## **Introduction**

Serving Our Superheroes (SOS) is an award-winning Charitable Incorporated Organisation (CIO), founded by Sarah Gardner BEM BCAv on 13th April 2020 in response to the COVID-19 pandemic. Officially registered as a charity on 22nd September 2020, and with an international constitution adopted in 2021, SOS has grown into a sustainability-driven humanitarian organisation serving the vulnerable across the UK and globally.

As of July 2024, SOS has donated more than 194,013 items to individuals in need, equating to an estimated £4.5 million in retail value. The work continues to be delivered with minimal cash donations and maximum impact through sustainable sourcing and circular economy practices.

## **MAIN ACTIVITIES UNDERTAKEN FOR THE PUBLIC BENEFIT**

Since the last accounting period, we have continued to provide.....

- Toiletry packs (washbags)
- Sanitary items
- Luxury cosmetic / skin care hampers
- Dementia aids (fiddle/twiddle muffs)
- Newborn bundles - baby hats, cardigans and blankets and baby toiletry packs
- Handmade quilts and large blankets
- Pants for patients (Hospital trousers)
- Books / toys / stationery and ELSA support aids
- Supported the South Tees Hospital / James Cook University Hospital 'Pink Box' campaign.
- Clothing – Including hats, gloves and heated waistcoats
- Items to support the homeless & those in supported living

The Pants for Patients programme, launched in February 2022, exceeded 2,323 handmade trousers by July 2025, helping hospital and hospice patients maintain dignity and comfort.

Pant for Patients, have been donated to the following locations;

1. Hillingdon Hospital
2. Michael Sobell Hospice
3. Harlington Hospice
4. Chelsea and Westminster Hospital
5. Northwick Park Hospital
6. West Herts Teaching Hospital
7. Fur Clements – To distribute to hospitals in the Wigan area
8. Nigeria via Rotary
9. South Tees Hospital / James Cook University Hospital.

These trousers are important because many patients arrive in hospital with damaged or unsuitable clothing, the basic hospital gowns are open and so it's hard to move around. So that patients aren't stuck in bed, unisex, drawstring trousers can be made and donated to hospitals. Loose adjustable trousers are great for all sizes and are easy to get on and off. These are great for anyone who has been in an accident and had their clothes damaged, for elderly patients and for maternity patients - the loose clothing is perfect to wear around the hospital. Allowing patients to be able to move around with dignity helps to reduce bed sores and muscle wastage.

## Partnerships and Sustainability

- **Clean Conscience** and **InKind Direct** have helped SOS reduce carbon emissions by providing surplus hygiene goods.
- Offcut materials from trousers and washbags were used to make **children's dresses** for baby banks and hospitals, promoting a zero-waste model.
- All trousers and washbags are made from **upcycled fabrics**
- SOS reduces landfill by **redistributing corporate surplus**
- SOS works toward **hygiene dignity** for the homeless, reducing hospital admissions due to hygiene-related conditions

In January 2024 we Partnered with Clean Conscience, this has allowed us to provide more toiletry packs (care kits) and has allowed us to reduce our carbon footprint.

These care kits include soap, shampoo & conditioner, bodywash and a toothbrush and toothpaste, as a minimum. They often also include vanity kits, sewing kits (which is useful for the homeless for darning socks), moisturiser/body lotion and lip balm.



Ensuring that there is a dental kit in every care pack, because good oral hygiene is so important. researchers have found a strong link between dental plaque buildup and gum disease (gingivitis) and Alzheimer's disease and dementia. Not only that but tooth decay can cause all sorts of pain and problems.

Wash kits help to stop the spread of preventable, debilitating diseases which costs the NHS millions each year. Between 2018 – 2021 a total of 38% of respondents of the Homeless Health Needs Audit had been admitted to hospital in the last 12 months. Common symptoms among people experiencing homelessness (such as stomach problems, skin infections and urinary problems) could be prevented with good hygiene. Individuals have passed away from preventable illnesses on the streets, simply because of an inability to get clean. homeless people often receive stigma in public by not having the opportunity to maintain good personal hygiene.

### **More than just a washbag**

Our toiletry packs / wash kits are more than just a washbag for the homeless

The number of people experiencing homelessness in the United Kingdom has been steadily increasing over the last 15 years, although a nationwide problem, it is much more prevalent in London.

The number of people using food banks has quadrupled over the last few years. Even people working full time, struggle to pay for essentials and attend food banks. Food banks supply more than just food, toiletries and other essentials.

Hygiene poverty and period poverty are all too common. As a charity we play part supplying toiletries, period products and other essentials to people in need in the community.

