<p>Summary of the main activities in relation to those purposes for the public benefit, in particular, the activities, projects or services identified in the accounts.</p>	<p>Para 1.17 and 1.19</p>	<p><b>The Relief of those in need by reason of ill health, disability or another disadvantage.</b></p> <p><i>Providing specialist advice, assessment, and information to disabled parents, parents with additional support needs and their families so they may access facilities and services in the community.</i></p> <p>The charity has established and continues to provide a <b>national occupational therapy service across England and Wales</b> to meet the needs of disabled parents and those parents with additional support needs. Over the past year we have received referrals and enquiries from all over the country. We also received enquiries from South Wales.</p> <p>The charity has continued to provide assessments, advice and information to clients and professionals and signposted them to local agencies as appropriate. This has occurred <b>online in most cases</b>.</p> <p>This model of practice will continue because online work means that we can reach a greater number of people and services and work efficiently within COVID and sustainability guidelines.</p> <p>The Founder continues to be a member of several Facebook groups as a disabled parent. This means that she can pick up queries or concerns of other disabled mothers and pass on details of our website and service and chat more informally about possible solutions to issues raised by other parents.</p> <p>Also, other Occupational Therapists and professionals working with families are making enquiries to Enabled2Parent for advice calls, case discussions or making referrals to our service. The range of referral sources is also gradually increasing. These include fertility clinics, local authorities, Perinatal Occupational Therapists, medicolegal solicitors, children’s and adult social workers, midwives and social prescribers.</p> <p>However, this year, our greatest proportion of referrals comes from the <b>disabled parents</b> who self-refer via our email enquiry service to request support. <b>This year we received a total of 24 referrals and 16 of these came from disabled parents.</b></p>

***Enabled2Parent is concerned with the care, parenting, and establishment in life of the children and young people who are part of the families where there is a parent with a disability or additional support needs.***

The charity's founder has a wealth of experience working with children with additional needs over many years. This means the charity can offer advice and support to our parents and their families.

This means the charity has been able to recognize and (with parental consent) advise on parental, child and/or professional concerns arising from the potential and actual special educational needs of the children of the parents in our care.

The charity continues to be invited to attend and participate in Child in Need Meetings and Child Protection conferences by various local authorities where the parents we are supporting have requested our help.

This has meant we have been able to advocate for them and so empower them to have a greater understanding of the role they have as parents in maintaining the welfare of their children.

In addition, Enabled2Parent provides short- and long-term support to parents. The charity will review progress with clients regularly and they can self-refer again if their needs change.

The charity has also worked with other charities and organisations in the wider community to promote and address the needs and quality of life of the families we support.

These include the Royal College of Occupational Therapy Perinatal Specialist Section, Future Health, A Research Nurse, The Voluntary Association for Arun and Chichester and Chichester District Council.

Summary of the main activities in relation to those purposes for the public benefit, in particular, the activities, projects or services identified in the accounts

### 3. Social Inclusion

Enabled2Parent will for the public benefit promote social inclusion among disabled parents, those parents with additional support needs and their children by:

Providing education and information to enable disabled parents and those with additional support needs to become and be safe, independent, and resilient parents.

Raise public awareness about the issues faced by disabled parents and those with additional support needs and their children both generally and in relation to their social inclusion.

Provide workshops, forums, advocacy and general support.

#### **Sussex Support Group for Disabled Mothers**

Enabled2Parent set up and carried out a **six-week support group for disabled mothers in Sussex** between February and March 2024. This was delivered online and run by the Founder in a local accessible community venue in Chichester. This was achieved with part of a grant from Sussex Community Foundation.

It involved six mothers who lived in East and West Sussex and the course material that was developed in a collaboration with Mosaic 1898 charity was used. The themes that were covered are listed below:

- Parenting with a disability
- Baby Care Adaptive Strategies and Equipment
- Parenting with an invisible Illness
- Getting Out and About with a Little One
- Plugging Into Peer Support

Sadly, the outcome and engagement with this group was disappointing. We “lost” three mothers who failed to attend the group at all. The other three took the opportunity to use one or more of the sessions to address their own needs and concerns on a 1:1 with the Founder so it was never possible to form a “group” or share ideas, concerns and suggestions in a collaborative way. All the mothers also declined to complete an evaluation (even though they were assured of confidentiality).

