#### **Activities carried out to reach objectives**

The charity has implemented many projects and appeals in order to achieve its charitable objectives. This includes but is not limited to:

- Water Projects that provide fresh, clean water to those who would otherwise have difficult access to safe water. This includes hand pumps, water wells, solar water wells and water tankers
- Food Aid Projects – Supplying either hot meals or food packs around the globe
- Medical Aid in various forms sent in Emergency Appeals
- Housing Project – Repairing and Building homes for those most vulnerable
- Educational Projects such as Hifz Sponsorships, Quran distributions and Dawah sessions
- Masjid Projects – Another new Masjid built
- Zakat Cash Distributions and other Zakat applicable projects
- Yearly Ramadan Projects
- Yearly Qurbani Project
- Eid Toys & Gifts Project
- Emergency Aid provided to help with crises such as Morocco Earthquake, Libya Floods, Bangladesh Floods and Gaza Emergency
- Self-Sustainable Projects to help people maintain an on-going source of income
- UK Projects to help nationally
- Winter projects – continuing our annual winter appeals

#### **Achievements and performance**

This year has seen the charity stabilize with regular donations and constant support. Throughout the globe there have been many crises which required worldwide charities to come together to help support those affected

Gaza in particular has needed the international community to come together to help ease the suffering. There have also been natural disasters such as the earthquake in Morocco, and flooding in Libya and Bangladesh. We are pleased to state that we were able to send emergency aid to all these places that were affected mainly through the donations of our amazing supporters

This year we were particularly impressed by our Dawah sessions in Zimbabwe in which an amazing 511 people reverted to Islam. We will continue implementing this project this coming year alongside our many other projects

The charity continues to implement projects continuously such as Food Aid and Water Aid projects, alongside the many other various forms of projects we carry out. As always whenever needed, we have made appeals for various projects and have had good responses to them from our donors

### **Looking ahead**

#### **Objectives and Activities**

The objective of the charity as specified in the trust deed is:

The prevention or relief of poverty or financial hardship anywhere in the world. Provide or assist in the provision of basic essentials such as food, clothing, medicine and sanitation. To advance education of orphans and children

#### **Activities carried out to reach objectives**

The charity has implemented many projects and appeals in order to achieve its charitable objectives. This includes but is not limited to:

- Water Projects that provide fresh, clean water to those who would otherwise have difficult access to safe water. This includes hand pumps, water wells, solar water wells and water tankers
- Food Aid Projects – Supplying either hot meals or food packs around the globe
- Medical Aid in the form of wheelchairs, donation towards a new hospital, ICU treatments and prosthetic limbs
- Educational Projects such as Hifz Sponsorships, Quran distributions and Dawah sessions
- Masjid Projects – We have completed the constructions of 5 new masjids in total. Two have been built in Pakistan, two in Uganda and one in Bangladesh. We continue to also provide maintenance costs where required
- Zakat Cash Distributions and other Zakat applicable projects
- Yearly Ramadan Projects
- Yearly Qurbani Project
- Eid Toys & Gifts Project
- Emergency Aid provided to Pakistan and Bangladesh in relation to helping flood victims
- Self-Sustainable Projects to help people maintain an on-going source of income

#### **Achievements and performance**

The trustees are happy with the performance of the charity this financial period and believe the charity has been able to achieve its targets. Closely matching, and maintaining the levels of the first year, are seen as a good benchmark from which the charity can operate and structure the organization. We have been able to carry out the campaigns we intended and include a few new projects that we have been planning to add since last year. The projects and feedback to the donors have been on a regular basis, so the charity is consistently aiding people where it can

### **Looking ahead**
