In planning our activities for the year, *Yahushua World Harvest Time Ministries* guidance on public benefit and in particular the specific guidance on charities for the advancement of religion. TRUSTEES' REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 04TH MARCH 2022

The trustees present their annual report together with the unaudited financial statements of the charity for the year ended 04th March 2021. The Trustees confirm that the Annual Report and financial statements of the charity comply with the current statutory requirements, the requirements of the Charity's governing document and the provisions of the Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP) "Accounting and Reporting by Charities" issued in March 2005.

REVIEW OF FINANCIAL POSITION

The financial statements covered the operation of *Yahushua World Harvest Time Ministries* guidance they have been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the 2005 Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP)

For the year ended 04th March 2022, the financial activities show total incoming resources of £14,756 which is the total tithes and offering donations received from members. This was disbursed mainly on charitable activities and total expenditure amounted to £14,844. We closed the year with a net operating loss of £88.

STATEMENT OF TRUSTEE'S RESPONSIBILITIES

The trustees are responsible for preparing the Trustee's report and the financial statements in accordance with applicable law.