This demonstrates the importance of piloting new ideas and carrying out some consultations with disabled parents when developing new initiatives. A possible reason for this outcome almost certainly lies in disabled parents fears to

		<p>come forward for help and engage with a professional who is based in their local area with perceived of potential access to Social Services.</p> <p>It remains a significant barrier to the growth of Enabled2Parent as responses to requests to book a place, answering a survey or committing to a course in advance is not forthcoming.</p> <p>Enabled2Parent will “re-try” this support group on a <b>national level</b> in the hope that more mothers may engage next year.</p> <p>It may be necessary to consider providing these courses in more virtual ways such as videos or podcasts or a course booklet that can be accessed via our website.</p> <p><b>E-Learning Module Physical Disability In Pregnancy Perinatal Mental Health Division of Royal College of Occupational Therapists</b></p> <p>This project has been ongoing since last year. The aim of this module was to raise awareness among all relevant health professionals of the needs of disabled mothers who present with physical disabilities alongside a mental health condition before and up to the end of the first year of motherhood.</p> <p>Sarah was asked to provide three fictional case studies and worked on examples of these as well as contributing to the development of content and progress of the Steering Group. The project was completed in July 2024 and went live in September 2024. The project was funded by NHS England.</p> <p>A short video explaining the context of the project can be found here:</p> <p><a href="#">Occupational therapy and perinatal mental health   RCOT</a></p>

The protected characteristics of this “sufficient section of the public” are disability, pregnancy, maternity and paternity.</p>

Para 1.20	<p><b>OT Action</b> Sarah has also formed a working collaboration with a company called OT Action. <b>This continued throughout 2023/2024.</b> This firm is based in Exeter but serves veteran serviceman. Sarah continues carry out assessments for equipment for serviceman (based in Portsmouth) and the charity SAFFA. This commenced in June 2023 and <b>Enabled2Parent is paid £215 for each assessment.</b></p> <p><b>Building Local Networks</b> Enabled2Parent is regularly invited to attend local council events and has been able to work with the Voluntary Association for Arun and Chichester and meet other charitable organizations in the local area such as The Rotary Club, The Lions Club and Sanctuary, which provides volunteers in the local area.</p>

		<p><b>Exhibition – Naidex - Disability Show NEC 19- 21 March 2024</b></p> <p>Enabled2Parent attended and exhibited at Naidex in March 2024. This was made possible by using funds from our grant from the National Lottery Grant.</p> <p>Sarah attended on behalf of Enabled2Parent and met a wide range of professionals and companies with connections with the parenting industry. She was able to talk about the work of the charity with fellow exhibitors and delegates, and she toured the show seeking out new products, services and opportunities to network and promote Enabled2Parent across a range of professionals and companies.</p> <p>During the show, she made <b>27 contacts</b> and some disabled parents who took further information away with them about Enabled2Parent.</p> <p>Due to this, it may be in the best interests of the charity to fund Sarah’s attendance to exhibit at Naidex and attend the Occupational Therapy Show and Baby Show as a delegate only.</p> <p>These costs would need to be met through charitable grants moving forward.</p>

<p>Achievements against objectives set</p>	<p>Para 1.41</p>	<p><b>Medico-Legal Instructions</b></p> <p>The charity received two medico-legal enquiries this year which converted to instructions for completion of Parenting Forecasts that integrate the needs of the disabled parent and their child between the ages of 0-2 years old. The charity was paid for each case. This is an area of practice that the charity wishes to develop over the coming year.</p> <p><b>Baby Book</b></p> <p>Over the course of last year Enabled2Parent has supported three mothers with cognitive impairments secondary to complex needs. Through this process Sarah recognised a need to write and provide these mothers with a Baby Book that they could keep use and refer to when caring for their babies or young toddlers.</p> <p>The purpose was to create a pictorial resource that provided visual cues and simple instructions for them to refer to. The aim was to ensure that parents did <b>not</b> have to remember and execute the task sequences of child welfare and adaptive tasks such as dressing, changing, feeding or playing with their little ones <b>without prompting</b>.</p> <p>Aspects of parenting capacity such as safe sleep, dressing a baby for hot or cold weather, recognising signs if the baby became unwell</p>

