Annual Report 2024

Financial Year

This Annual Report covers the period from 1 January 2024 to 31 December 2024.

Activities Undertaken

The Patchetts Green Bridleways Trust CIO (registered charity 1189953) was formed as a Charitable Incorporated Organisation based on the foundation model constitution on 15 June 2020. The charity is also known as the 'Patchetts Green Bridleways Trust' or 'PGBT'.

The trustees of the CIO are also the trustees of the Patchetts Green Bridleways Trust unincorporated charity (number 1109497). Both charities are legally in operation awaiting the transfer of the assets, liabilities and operations of the unincorporated charity to the CIO

and subsequent closure of the unincorporated charity. At the start of the financial period, 1 January 2024, the transfer of activities and most of the transfer of assets had taken place.

The Trust continued to receive contributions from the British Horse Society towards its costs in making definitive map modification order applications to get paths recorded by the deadline of 1 January 2031. Money was placed on deposit to fund work on cases should they need to go to public inquiry.

Main Achievements

The main achievement for the year was that creation agreement for Stevenage 118 bridleway came into effect in June 2023, following the provision of expertise and assistance to Stevenage Borough Council. This established the link between two existing parts of the Stevenage Horse and Pony Route as a public bridleway. resolved two discontinuities in the depiction of the route on the definitive map, and helped get walkers, riders and cyclists off the busy Gresley Way. We were pleased when the Mayor of Stevenage arrived for the official opening on his bicycle.

We were pleased to have helped in the recording of five equestrian routes in Hertfordshire. Wash Lane was confirmed as South Mimms 81 byway, once the final objection was withdrawn. Kelshall 18 byway, Kelshall 21 byway and Kelshall 22 bridleway were confirmed in December 2024. The applications had been made in 2010. Walkern 8B bridleway was upgraded to restricted byway following our application in 2017.

We supported the British Horse Society's application to record a route through Broxbourne Woods as a bridleway, including attending the public inquiry. The application was confirmed largely though the provision of user evidence.

In Hertsmeire, we were pleased when the Borough Council made a conditional deed of dedication (which we had drafted) so that when Shenley 3 footpath is diverted it is upgraded to bridleway.

Section 4 of the Charities Act 2006 requires the trustees to have regard to guidance published by the Charity Commission. The trustees confirm that they have had such regard during the reporting period.

The Patchetts Green Bridleways Trust CIO (registered charity 1189953) was formed as a Charitable Incorporated Organisation based on the foundation model constitution on 15 June 2020. The charity is also known as the 'Patchetts Green Bridleways Trust' or 'PGBT'.

The trustees of the CIO are also the trustees of the Patchetts Green Bridleways Trust unincorporated charity (number 1109497). Both charities are legally in operation awaiting

the transfer of the assets, liabilities and operations of the unincorporated charity to the CIO and subsequent closure of the unincorporated charity. At the start of the financial period, 1 January 2023, only the transfer of activities had taken place, but good progress with asset transfer took place during the year.

We started to receive contributions from the British Horse Society towards our costs in making definitive map modification order applications to get paths recorded by the deadline of 1 January 2031, some of which related to activity in previous years. We started to place money on deposit to fund work on cases should they need to go to public inquiry.

Main Achievements

The main achievement for the year was that creation order for Batchworth 30 bridleway came into effect in June 2023, following the expertise and assistance provided to Three Rivers District Council. This resolved a discontinuity in the depiction of the route on the definitive map, helped the council with a safer route to school for cyclists and formed part of establishing a permanent bridleway from Rickmansworth to Croxley Green.

The text for a public path creation agreement was agreed with Stevenage Borough Council (landowner) and Hertfordshire County Council (highway authority) to create a bridleway on the east side of Stevenage. The Trust assisted by drafting the legal agreement and contributing to the Council's costs. This agreement is expected to come into force in 2024.

We were pleased that the Inspector appointed to consider the Shenley 39 bridleway diversion order agreed with our objection and modified the order to ensure the diverted path connected with the Metropolitan Common at Mimms Lane, to make a shorter route to reach Shenley 33 byway.

We were also pleased to help with securing the making and confirmation of *The Hertfordshire County Council (Cheshunt Bridleway) Creation Order 2022* which helps with the development of the H251 bridleroute to Epping Forest.

During the reporting period, two main activities were undertaken by the CIO, although other activities were undertaken by the unincorporated charity.

The new bank account for the CIO was set up, and the first transfer, of £500, was received from the unincorporated charity. Further transfers are expected to take place in 2023. The bank details were passed to registered supporters to encourage 2023 supporter renewals to be made directly to the CIO.

In December 2022, we were pleased to provide consultancy to Three Rivers District Council to assist with the upgrade of a footpath to a bridleway. We hope that by making the process simple for the instructing council, they will seek further work in future.

Main Achievement

The main achievement for the year was that the charity provided expertise and assistance to Three Rivers District Council which resulted in a Public Path Creation Order to upgrade Batchworth 30 footpath to bridleway. This resolved a discontinuity in the depiction of the route on the definitive map, helped the council with a safer route to school for cyclists and forms part of establishing a permanent bridleway from Rickmansworth to Croxley Green. There were no objections to the order, and the path will formally come into existence in 2023.

the transfer of the assets, liabilities and operations of the unincorporated charity to the CIO and subsequent closure of the unincorporated charity. At the start of the financial period, 1 January 2021, the transfer had not taken place. As such the CIO had no assets or liabilities at the start of the reporting period.

During the reporting period, two main activities were undertaken.

Firstly, the trustees of the CIO continued to develop the policies and processes needed before the transfer of the assets, liabilities and operations of the unincorporated charity could take place. It is planned that these will be formally adopted immediately prior to the transfer of the assets, liabilities and operations of the unincorporated charity to the CIO.

Secondly, land in Sarratt, Hertfordshire, was received as a gift from the trustees of the Jasmine Safety Track Trust. The Patchetts Green Bridleways Trust CIO entered into a public path creation agreement with the Hertfordshire County Council to dedicate a bridleway (which in future will be maintainable by the County Council) along the strip of land transferred and known as the Memorial Track. This was completed and the bridleway is now recorded by the County Council as Sarratt 80 bridleway. Remnants of the land that had not been included in the bridleway creation were registered as access land with the Three Rivers District Council.

Main Achievement

The main achievement for the year was that the charity created a public bridleway and obtained the County Council's agreement that this would be maintainable at public expense. The Council have signposted the route and it has been added to the definitive map of rights of way maintained by the Council.

Firstly, the trustees of the CIO worked to set up the policies and processes needed before the transfer of the assets, liabilities and operations of the unincorporated charity could take place. It is planned that these will be formally adopted immediately prior to the transfer of the assets, liabilities and operations of the unincorporated charity to the CIO.

Secondly, work commenced on the acquisition of land by gift from the Jasmine Safety Track Trust on which a bridleway would be dedicated, and discussions were held with the Jasmine Safety Track Trust and the Hertfordshire County Council so that the land could be transferred, dedicated as a bridleway and accepted by the council as a highway maintainable at public expense. This work had not completed at the end of the reporting period.

Main Achievements

The main achievements for the year was that the charity was set up and so had legal personality, and that the documents were signed for the land transfer and an application was made to the county council for their agreement to maintain the prospective new bridleway. It is expected that the bridleway will come into existence in 2021.
