Since November 2023 LVP has been busy and it was good to start rehearsals for "Rapunzel" in November. This was another script written by Julia West. We did sing carols at Launton School at their Christmas Fair on December 16th. And we sang Carols around the village on December 15th. This time we sang at certain locations in the village and this was very successful, raising £256.72 for the Alzheimer's Society.

Panto tickets were put on sale before Christmas with an "early bird" discount as well as family discounts. We are pleased to report that our shows sold out and we ended up donating £1100.00 to Bicester Autism which was our chosen charity. We were lucky enough to receive the Best Pantomime award from NODA (National Operatic and Drama Association) London District, and the best Overall Production award from the ODN (Oxfordshire Drama Network). We also provided an hour's Christmas entertainment at the Hummingbird's Light the Light event on Sunday 2nd December.

We had a stall at the Bicester Mayor's Charity event in Garth Park on 3rd April 2024 and sang at Launton granteresidential Home on Saturday 20th April.

On April 21st, we started rehearsals for our summer show "It's Showtime" which was a mixture of sketches and songs. The highlights included a fan dance and the Abba medley which concluded the show. The shows were on 20th and 21st in the big shed theatre at Hare Leys Farm, Launton. We did 3 shows this year and made £2,550.00 which was donated 50:50 to Bicester Baby Bank and LVP's Stage Block Fund.

On September 15th, we had an Open Evening for potential new members and are happy to say we have gained several new members. Rehearsals for our 38th pantomime "Beauty and the beast" began on 27th October.

LVP has had several fundraising events in order to purchase new stage blocks as our existing ones are showing signs of wear. These include a Bingo Night and a Sip and Paint evening.

Through fund raising and donations we have raised £7,300.00.

The Trustees have met regularly and reviewed our Policies and Risk Assessments as well as looking at improving our membership process and paperwork. Safeguarding meetings have been held and the spreadsheet updated. We continue to belong to ODN and NODA. We have had a full year of activities and our treasurer has carefully budgeted each production and is in the process of handing over to our new treasurer. The Trustees feel that LVP has had a successful year, financially, socially and in achieving out charitable objects.

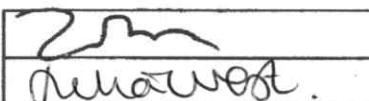

We did sing carols at Launton School at their Christmas Fair on December 2nd. And we sang Carols around the village on December 23rd. This time we sang at certain locations in the village and this was very successful, raising £236.10 for the Alzheimer's Society.

Panto tickets were put on sale before Christmas with an "early bird" discount as well as family discounts. We are pleased to report that our audiences numbers were back up to pre Covid levels this year and we ended up donating £7,500.00 to Nal's House which was our chosen charity. We also received several awards from NODA and ODN.

We also sang carols at Launton Grange residential home on the morning of Saturday December 17th and provided an hour's Christmas entertainment at the Hummingbird's Light the Light event on Sunday 4th December.

On April 16th we had a Welcome Event for new members to come along and find out about LVP and see if they would like to join us for our next production. On April 30th, we started rehearsals for our summer show "Come Rain or Shine" which was a mixture of sketches and songs as well as readings and poems. The highlights included, tap dancing and singing in water; and we must also mention the lawn chair drill which really made our audiences laugh! As the weather was very windy with thunder storms the show was performed on the afternoons of July 16th and 17th in the big shed at Mayflower, Hare Leys Farm, Launton, rather than in the garden. We had full audiences and made £1400.00 which was donated to the Bicester Food Bank and UNICEF.

On September 17th, we had an Open Evening for potential new members and are happy to say we have gained several new members. Rehearsals for our 37th pantomime began on 29th October and we used the Tesco community Room as Launton Parish Hall was booked. This worked well for small groups.

This summer we started to think about purchasing new stage blocks as our existing ones are showing signs of wear. Meetings were held and so far 2 fund raising events have been organised, a "Games in the Garden" event and a Race night. We have also had 2 generous donations.

The Trustees have met regularly and reviewed our Policies and Risk Assessments as well as looking at improving our membership process and paperwork. Safeguarding meetings have been held and the spreadsheet updated. We continue to belong to ODN and NODA.

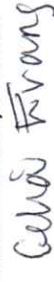

Since November 2021 LVP has been busy and it was good to start rehearsals for Dick Whittington in November with Covid safety measures in place (testing, mask wearing). It was felt that we should aim to keep costs down as we were unsure of audience numbers and by doing a show we had done before it was felt that this would help. Times were still uncertain and a wave of Covid infections just before Christmas across the country meant some of our events were delayed and others cancelled. We did sing carols at Launton School at their Christmas Fair on December 4th but our plan to go Carol Singing around the village on December 19th had to be cancelled and in January 2021 we delayed selling pantomime tickets when the government introduced Plan B to try to control Covid outbreaks. In late January we put tickets on sale and we ended up with audiences about half full, though it must be reported that all the audiences were very enthusiastic! Some of the cast were struck down with Covid during February but thankfully, all our principals were fine and everyone made a full recovery. We ended up making a small profit which was distributed to our chosen charities. Covid Plan B was lifted the week of our pantomime.

In the spring time we visited Launton Grange residential home on the morning of Saturday April 9th and sang a mixture of songs for them. This was the first time we had done this since the Covid pandemic and it was wonderful to see how much LVP members enjoyed the experience as well as the residents.