		<p>and guidance about how to look after themselves as a mother were also included.</p> <p>The Founder issued <b>3 Baby Books</b> this year at a total cost of <b>£77.50</b>. These were issued to one Sussex parent and two parents who lived in the Northwest and Bedfordshire. These were bound hard copies so the mothers could keep them in their hospital or changing bags to refer to “on the go”.</p> <p><b>Governance Matters</b>  In July 2024, it was necessary to “take stock” of the charity’s direction since it was becoming increasingly difficult for the Founder to continue to “carry” the responsibility and the decision making in the presence of continued vacancies on the Board of Trustees.</p> <p>A heartfelt plea on Social media requesting help from professionals with an interest and or background in health or social care and experience of charity work resulted in a steady stream of individuals who were recruited to the Board.</p> <p>This was a positive achievement as up to now there had been significant problems in consistently appointing and keeping trustees who understood and committed to facilitating the growth of the charity.</p> <p><b>A New Board</b>  By September 2024, we had a full Board that encompassed a Chair, Treasurer, Non-Executive Director, HR, Marketing and Safeguarding.</p> <p>Despite a few casualties, we focused our attention on <b>writing and approving new policies, exploring revenue streams, funding sources, a new website and a Strategic Plan for the next two years.</b> Meetings were set to occur <b>bi-monthly</b> and a Board Secretary was appointed to take care of Administrative Matters.</p> <p>The charity looks forward to a more stable existence and hopes to achieve productive and sustainable growth.</p>
<p>Performance of fundraising activities against objectives set</p>	<p>Para 1.41</p>	<p>The beneficiaries of Enabled2Parent are disabled parents and their families as well as professionals working across all sectors.</p> <p>This means that it is very difficult to fundraise or launch appeals asking them to donate to our cause. <b>This is because our parents are often on lower incomes and the NHS and local authorities do not always have a budget to fund our services.</b> The <b>cost-of-living crisis</b> is also a significant factor adding to an inability to donate by individuals and organisations alike.</p>

## Financial Review

Review of the charity's financial position at the end of the period	Para 1.21	<p>The charity has <b>£10.014</b> at the end of this period due to the generosity of two grants from the National Lottery Community Fund and the Sussex Community Foundation.</p> <p>Funds have been used by both awarding bodies to exhibit at Naidex and the Care and Occupational Therapy Show in Exeter. The latter was funded through a donation of £500 from the Continuing Health Care charity.</p> <p>The focus of the year has been about developing a medico-legal practice for disabled parents involved in care proceedings, providing adaptive parenting reports as well as attending exhibitions across the country in the commercial and disability sectors.</p> <p>None of these can be done online so the exhibition costs with associated travel and subsistence expenses have been very high. Consideration will have to be given about exhibiting at Naidex to give Enabled2Parent a presence and position in the disability industry. The founder will then need to attend all other shows as a <b>delegate only</b> next year.</p> <p>Enabled2Parent will also have to make a concerted effort to host one or two fundraising events to complement the acquisition of any grant funding and look at developing more resources that can be sold on our website to beneficiaries and professionals alike.</p>

We also provide Consultancy to organisations and professional bodies.</p> <p>Enabled2Parent has received <b>£860</b> fees for assessments on behalf of OT Action (Exeter).</p> <p>The Founder was instructed on 2 medico-legal cases as an Expert Witness and another as a professional adviser affording the charity a further <b>£1471</b>.</p> <p>Donations made up <b>£700</b>.</p> <p>The charity was also paid <b>£500</b> for a collaborative project with the Perinatal Division of the Royal College of Occupational Therapists</p>