## **Homelessness and hygiene:**

Recent research from Shelter showed at least 309,000 people in England spent the end of 2023 homeless. This is an increase of 14%, 38,100 people, in one year. The total number of people experiencing homelessness in London has risen 11%, from 150,000 to 167,000 people. This accounts for around 1 in 51 people. In Birmingham it's 1 in 71.

As well as preventing the spread of disease, maintaining good personal hygiene is critical for maintaining good physical and mental health.

Findings from the Homeless Health Needs Audit states the number of people with a mental health diagnosis has increased substantially from 45% in 2014 to 82% in 2021. The most common condition of which was depression. Those who have no choice but to sleep rough are 9 times more likely to take their own life than the average person. Being powerless to maintain personal hygiene exacerbates feelings of inadequacy, and compromises mental and physical well-being.

Being clean can help create a feeling of confidence and motivation, feelings essential for creating positive change. Many people facing homelessness experience low self-esteem and low motivation, exacerbated by a lack of resources to enable them to look after themselves.

Oral hygiene is so important for physical health, and this is why we aim to include dental kits in all our washbags.

## **Fundraising**

As well as receiving items that are re-distributed to us, or made for us we also need to fundraise to purchase additional items. For instance, we have had baby clothes and blankets knitted for us, but we purchase the baby toiletry packs and nappies, to go with them, for the baby banks. We purchase deodorants and sanitary towels, to go to ShowerBox, homeless shelters and hospices.

In **June 2024**, SOS launched a **charity lottery** via One Lottery to help sustain core operations. Most donations come in the form of goods or services, supplemented by:

- Community fundraisers
- Donations from partners and the public
- Occasional small grants and relief fund contributions

- Toiletry kits and food support during the cost-of-living crisis

- Emotional support tools (puppets, dolls) for children via school ELSAs

# NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS

## 30 September 2024

---

### 1 Accounting Policies

#### Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to the charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015) – (Charities SORP (FRS 102)), the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) and the Companies Act 2006.

#### Change in basis of accounting or to previous accounts

There have been no changes to the accounting policies (valuation rules and method of accounting) since last year and no changes have been made to the accounts for previous years.

#### Fund Accounting Unrestricted Funds

These are available for use at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of the general objects of the charity.

#### Income Recognition of Income

Income is included in the statement in the Statement of Financial Activities (SoFA) when the charity becomes entitled to, and virtually certain to receive, the income and the amount of the income can be measured with sufficient reliability.

#### Donations and legacies

Voluntary income has received by way of donations and gifts is included in the SoFA when receivable and only when the charity has unconditional entitlement to the income.

#### Tax reclaims on donations and gifts

Income from tax reclaims in income in the SoFA at the same time as the gift/donation to which it relates.

#### Donated services and facilities

These are only included in income (with an equivalent amount in expenditure) where the benefits to the Charity is reasonably quantifiable, measurable and material.

#### Volunteer help

The value of any volunteer help received is not included in the accounts.

#### Expenditure Recognition of expenditure

Expenditure is recognised on an accrual's basis. Expenditure includes any VAT which cannot be fully recovered and is reported as part of the expenditure to which it relates.

Expenditure on charitable activities	These comprise the costs incurred by the Charity in the delivery of its activities and services in the furtherance of its objects, including the making of grants and governance costs.
Governance costs	These include those costs associated with meeting the constitutional and statutory requirements of the Charity, including any audit/independent examination fees, costs linked to the strategic management of the Charity, together with a share of other administration costs.
Other expenditure	These are support costs not allocated to a particular activity.

#### Taxation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

#### Trade and other debtors

Trade and other debtors are recognised at the settlement amount due after any trade discount offered. Prepayment are valued at the amount prepaid net any trade discounts due.

#### Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents comprise cash at bank and on hand, demand deposits with banks and other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less and bank overdrafts. In the statements of financial position, bank overdrafts are shown within borrowings or current liabilities. In the Statement of Cash Flows, cash and cash equivalents are shown net of bank overdrafts that are repayable on demand and form an integral part of the company's cash management.

#### Trade and other creditors

Short term creditors are measured at the transaction price. Other creditors and provisions are recognised where the charity has a present obligation resulting from a past event that will probably result in the transfer of funds to a third party and the amount due to settle the obligation can be measured or estimated reliably. Creditors and provisions are normally recognised at their settlement amount after allowing any trade discounts due.

