Rise Heritage Foundation was registered on 3rd of June 2020, in the middle of the Covid-19 pandemic and this affected our fund-raising activities due to the severe restrictions.

During this time, we put in various applications for funding in order to raise funds for future activities to achieve our objectives which were unfortunately not successful.

During the period of December 2020 one of the trustees also managed to visit Kibera slums and Rarieda area in Kenya on a fact-finding mission which was important in assessing the level of vulnerable children and young people needs in Kenya.