<p>A description of the principal risks facing the charity</p>	<p>Para 1.46</p>	<p>The beneficiaries of Enabled2Parent are disabled parents and their families as well as professionals working across all sectors.</p> <p>This means that it is very difficult to fundraise or launch appeals asking them to donate to our cause. This is because they are often on lower incomes and the NHS and local authorities do not have a budget to fund our services.</p> <p>Also, the founder continues to develop a new area of practice within her profession the awareness of which is growing slowly. She remains the <b>only independent OT in the country</b> providing services to disabled parents and those with additional support needs.</p> <p>This means that it will continue to be necessary to adopt a more holistic approach that encompasses <b>clinical service provision, marketing, and procurement as well as the design and development of a wider range of products and services that generate revenue for the charity.</b></p> <p>It will now be necessary to apply for further smaller grants to maintain and sustain our activities moving forward. <b>This is because the income streams are limited to small numbers of medico-legal cases and paid work from OT Action only.</b></p> <p>As in previous years, Enabled2Parent continues</p>

		<p>to experience <b>attrition of Trustees for long periods of the year</b> meaning that we cannot make decisions to grow the charity consistently.</p> <p>For this reason, the Founder took the view that the focus should be to exhibit across the country to raise awareness of Enabled2Parent in as many locations as possible.</p> <p>This has resulted in a significant spend that has been counteracted with less clinical work and a greater focus on forming a new Board and addressing matters of governance for the latter half of the year.</p> <p>It is hoped that the new Chair and Board Members will be able to lead the charity into new endeavours, sustained operational and fiscal growth and to provide innovative products and services for our beneficiaries.</p>

Our Treasurer, our safeguarding trustee and a general trustee also left us. Enabled2Parent continues to advertise for new trustees. The Founder's unique position as a voluntary trustee providing a confidential clinical service at the same time as fulfilling governance requirements has caused confusion and some conflict for some trustees.</p> <p>Also, incoming trustees often have greater expectations of the charity and its processes and policies and practices and fail to recognise that it is still a micro charity with <b>only one clinician</b> holding the vision and mission of the charity in her heart and mind.</p>

<p>Summary of the main activities in relation to those purposes for the public benefit, in particular, the activities, projects or services identified in the accounts.</p>	<p>Para 1.17 and 1.19</p>	<p><b>The Relief of those in need by reason of ill health, disability or another disadvantage.</b></p> <p><b><i>Providing specialist advice, assessment, and information to disabled parents, parents with additional support needs and their families so they may access facilities and services in the community.</i></b></p> <p>The charity has established a national occupational therapy service to meet the needs of disabled parents and those parents with additional support needs. Over the past year we have received referrals and enquiries from all over the country. We also support a parent from Wales as well.</p> <p>The charity has continued to provide assessments, advice and information to clients and professionals and signposted them to local agencies as appropriate. This has occurred <b>online for most cases.</b></p> <p>This model of practice will continue because online working means that we can reach a greater number of people and services and work efficiently within COVID and sustainability guidelines.</p> <p>The Founder continues to be a member of several Facebook groups as a disabled parent. This means that she can pick up queries or concerns of other disabled mothers and pass on details of our website and service and chat more informally about possible solutions to issues raised by other parents.</p> <p>Also, other Occupational Therapists are making enquiries to Enabled2Parent for case discussions or making referrals to our service. The range of referral sources is also gradually increasing. These include fertility clinics, local authorities, Perinatal Occupational Therapists, medicolegal experts, children's and adult social workers, midwives and social prescribers.</p> <p><b><i>Enabled2Parent is concerned with the care, parenting, and establishment in life of the children and young people who are part of the families where there is a parent with a disability or additional support needs.</i></b></p> <p>The charity's founder has a wealth of experience working with children with additional needs over many years. This means the charity can offer advice and support to our parents and their families.</p>

