trust

The Club has increased from 250 members to 430 with teams increasing from 21 to 42 providing association football to all.

We continue to be a Central Venue for Mini Soccer and Pinpoint Recruitment League have operated their Saturday league from our venue.

Teams taking part in regular football range from 4 (Academy) to 17 and we now host walking football, have a Senior Team and Over 40's.

We have again renewed and maintained the Charter Standard with Northumberland Football Association. Our 3G pitch continues to be successful and this year we completed the works for our newly refurbished clubhouse.
