Our work reduced the chances of the poor, elderly and young from getting cold related diseases such as frostbite and hypothermia.</p> <p>Food Parcel Distribution:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • During the month of Ramadan (Apr/May) we provided 295 food packs across Yemen and Bangladesh. This provided families with a months' worth of food provisions, giving temporary relief from hunger and stress. • Bangladesh Flood Relief – in June 2022 Bangladesh suffered one of the worst floods in its history, which affected over 7 million people, causing widespread damage and leaving families with no access to electricity and food. During this time, Creating Dreams Foundation supported over 300 families by providing food packs, access to those families was difficult due to the location and limited transportation. <p>Water Well Installation: During the period we installed 30 water wells across several districts in Bangladesh. All the water wells installed provide clean water throughout the year.</p> <p>Furthermore, we provided and installed new water filters to those families who have water wells but that do not pump clean water due to deterioration overtime. This was a quick and cost effective way to provide clean water filtration system to support the most needy.</p> <p>Our work provided young children and women, who would normally walk long distances to get clean water, to focus on other important aspects of life such as education and employment.</p>