		<p>This means the charity has been able to recognize and (with parental consent) advise on parental, child and/or professional concerns arising from the potential and actual special educational needs of the children of the parents in our care.</p> <p>The charity has also been invited to attend and participate in Child in Need Meetings and Child Protection conferences by various local authorities where the parents we are supporting have requested our help.</p> <p>This has meant we have been able to advocate for them and so empower them to have a greater understanding of the role they have as parents in maintaining the welfare of their children.</p> <p>In addition, Enabled2Parent provides short- and long-term support to parents. The charity will review progress with clients regularly and they can self-refer again if their needs change.</p> <p>The charity has also worked with other charities and organisations in the wider community to promote and address the needs and quality of life of the families we support.</p> <p>These include the Royal College of Occupational Therapy Perinatal Specialist Section, Mosaic 1898 Charity, Kidz to Adults, a Fertility Clinic in England and provided a medico-legal report for a case in Wales.</p>

The theme was entitled “Diversity of Practice in Perinatal Healthcare and took place in Birmingham.</p> <p>The outcome was very positive and lead to further invitations for Enabled2Parent to provide training to Perinatal Occupational Therapists Specialist Section at the Royal College of Occupational Therapists.</p> <p>In addition, Sarah was invited by this specialist section of her profession to be part of a much larger project to write an E Learning Module entitled Physical Disability in Pregnancy. It was a very useful day and involved therapists and service users who shared their lived experiences and hopes for the future of disability and parenting.</p> <p>This conference resulted in an occupational therapist based at Queen's Square referring an expectant mother to Enabled2Parent.</p> <p>Furthermore, the E Learning Modules will be launched on interactive platforms that have links and collaborations with educational facilities, professional bodies and health disciplines that are linked with NHS England and HEFCE. This will mean that the name and work of Enabled2Parent will be recognized and received across a wide variety of national contexts.</p> <p>The charity will also benefit financially.</p> <p>Sarah has also formed a working collaboration with a company called OT Action. This firm is based in Exeter but serves veteran serviceman. OT Action approached Enabled2Parent to ask if Sarah could carry out assessments for equipment for serviceman (based in Portsmouth) and the charity SAFFA. This commenced in June 2023 and Enabled2Parent has been paid a total of £860 for this work. This collaboration is ongoing.</p> <p><b>Opening Event</b>  Enabled2Parent hosted an Opening Event – wine and canopies evening on 5<sup>th</sup> September 2023. It was held in the Centre of Chichester and dignitaries across East and West Sussex were invited. It was opened by the Ballif of Chichester. It was a successful evening comprised of health professionals, local charities and representatives from children’s services. We had originally hoped to host it in January but postponed it until after the Summer in early September.</p> <p>It has proved to be a significant catalyst in the growth of Enabled2Parent. Now Enablted2Parent is regularly invited to attend local council events and has been able to work with the Voluntary Association for Arun and Chichester and meet other charitable organizations in the local area such as The Rotary Club, The Lions Club and Sanctuary which provides volunteers in the local area.</p> <p><b>Exhibition – The Baby Show London Olympia 2023</b>  Enabled2Parent attended and exhibited at the Baby Show at London Olympia in October. This was made possible by using funds from our grant from the National Lottery Grant.</p> <p>Sarah attended on behalf of Enabled2Parent and met a wide range of professionals and companies with connections with the parenting industry. She was able to talk about the work of the charity with</p>

Product suppliers (for the most part) were not aware about how their products could be used by disabled parents. She was asked by a Swedish firm if she would like to be an ambassador for their cradle and this is something she plans to explore.</p> <p>During the show, she met a handful of disabled parents and grandparents who took further information away with them about Enabled2Parent.</p> <p>Due to this, it may be in the best interests of the charity to fund Sarah's attendance for one day as a delegate in future. This is so that she can use it as an opportunity for continued professional development and use remaining funds to exhibit at shows that are aimed more directly at disabled people such as Naidex or the Occupational Therapy Show.</p>

