The good news of the Lord Jesus was preached in all Sunday Services along with at mid weekly prayer meetings and many other evangelistic events across the member churches throughout 2024. The pastors were encouraged to visit and engage with their local communities and where possible support and encourage whilst primarily sharing the good news of Jesus Christ. With a change of President later on in 2024 our prayers were to have many more gospel centred churches established in Sri Lanka.

There were several gospel outreach meetings in the first quarter of the year with many non church going families attending which including worshipping and being taught from the bible.

The various Easter gospel outreaches were well attended across the churches with many visitors worshipping at both the Good Friday and Easter Sunday services. Many local people came from many kilometres away and heard the gospel and the pastors were able to follow up and make contact with them shortly afterwards.

The Mission gathering held in May in Enfield, North London allowed the Trustees to appraise and update 50 attendees on the many outreach programmes across the Mission also provided a review of the last year. There was also an opportunity for the Chairman to provide an update on his and his friend from Germany who accompanied him on the mission visit. The meeting was well attended and all were encouraged by the reports.

Throughout spring and summer individuals and families continued to attend the special events organised. In May an event was organised in the Koorai ministry Pastor Raja and a small team visited a local Hindu village spending time with locals and praying with them. In June many stayed for lunch at the church in Devon in the Central Province and school bags and shoes were donated to local children. Throughout July and August there were many youth events organised where games were played, songs were sung and Jesus was preached.

One challenge throughout 2024 at the church in Devon was government officials notifying Pastor Sagayam that a large stone which had been embedded into the side of the building for many years had to be removed. The responsibility was on the church to have it removed. Discussions and solutions to have it removed are ongoing.

At Christmas many outreach activities took place across the mission. In Koorai in the Northern Province local schools and villages were visited with refreshments handed out as the Christmas story was read. In Elbade tea estate near the church in Venture, Central Province, bible tracts were distributed at a Christmas street drama with open air preaching

More practically the Hope of Glory missions website was upgraded along with pop up stands and give away merchandise such as fridge magnets and pens.

Mission Trip

The chairman visited all churches, pastors and elders across the mission throughout four weeks in March and April and had the opportunity to preach God's word to many local people along with having fruitful conversations. Veeman and his family were a huge encouragement to everyone connected to the mission.



The good news of the Lord Jesus was preached in all Sunday Services and other evangelistic meetings through the missions regions across 2023. The pastors were encouraged to visit and engage with their local communities and where possible help them as much as they can along with sharing the good news of Jesus Christ.

Throughout the early months of the year there was much activity across the mission with Sunday services seeing an increase in attendees and in many cases running out of space which in many ways is an excellent problem to have.

The various Easter gospel outreaches were well attended across the churches with many visitors for the Good Friday and Easter Sunday services. Many local people came and heard the gospel and the pastors were able to follow up and make contact with them shortly afterwards.

In Eachchalavakkai in the Northern Province in May the mission was able to fund the supply of dry food items such as rice, lentils, sugar, flour, noodles, biscuits, and vegetables to local communities severely affected by the cost of living crisis and economic conditions.

In June free English classes began in Wattegoda tea estate with 15 adults and 18 children attending. The classes were led by a local believer and have continued to grow in popularity allowing the local pastor to start a regular prayer meeting in the region as a result of the contacts made. The classes continued throughout the rest of the year. An area of land is being assessed to build a small unit on to accommodate more adults and children to take the lessons.

At the close of the year various Christmas gospel outreaches went well and the weather was good enough to be able to take place. 160 people attended a service in Devon in the Central Province, 120 in Venture and in Koorai in the Northern Province many children were able to worship and hear the Christmas message.

The Mission Gathering in the UK May allowed the Trustees to appraise and update the congregation on the many outreach programmes across the Mission and we were joined online by the pastors whom also spoke. There was also an opportunity for the Chairman to provide an update on his mission visit. The meeting was well attended and all were encouraged by the reports.

Mission Trip

The chairman visited all churches during July and August and preached God's word. He and his family visited all the regions, pastors and congregations across the mission and preached at three churches in the Eastern Province, Venture and the Northern Province. Veeman was also able to visit the village Koorai and local schools. He also visited some locals and shared the good news of Jesus.

A hugely encouraging year of seeing much gospel outreach.




In the months of June, September and November the dry food items such as rice, lentils, dry fish, milk powder, soya meat, onions, flour, and sugar were given to both the believers and the locals who were affected by the cost of living.

The pastor of the Church in Venture and organised several special children programmes, many children came to these events. The pastor visited the parents of those children. Also, the pastor arranged a couple of gospel meetings, and many locals came and heard the gospel.

The children's ministry at St. Claire tea estate in the Central Province went well. The children have met every Sunday evening, and were given school equipment when required, and provided with refreshments. The pastor also visits the children's parents and shares the good news.

A special youth event was organised by the pastor of Karadipoval and over 100 young people participated and greatly benefitted. Some are regularly in contact with the pastor.

The pastor of Grace & Truth church made regular visits to Kuruvil for prayer meetings and visiting locals.

The Mission Gathering in May went well. Many were encouraged by the reports, and they prayed for the mission.

Mission Trip

The chairman visited all churches during March and April and preached God's word. He visited believers and encouraged them to stand firm in their faith. Also visited some locals and shared the good news of Jesus.





The gospel of Jesus Christ was proclaimed in all Sunday Services and the other evangelistic meetings. The pastors were encouraged to visit the locals and share the good news of Jesus Christ.

Christmas gospel outreach is usually arranged in December and people are invited to come those meetings and the children are given Christmas gifts. However, in 2020, due to covid, Christmas outreach were cancelled, instead the local people were given dry food items. In 2021, many local people came to the Christmas outreach and heard the gospel, and all children were given gifts.

Easter gospel outreach is usually arranged over the Easter period. Again, due to Covid, all special outreaches were cancelled in 2021 and the pastors visited local people and gave them dry food items.

During the period April – September 2021, the dry food items such as rice, lentils, canned fish, onions, flour, and sugar were given to both the believers and the locals who were really affected by the covid.

The pastor of Church in Devon oversees the children work which takes place at St. Claire tea estate in the Central Province. The children met every Sunday evening, and they were given school equipment when they were in need, and they were given refreshments. The pastor also visits the children's parents and tries to share the good news and provided food items too.

A free evening class was organised by the pastor of Church in Devon, and it takes place in St. John Delery tea estate in the Central Province. It started with 11 children and it's still going well. The parents of these children welcomed this class as they couldn't send their children for a private tuition.

The pastor of Grace & Truth church put a small shed in Kuruvil for believers who come to Sunday Services and the prayer meeting as they have difficulties in coming to the church. Kuruvil is a remote village, there is no public transport. The local people and two believers' family meet in the shed for prayer meetings.

Every year the Mission Gathering is organised, and the supporters are invited to the gathering for prayer and fellowship. It was planned to celebrate 10th anniversary of the mission at the Bury Street Community Church on 14 November 2020 but due to the covid restrictions in the UK, it was conducted through Zoom. Again, due to Covid, the mission gathering was conducted through zoom on 13 November 2021.

The pastor of Grace & Truth Church visits Koorai to meet the local people with the intention of sharing the good news. This ministry started in 2017. In June, pastor gave dry food items to the local people were struggling due to Covid. This gave lots of opportunities to speak about the gospel.

Mission Trip

Believers from the UK go for a mission trip every year. The chairman usually goes every year but due to the covid restrictions, he could not go in 2020 and 2021.


