

Trustees' Annual Report for the Year to 30th June 2022

Objectives and Activities

The purposes of the charity, as set out in its governing document, are:

1. To advance the Christian religion and education in Shipley and the surrounding area for the benefit of the public by

- the provision of regular opportunities for the discussion of matters of and action on ecumenical concern
- the planning and implementation of ecumenical acts of public worship and fellowship
- organising and promoting ecumenical opportunities for mission
- taking any further actions which may encourage the development of the ecumenical agenda.

2. To facilitate the provision and participation of services to meet identified needs of the community of Shipley and the surrounding area, including the relief of poverty and other social and health needs, either by itself or in co-operation with other voluntary or statutory agencies.

The main activities in relation to those purposes for the public benefit, in particular, the activities, projects or services identified in the accounts, were:

- running a Christians Against Poverty Debt Centre
- running a School Holiday Food Project
- running a Bible Stall in Shipley market
- supporting refugees from Ukraine

The Trustees confirm that they have complied with their duty to have due regard to the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit.

Achievements and Performance

1. The difference the charity's work has made to the circumstances of its beneficiaries are:

- Debt Centre clients have received solutions for their debt situations and have experienced a consequent improvement in their mental health. 33 households received support with their debts and associated issues. 4 households became free of debt and another 4 are expected to be debt free by the end of the year.

- 96 households on low incomes have received food during school holidays.

- The Bible Stall has handed out 22 free bibles and 11 portions of scripture.

- To September 2022, 3 local families have welcomed and sponsored Ukrainian refugees and an extended family is being sponsored and given support to rent a house.

Achievements and Performance (continued)

2. Wider benefits to society as a whole are:

- A signposting stall has helped the members of the community to access support services
- The cause of Fairtrade has been promoted
- Support has been given to the local foodbank
- A community café has been supported

Financial Review

1. Review of the charity's financial position at the end of the period

The Charity's receipts for the year ended 30 June 2022 amounted to £34,611 (2021 £25,390) and payments on its activities amounted to £25,747 (2021 £22,430). Receipts and payments have been allocated to one of four funds, three of which are considered restricted and one unrestricted. These are the General Fund (unrestricted), the Holiday Food Fund (restricted), the Ukraine Refugee Fund (restricted) and the CAP Debt Centre Fund (restricted). The balances at 30 June 2022 were £790 for the General Fund (2021 £926); £505 for the Holiday Food Fund (2021 £559); £5,127 for the Ukraine Refugee Fund (2021 £0) and £6,952 for the CAP Debt Centre Fund (2021 £3,025). Only after 30 June 2022 did the Ukraine Refugee Fund start making disbursements which explains the relatively high closing balance at year end. The CAP Debt Centre Fund is mainly funded in November which accounts for its relatively high closing balance at year end. Further information is shown in the Financial Statements.

2. Statement explaining the policy for holding reserves stating why they are held

The Charity has not yet cited a policy on reserves. The budget for next year, to be presented at the Annual General Meeting, will seek to retain reserves in the General Fund at three months of annual recurrent expenditure.

3. Amount of reserves held

The General Fund has cash equivalent to approximately six months of annual recurrent expenditure. This is due to the balance of funds brought forward. It is anticipated to bring this down to three months' worth and maintain this level going forward.

5. Details of fund materially in deficit

No fund is materially in deficit

6. Explanation of any uncertainties about the charity continuing as a going concern

The Charity is prudent about the activities it undertakes and recognises that its income flow is necessarily uncertain. Committed expenditure is managed appropriately; for example the Debt Centre project has been initially funded for a three-year period and the employment contract of the manager is therefore for an equivalent time-frame. This flexibility together with budgetary control should enable to Charity to expand or contract its activities without questioning its going concern status.

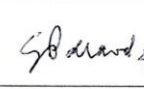

Notes to the Accounts Year ending 30 June 2022

General Shipley Christians Together is a Charitable Incorporated Organisation (CIO) and a registered charity no. 1190091. It was incorporated on 24 June 2020. Prior to charitable incorporation it was a less-formalised association of churches in Shipley, promoting ecumenical activities, outreach and community services within the town, going back several decades. The decision to incorporate as a registered charity was taken to further enable the work of Shipley Christians Together to continue and grow on a firmer foundational footing.

Note 1 Accounting Policies

Note 1.1 Fund designations The General Fund is an unrestricted fund for use at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of the general objectives of the charity. Financially, the General Fund meets the administrative needs of the charity. The Holiday Food Fund, CAP Debt Centre Fund and the Ukraine Refugee Fund are restricted funds subject to restrictions on the use of receipts from donors or granting agencies. More details of these funds and activities can be found in the Trustees Annual Report.

Note 1.2 Basis of accounting The trustees have made use of section 133 of the Charities Act 2011 and have prepared the accounts on a receipts and payments basis.

Note 2 Annual subscriptions These comprise annual voluntary contributions from the member churches, with a minimum of £50 per annum requested.

Note 3 Grants consist of amounts provided by Bradford Council to fund a school holiday food programme in Shipley.

Note 4 Church Funding consists of amounts provided by member churches for supporting the CAP Debt Centre Project. Most churches have given a 3 year commitment to the project, which will enter its 3rd year in November 2022. The charity expects that the project will continue beyond the initial 3 years.

Note 5 Administration payments include insurance, publicity and other administrative costs incurred by Shipley Christians Together.

Note 6 Fund Activities are payments in furtherance of the objectives of the funds.

Thus the cost of food delivered under the Holiday Food Fund was £6,541 (2021: £10,037) and £7,200 (2021: £4,800) was paid to CAP Bradford to support the operation of the CAP Debt Centre.

Included within the General Fund is £237 used to pay for 'Meaningful Chocolate' Advent Calendars distributed along with Christmas Holiday Food (2021:£0) and £66 to pay for 'Meaningful Chocolate' Easter Eggs distributed at the Good Friday walk of witness through Shipley town centre (2021: £0). (In 2021 Easter eggs were delivered along with Holiday Food at Easter costing £270 (2022: £0). The remaining amount of £682 relates to Bible purchases and stall rental at Shipley Market (2021: £740).

Note 7 Employment costs relate to the salary and pension costs arising from the part-time employment of the CAP Debt Centre manager (16 hours per week). The average number of full time equivalent employees over the year is 1/2 (2021: 1/4) .

to state whether particular matters have come to my attention.

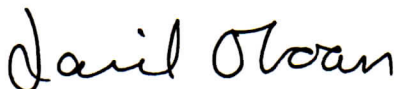