<p>Achievements against objectives set</p>	<p>Para 1.41</p>	<p><b>Support Groups</b>  The charity wants to set up support groups for our beneficiaries to achieve greater <b>social inclusion</b> of our beneficiaries. This has been started in Sussex (with funding from the Sussex Community Foundation, and as part of a collaboration with Mosaic 1898 CIC.</p> <p>A curriculum was developed because of a collaboration with Mosaic 1898 in Leicester and six mothers in Sussex were identified and expressed a wish to take part.</p> <p>However, there was not enough interest in Leicester for the group to take place and in Sussex, two mothers declined to attend and each mother used the space to discuss her own needs or had other pressures to address at the time of the group.</p> <p>This showed that there is a great fear to disclose the need for support amongst disabled mothers so it was decided to advertise the opportunity for a "national group" and to advertise an online group on social media inviting mothers who want to take part to reach out to us. It was also decided to create a group where mothers could share their own experiences so they can "tailor" their own level of disclosure to those involved.</p> <p><b>A Breakthrough</b>  Enabled2Parent continues to support a mother in Wales who has a complex orthopaedic condition which is genetic in origin. She approached the charity for an assessment of her parenting needs because she needed a report to support her application to become a mother to a fertility clinic. Enabled2Parent compiled a "Parenting Forecast". This is a document that integrates the needs of a parent and their child for a two-year period.</p>

		<p>The mother used this evidence to demonstrate how she would mother her unborn child both to her local authority and the fertility clinic. Her local authority refused to accept the findings of the report that Enabled2Parent had provided. However, she was fortunate to meet a lawyer who recognised her human right to parent alongside the rights of her unborn child for support and the value of the report provided by Enabled2Parent. This meant that the fertility clinic was able to proceed with treatment and fulfil the client's desire to become a mother.</p> <p>The link to the story is below:</p> <p><a href="#">Woman with disabilities granted permission for care package allowing her chance to become a mother   Leigh Day</a></p> <p><b>Baby Book</b> Over the course of this year Enabled2Parent has supported three mothers with cognitive impairments secondary to complex needs. Through this process Sarah recognised a need to write and provide these mothers with a Baby Book that they could keep use and refer to when caring for their babies or young toddlers.</p> <p>The purpose was to create a pictorial resource that provided visual cues and simple instructions for them to refer to. The aim was to ensure that they <b>did not</b> have to remember and execute the task sequences of adaptive tasks such as dressing, changing, feeding or playing with their little ones <b>without prompting</b>.</p> <p>Aspects of parenting capacity such as safe sleep, dressing a baby for hot or cold weather, recognising signs if the baby became unwell and guidance about how to look after themselves as a mother were also included.</p> <p>Sarah issued <b>4 Baby Books</b> this year at a total cost of <b>£102</b>. These books were funded by Sussex Community Foundation for two mothers in Sussex and two parents who lived in the Northwest and Bedfordshire. These were bound hard copies so the mothers could keep them in their hospital or changing bags to refer to "on the go".</p>

<p>Summary of the main activities in relation to those purposes for the public benefit, in particular, the activities, projects or services identified in the accounts.</p>	<p>Para 1.17 and 1.19</p>	<p><b>The Relief of those in need by reason of ill health, disability or another disadvantage.</b></p> <p><i>Providing specialist advice, assessment, and information to disabled parents, parents with additional support needs and their families so they may access facilities and services in the community.</i></p> <p>The charity has established a national occupational therapy service to meet the needs of disabled parents and those parents with additional support needs. Over the past year we have received referrals and enquiries from all over the country. We also support two parents from Wales as well.</p> <p>The charity has continued to provide assessments, advice and information to clients and professionals and signposted them to local agencies as appropriate.</p> <p>This model of practice will continue because online working means that we can reach a greater number of people and services and work efficiently within COVID and sustainability guidelines.</p> <p>The combination of publishing articles and the Founder being a member of a number of Facebook groups as a disabled parent means that she can pick up queries or concerns of other disabled mothers and pass on details of our website and service and chat about possible solutions to issues raised by other parents.</p> <p>Also, other Occupational Therapists are making enquiries to Enabled2Parent for case discussions or making referrals to our service. The range of referral sources is also gradually increasing. These include fertility clinics, local authorities, Perinatal Occupational Therapists, medicolegal experts and the National Childbirth Trust.</p> <p><b><i>Enabled2Parent is concerned with the care, parenting, and establishment in life of the children and young people who are part of the families where there is a parent with a disability or additional support needs.</i></b></p> <p>The charity's founder has a wealth of experience working with children with additional needs over many years. This means the charity can offer advice and support to our parents and their families.</p>

