1. Objectives and Activities

Charitable Objectives

The charity exists to advance spiritual development and personal empowerment for the public benefit. Its core aim is to support individuals in recognising and expressing their innate potential through spiritual education, reflective practices, and community engagement.

Principal Activities

To achieve these objectives, the charity delivers:

- Weekly spiritual empowerment services
- Guided meditation and reflective sessions
- Workshops, retreats, and conferences
- Community outreach and collaborative initiatives
- Biannual seminars, workshops, and retreats
- Counselling, welfare, bereavement and wellbeing Initiatives

Trustees confirm that they have had regard to the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit when reviewing the charity's aims and planning its activities.

2. Activities and Achievements (2024)

The charity successfully hosted its annual conference, **Image Bearers**, which remains a central feature of its programme. The event featured Dr Ishmael Tetteh as keynote speaker and delivered:

- Advanced spiritual teaching
- Experiential learning sessions
- Increased participant engagement and visibility of the charity's work

Community Outreach

A joint end-of-year celebration and outreach initiative was delivered in collaboration with stakeholders within Merton Council. This initiative contributed to:

- Strengthened local community relationships
- Increased awareness of the charity's activities
- Inclusive engagement across diverse groups

Retreats and Development Spaces

Two in-person retreat-style gatherings were held during the year, offering participants dedicated time for reflection, renewal, and deeper practice.

Impact Summary

Key outcomes during the year include:

- Sustained engagement across a consistent membership base

- Growth in online participation and international reach
- Delivery of **2 workshops, 2 retreats, and 1 major conference**
- Strengthened community presence through local outreach

3. Financial Review

Overview

The charity remains primarily funded through voluntary donations. During the financial year, total income amounted to **£585**, with total expenditure of **£540**, resulting in a **surplus of £45**.

This reflects prudent financial management and the charity's continued commitment to operating within its means.

Income

Income was derived entirely from voluntary contributions. The trustees acknowledge and appreciate the continued support of donors, which remains essential to sustaining the charity's activities.

Expenditure

Expenditure was allocated as follows:

- **Programme delivery:** £380
 - o Virtual services, digital platforms, and content delivery
- **Administrative costs:** £105
 - o Communication tools and operational support
- **Miscellaneous expenses:** £45

Expenditure was closely monitored to ensure alignment with charitable objectives and value for money.

Financial Position and Outlook

The charity ended the year with a modest surplus and maintains a stable financial position. Trustees recognise the need to:

- Increase income to support future growth
- Develop more sustainable funding streams
- Improve financial resilience

No formal fundraising events were held during the year.

4. Structure, Governance and Management

The charity operates under a defined governance framework to ensure accountability and effective decision-making.

Leadership oversight is provided through established internal structures, including:

- A Pastoral Board responsible for operational delivery
- Trustees (serving as members of the Elders' body) providing strategic oversight

The Pastoral Board comprises:

- Senior leadership (Head and Associate Pastors)
- Secretary
- Departmental representatives

The Board meets on a **bi-monthly basis** to review activities, performance, and planning. Trustees retain ultimate responsibility for governance, compliance, and safeguarding the charity's assets.

5. Risk Management

The trustees have reviewed the charity's financial controls and operational processes and are satisfied that appropriate measures are in place to mitigate key risks.

We however held our first in-person New Year's Eve service after the COVID pandemic. Additionally, in March 2022, we collaborated with Powerhouse Ministries Cambridge in its support to the Cambridge University Ghanaian Society in the organisation of the 65th Independence Day celebration of Ghana at Wolfson College, Cambridge. Section of members of World Impact Faith International attended the event with Reverend Prince Osei-Gyamfi and Rev. Yaw Oppong-Drueh (Both trustees), both presiding as panel members for the event.

Mid-week meditational services on Wednesdays that encourage introspection, self-determination and prayer for conflict areas in the world also continued virtually together with Monday morning meditation sessions. We held our first summer retreat after lockdown restrictions as well as Image Bearers Web-conference our annual Autumn conference for deeper spiritual studies and self-discovery.

Financial Review

The Charity which currently has an average UK membership of 20 people including children relies solely on the voluntary contributions from its members. We have a growing online/remote membership because of increasing our social media engagement. In the fiscal year, our charity reported a total income of £450 against expenditures amounting to £428, resulting in a modest surplus of £22. This financial outcome reflects our prudent management and commitment to maintaining a balanced budget. It is our aim to expand by increasing our income for the future development work. The Charity has maintained a steady growth and continues to pursue its charitable objectives.

- **Income**

Our primary income source has been donations, which have been instrumental in supporting our mission to empower individuals spiritually. We are grateful for the continued generosity of our donors and supporters, whose contributions have been vital, especially during these challenging times.

- **Expenditure**

The total expenditure of £428 was allocated as follows:

- **Program Delivery:** £300 was dedicated to organizing virtual spiritual empowerment sessions, including costs for digital platforms and content creation.
- **Administrative Expenses:** £100 covered operational costs such as communication tools.
- **Miscellaneous:** £28 accounted for contingencies.

This deficit was primarily due to the increased costs associated with general administration.

Voluntary contributions showed signs of picking up with relaxed restrictions. The organization aims to address this deficit by exploring alternative fundraising efforts and cost management strategies.

No fundraising event was held in year.
