During 2022 Rise Heritage Foundation continued raising funds towards supporting its objectives. Through monthly donation from give as you earn scheme run by employers who allow their employees to have a small deduction to go to charities through Charities Trust organisation; we raised 919 GBP.

From the previous year visit to Kibera Slums, one of the largest slums in Africa in Kenya, we identified three children in the following schools;

Brainstorm Junior children centre

Child sponsored: Aileen Akinyi Juma

St George Orthodox Community School Kibra

Child Sponsored: Liana Akinyi

Little Rock ECD centre

Child sponsored: Wilson Odhiambo

The three children come from a poor background and had chronic diseases that also made them very vulnerable. Given the hardship of living in informal settlement we felt supporting their education by providing school fees would help secure their future. Funds were sent electronically to the school towards fees arrears for the three.