		<p>This means the charity has been able to recognize and (with parental consent) advise on parental, child and/or professional concerns arising from the potential and actual special educational needs of the children of the parents in our care.</p> <p>The charity has also been invited to attend and participate in Child in Need Meetings and Child Protection conferences by various local authorities where the parents we are supporting have requested our help.</p> <p>This has meant we have been able to advocate for them and so empower them to have a greater understanding of the role they have as parents in maintaining the welfare of their children.</p> <p>In addition, Enabled2Parent provides short- and long-term support to parents. The charity will review progress with clients regularly and they can self-refer again if their needs change.</p> <p>The charity has also worked with other charities and organisations in the wider community to promote and address the needs and quality of life of the families we support.</p> <p>These include the Disability Union, Birthrights, Home Start, Pathfinders Neuromuscular Alliance and Disabled Living.</p>

The findings show that in 2019 – 2020 there were 14.1 million people with a disability. 19% of people of working age reported a disability and 8% of children have a disability. This means that currently there are over 700,000 working age individuals affected by disability.</p> <p>Enabled2Parent serves this section of the public who are working age parents with disabilities, and/or additional support needs and their children.</p> <p>Enabled2Parent has been established to give advice, clinical assessments, and information to disabled mothers and fathers. Para 1.20	<p>The Founder has written two articles for the professional magazines Occupational Therapy News and Disabled Living Magazine to raise awareness of the services we provide. These were published in November 2021 and February 2022.</p> <p>The Founder continues to work with the Projects Lead of the Institute of Health Visitors to write a Good Practice Guideline about Disability and Parenting. The article has been written but is undergoing the peer review process.</p> <p>The charity was invited to speak at the Annual Conference of Jacqueline Webb about The Medico-Legal Perspective of Supporting Disabled Parents. This was held in Birmingham and the charity received a positive response. Experts in attendance ranged from lawyers, allied health professionals and care experts.</p> <p>It is hoped these initiatives will enable the charity to reach a wider variety of professionals and services which may lead to their working together in different ways. Enabled2Parent continues to reach a wide variety of parents from diverse backgrounds through social media. We have over 700 followers and our page is becoming known and shared over a variety of disabled parent groups, charities, and commercial organisations.</p> <p>Enabled2Parent has appointed a Champion for Fathers who provides peer support to disabled fathers. This is an area of our provision which makes us unique, and we plan to invest and develop this work over the coming year.</p>

		<p>Enabled2Parent has a growing community on social media with <b>over 700 followers</b>. The posts included here provide articles about life as a disabled parent, equipment ideas for baby and childcare.</p> <p>The charity recognizes the power of social media as a platform for parents with disabilities to connect and support each other. The trustees will be looking at creative ways to keep our material current and relevant to our followers over the coming year.</p> <p>The charity has been able to advocate for clients during meetings with professionals and educate them about the reality and challenges of parenting with a disability. The professionals have told us that they have felt well informed about the needs of parents with disabilities such that their decision making has been enhanced as a direct result of our involvement.</p> <p>As a result, we have found that new mothers and fathers have been closed to Children's Services earlier because Enabled2Parent can provide risk assessments and ongoing clinical and emotional and peer support to families and their children to empower them and keep them safe.</p> <p>The charity has given a talk to the charity "Up" (an organisation for adults with cerebral palsy) about parenting with a disability.</p> <p>The charity has worked with the Pathfinder Neuromuscular Alliance to produce a module giving insight to how parents with these conditions can work with their personal assistants to maximize their parenting roles and family life. This forms part of an online training course</p> <p>The charity has started discussions with Brthrights (an organization that addresses the legal rights of women in childbirth to write a facts sheet about disability and parenting.</p> <p>In addition, an NHS service called Getting Over The Bump (St Georges Hospital London) approached the charity to explore creative ways they could find to fund, develop and raise awareness of their service.</p> <p>The charity has been awarded a grant by the Sussex Community Foundation Trust to fund a six-week online support group for mothers and fathers with disabilities or additional support needs. It is anticipated the course will be piloted in Sussex and then rolled out over the rest of the country if successful.</p>

