Overview

In 2023, Aid Lanka extended its charitable efforts within the United Kingdom by partnering with members of the Bushey community in Hertfordshire. This initiative aimed to strengthen community bonds, support local faith-based activities, and provide educational opportunities for children and families living in the area.

With the guidance and organisational support of Aid Lanka, the Bushey community successfully established a structured framework for regular congregational worship, children's education, and community gatherings.

Project Objectives

- To assist in establishing a local community group for Muslims in Bushey, Hertfordshire.
 - To organise regular Friday (Jumu'ah) prayers and other congregational activities.
 - To provide supplementary educational support for children within the community.
 - To promote unity, learning, and spiritual growth through community engagement and Ramadan programmes.
-

Activities and Implementation

Throughout 2023, Aid Lanka played an instrumental role in the following key initiatives:

Friday (Jumu'ah) Prayers

Aid Lanka worked closely with community volunteers to coordinate weekly congregational prayers, ensuring appropriate facilities, scheduling, and management. These gatherings became an important centre for spiritual reflection, community bonding, and shared learning.

Children's Supplementary Education

Recognising the need for educational support among local families, Aid Lanka helped establish weekend and after-school classes focusing on Qur'an studies, Islamic morals, and basic academic skills. The sessions were led by qualified teachers and dedicated volunteers, fostering both learning and moral development in a nurturing environment.

Ramadan Activities

During the holy month of Ramadan, Aid Lanka supported a wide range of community activities including Iftar gatherings, Taraweeh prayers, and charitable fundraising efforts. These events brought together families, youth, and elders, reinforcing the values of compassion, generosity, and unity.

Transition to Local Leadership

By the end of 2023, the Bushey community — with the mentorship and guidance of Aid Lanka — successfully registered its own charitable organisation. Aid Lanka’s involvement during the formative stages ensured a smooth transition to independent management, allowing the Bushey group to continue operating sustainably and effectively.

This milestone reflects Aid Lanka’s broader vision of empowering local communities to take ownership of their development and establish self-sustaining, faith-led initiatives.

Impact and Outcomes

- **Establishment of a structured and active community group in Bushey.**
- **Regular Friday congregational prayers introduced and sustained.**
- **Children’s supplementary classes benefiting multiple families in the area.**
- **Enhanced community unity and engagement through Ramadan programmes.**
- **A successful transition to an independently registered charitable organisation.**

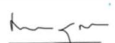

The majority of funds were directed toward relief operations and educational support initiatives in Sri Lanka, particularly during the Ramadan Feed the Fasting Campaign.

The trustees are satisfied that the charity's financial position remains stable, with sufficient reserves to meet ongoing commitments and future project plans.

Reserves Policy

The trustees aim to maintain a level of unrestricted reserves equivalent to at least three months of operating costs. This ensures the charity can continue its work and respond to emergencies even in times of reduced income. At year end, unrestricted reserves stood at **£987**

Risk Management

The trustees continually assess key financial and operational risks. Adequate controls and reporting mechanisms are in place to safeguard assets, maintain accountability, and ensure proper use of charitable funds.

This includes, but is not limited to, the provision of food, clothing, shelter, healthcare, and other essential needs for disadvantaged individuals and families.

The promotion of education for public benefit

Including the social and physical training of people in the United Kingdom and Sri Lanka, in such ways as the charity trustees think fit. This may include, but is not limited to:

(a) Awarding scholarships, maintenance allowances, or grants tenable at any university, college, or institution of higher or further education;

(b) Supporting educational facilities, training centres, and skill development programmes aimed at empowering individuals to improve their livelihoods;

(c) Providing educational resources and support for schools and students in underprivileged communities.

Feed the Fasting Campaign – Extending Compassion and Hope during Ramadan

Overview

During the year Aid *Lanka* continued its mission to bring relief, compassion, and hope to the most vulnerable communities across Sri Lanka. Through our **Feed the Fasting Campaign**, we aimed to ensure that disadvantaged families were able to observe Ramadan with dignity and nourishment.

With the generous support of our donors and the tireless efforts of our volunteers in both the UK and Sri Lanka, we provided vital food support to hundreds of struggling families, enabling them to enjoy wholesome *Iftar* and *Suhoor* meals throughout the fasting month.

This campaign was not just about providing food — it was about restoring hope, supporting spiritual resilience, and reminding our brothers and sisters that they are not forgotten.

Project Objectives

- To provide nutritious staple food items to disadvantaged families during the month of Ramadan.
 - To support fasting individuals and families in meeting their daily sustenance needs for *Iftar* and *Suhoor*.
 - To extend compassion, alleviate hunger, and promote community solidarity through charitable giving.

Phase 1 – Ramadan 2020 Assistance (Food Parcels to the Needy)

As of **28 April 2020**, Aid Lanka successfully distributed **over 200 food parcels** to vulnerable families in rural villages across Sri Lanka.

Each parcel contained essential items sufficient for the month of Ramadan, including: **Rice, flour, sugar, dhal, potatoes, milk, and onions**, among other staples.

These provisions helped ensure that families were able to break their fasts with dignity and maintain the energy required for worship during the holy month.

We extend our heartfelt gratitude to all our supporters and volunteers for their unwavering commitment to this cause.

Phase 2 – Extended Ramadan 2020 Assistance (Food Parcels & Financial Aid)

Building on the success of Phase 1, we launched a **second phase** to reach even more families in need. This stage included **both food parcel distributions and financial assistance** to help the most disadvantaged communities sustain themselves through Ramadan.

Areas of Distribution

- **Pulmodai**, Trincomalee District, Eastern Province
- **Valaichchenai**, Batticaloa District, Eastern Province

The beneficiaries in these regions were identified as among the most vulnerable, many of whom were struggling to access food, shelter, and medical care.

Through this initiative, Aid Lanka provided essential relief and a sense of renewed hope to those facing extreme hardship.

Impact

- Over **200+ families** directly supported through food parcel distributions.
- **Dozens more** received direct financial assistance to meet urgent household needs.
- Hundreds of individuals were able to observe Ramadan with proper nutrition and spiritual peace.

The collective generosity of our donors played a crucial role in achieving these outcomes. Your contributions not only filled plates but also hearts — reminding many that compassion and humanity continue to thrive even in difficult times.

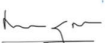