On April 10th we had a Welcome Event for new members to come along and find out about LVP and see if they would like to join us for our next production. On May 1st we started rehearsals for our summer show "A Musical Jubilee" which was to celebrate Queen Elizabeth's Platinum Jubilee. It was a mixture of sketches and songs as well as readings and poems. The highlights included, having, for the first time, a celebrity dog who did an act; and we must also mention the synchronised swimming act which really made our audiences laugh! The show was performed on the afternoons of July 16th and 17th in the garden at Mayflower, Hare Leys Farm, Launton. We also saved money by rehearsing in the farm shed. Both afternoons of the shows were very hot, an unusual problem to have but we

did source gazebos for the audience. We had full audiences and made £1400.00 which was donated to the Disasters Emergency Committee Ukraine Humanitarian Appeal.

On September 25th we had another Welcome Evening for potential new members and are happy to say we have gained about 4 new members from our Welcome evenings. Rehearsals for our 36th pantomime began on 30th October and our cast numbers are back up to pre Covid levels with many members returning to pantomime this time.

The Trustees have met regularly and reviewed our Policies and Risk Assessments as well as looking at improving our membership process and paperwork. Our Safeguarding Committee has been confirmed and the Safeguarding spreadsheet updated. We continue to belong to ODN and NODA.

We have had a full year of activities and our treasurer has carefully budgeted each production. Sadly attempts to perform an autumn play did not come to fruition but this was the right decision in the circumstances. The Trustees feel that LVP has had a successful year, financially, socially and in achieving our charitable objects.

Our principal address for LVP is:

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The year 2021 started with another lockdown because of Covid-19, so we tried to be creative and continued with our monthly Zoom gatherings. In January held a Games Evening, in February we did a Macmillan Escape room and as a result donated £300.00 to Macmillan Cancer Support. In March we held a "Get crafty with LVP" via Zoom and in May we organised another Quiz "Around the World." Another opportunity in July for Members was a mime training session on Zoom with Mime artist Les Bubb. This was a very useful and entertaining evening.

In May we were happy to begin plans for another show and begin rehearsals for our summer show called "Another Opening, Another Show". We had a clear Covid-19 Risk Assessment and ensured that rehearsals were held in a garden or in an open sided shed. We were always under 30 people which was following the government guidelines at that time. On August 14th and 15th we performed in the garden of Bob and Maureen Roberts. The show included some well-known songs and short sketches, as well as a mime sketch which is a genre not often seen and so is meeting the criteria in our Artistic Merit Policy. We raised £565.00 for the Hummingbird Centre in Launton which is an organisation that provides support to cancer patients and their families.

On October 17th we ran a Welcome Evening to begin the process of performing our next pantomime Dick Whittington in February 2022. We hope to be able to perform this during February half term, Covid permitting. We have a Covid-19 Risk Assessment in place and are aiming to plan rehearsals so the cast are not always mixing. We have a smaller cast which will help with this. but we have also welcomed several new members which is good.

Our new website is now up and running and we have launched a new range of merchandise which last Christmas earned LVP £183.22. We are also on Amazon smile which has brought in some financial gain to LVP. This all helps towards covering our running costs such as Insurance, Dropbox and Website fees.

Earlier in the year we also approved our Membership policy, form and handbook. In 2021 we ran a 6 month membership from April to the end of October and so have just launched our new membership scheme for 2021-2022. Subscriptions are at the same level as last year. We continue to review our policies and update where necessary. Also in the last 12 months we have completed our GDPR policy, Privacy policy and our Risk Assessments.

In the future the trustees will continue to update our skills audit and to identify any gaps which we may need to fill as well as to continue with any relevant training. We will continue to review policies, update our Risk Assessments and Health and Safety policy, as well as to continue work on our guidance booklet "How to put on a Show". Most importantly we hope to be able to perform at least 2 shows over the next 12 months and raise money for good causes.

Treasurers notes

In July 2020, once we have been granted charity status, we applied to The co-operative bank for a Community account and in August 2020 the account was opened.

In September we enrolled into the AmazonSmile scheme. And created a Paypal account to allow membership payments and other transactions to be as easy as possible.

Due to the Covid 19 pandemic, we were unable to perform in February 2021 for our main production, and it was felt that in these difficult times, it was not reasonable to charge subscriptions. Our only costs at that point were the zoom subscriptions, any out of pocket expenses were covered by the individual trustee. And we were still able to offer our 46 members (including Full, Junior and Friend) regular zoom social events including an online escape room and a Mime workshop for those who wished to take part.

In the Spring of 2021 we were able to put on a 2 night outdoor Variety show with profits being donated to a local Cancer Support charity. We were able to do this by charging ½ year member subscriptions and by using the funds from an initial donation from a previous unregistered group.

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We are still waiting for the final bills to come in in relation to our summer show – this is anticipated to be in the region of £50.

In November 2021 Members subscriptions for the full year will be due, a substantial amount of them have already been collected in this financial year.

Despite the difficulties of the past 16 months we still achieved our charities 2 main objectives :-

1. To advance, improve, maintain and develop public education and appreciation of musical and dramatic art and artistic events and
2. To support charitable purposes.

In the forthcoming financial year we hope and plan to put on our full programme of performances including, in 2022 a Pantomime in February and a Summer show.

As we have had so few transactions I would recommend that we do not appoint an independent examiner this year with this being reviewed annually according to the current legislation.