		<p>The charity has also been awarded a grant from the National Lottery Community Fund. This will be used to exhibit at shows, set up support groups for disabled mothers in different areas of the country, host a reception for dignitaries and develop our provision for disabled fathers.</p> <p>Below are a couple of case studies which demonstrate the positive impact of the charity and support it has provided to families we support.</p> <p>The first lady was referred to us by a Children's Social Worker in the North of England. The referring party asked for guidance as the client had a rare genetic condition which affected her parenting capacity to safely parent her child. The client lived with her mother and the local authority was working with the family to seek a parenting order, so her mother had parental responsibility.</p> <p>Despite this, both our client and her mother wished that our client should be actively involved in parenting and raising her child.</p> <p>Enabled2Parent was invited to sit in on the parenting capacity assessment sessions carried out by Childrens Services. It became clear that our client found it hard to retain and recall more complex ideas and information.</p> <p>It was identified that the client benefited more from visual information rather than lots of words. Enabled2Parent suggested the provision of a "Baby Book" which the charity wrote and produced.</p> <p>The aim was that our client could refer to and use so that she could "look up" and read about various common baby care tasks and how to carry them out, safety issues, how to bond and play with baby, getting out and about and how to look after herself as a new Mum. The book was more pictorial, and topics were covered on no more than two pages of A4.</p> <p>In addition, the charity carried out a disability support needs assessment for the Obstetrics Team at the hospital where our client was due to give birth.</p> <p>This is a tool that enables us to identify the care and mobility needs of our client to enable the staff looking after her to know and understand exactly what the client will need before and after birth as well as a summary of her disability and the impact this will have on her during and after birth. We also recommended an accessible private ensuite bedroom where she and her mother could stay so her mother could be with her and work with the staff to support her daughter as needed.</p>

		<p>Later, her mother told us that the birth had been quite traumatic, and the provision of a private room meant that she could stay with her daughter throughout the delivery and afterwards. She was very grateful for the privacy, understanding and positive start her daughter had because of this reasonable adjustment.</p> <p>Furthermore, our client's mother told us that her daughter continues to use the baby book and is developing "mothering instincts" and her confidence in carrying out day to day baby care is increasing.</p> <p>Secondly, a family were referred to us via their Children's Social Worker who wanted some advice as she was concerned that the Service was not achieving very much positive change in the situation.</p> <p>This was a family of five (three children under 5 years old, one with suspected autism) and two parents – father with a neurological condition and visual issues and a mother with a mental health condition. The family were also living in cramped conditions that was affecting their stress levels, health and wellbeing.</p> <p>The charity was invited to join the team of professionals to understand the dynamics of the family and the issues involved. It was quickly identified that the charity could help the situation in the following ways;</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• providing an assessment of the impact of both parents' disabilities on parenting their children</li> <li>• liaison with the welfare department of the housing association to review the banding and an OT report to escalate the need for a larger property.</li> <li>• A referral to a specialist psychiatrist and a discussion with the vision specialist for the father.</li> <li>• The charity carried out a behavioral observation check list and produced an observation chart which was used as supporting evidence to refer the eldest child to the Caudwell Children's Trust for a diagnosis of a neuro- divergent condition.</li> </ul> <p>The outcomes of the support the charity provided were:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The family was given a larger 4- bedroom property. The father's needs around his behaviour, difficulties and vision were assessed and treated.</li> </ul>