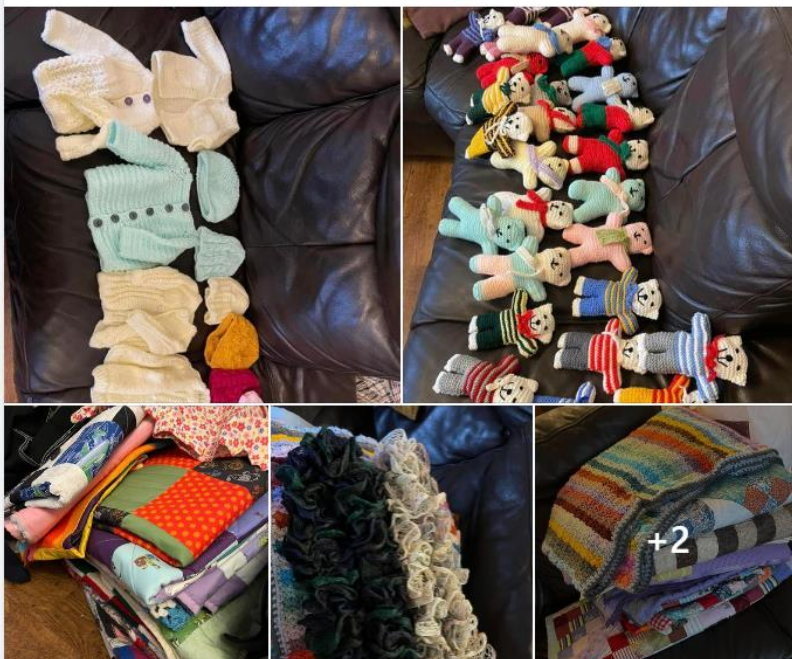

## **Introduction**

Serving Our Superheroes started life as a project on 13<sup>th</sup> April 2020, in response to the Covid pandemic, we registered as a charity on 22<sup>nd</sup> September 2020 and updated our constitution to become international on 26<sup>th</sup> September 2021.

This is our 3rd accounting period is up to 30<sup>th</sup> September 2023. at the time of writing this report, 25<sup>th</sup> July 2024, Serving Our Superheroes has been running for just over 4 years and has donated **184,487 items** with an estimated retail value of between £3.6 - 4 million pounds (approx. value of the items donated). We have had some cash donations but have mainly had items donated to us and volunteers have made items on our behalf. We have been able to maximise our funds by purchasing items at a fraction of the retail cost, though our charity suppliers, who have also donated items to us.

## **MAIN ACTIVITIES UNDERTAKEN FOR THE PUBLIC BENEFIT**

Serving Our Superheroes provides toiletry packs and sanitary items, to the NHS, the homeless, victims of domestic violence and those in the community; supporting schools, churches and foodbanks, care homes, baby banks etc, to get items out to those in need. We also provide crisis support and as well as toiletries we provide hospital trousers 'Pants for Patients', hand knitted items; baby clothes, hats and blankets, dementia aids (fiddle/twiddle muffs) & bespoke care kits.

We started back in April 2020, during COVID, providing laundry bags (for care workers to put their uniforms in, in the washing machine), to prevent the spread of the infection via uniforms. During the COVID-19 pandemic we also provided care kits and treat packs for key workers. We provided washbags/toiletry packs filled with soap, shampoo, shower gel, dental kits, hand gel, shaving kits, moisturisers etc. for both hospital staff and patients. We also provided various bespoke care packs. At the request of a local hospital, we provided miscarriage care packs. One hospital was having patients with complex care needs, particularly refugees and were facing a high number of miscarriages. We provided newborn baby essentials for Afghan refugees that were attending our local hospital (Hillingdon Hospital). We provided shoes for the refugees and family care kits with toys, books, stationary, toiletries and food. At the start of the cost-of-living crisis we provided school uniforms, in a joint project with the London community Kitchen and Share Wear. We provided toiletries and other essentials to Ukrainians. We have provided games consoles for hospices, toys and baby items to baby banks, emotion dolls to schools, teddies, sanitary items, quilts, bed linen, bins etc to care homes and sheltered housing. We support the homeless with toiletries and sanitary towels. We have provided towels to Shower Box, walking boots bag, tents and sleeping bags. We have also provided sanitary towels to Tricky Periods. We also provide toiletry packs, sanitary towels and cosmetics to domestic violence refuges and we have also provided clothes to women's refuges, community support sites / food banks. We have also provided various hampers; we have provided new-born hampers. Bags of items for new mums and Christmas hampers. We also provided luxury make up hampers and we have been providing luxury natural skin care products for hospices. As well as toiletries and skin care we provide sanitary items.

We have also provided lots of hand sanitisers and PPE over the years to hospices, hospitals (inc to Hillingdon hospital for their new bereavement centre) and to local schools. We have also provided reading books and stationery to various schools. We have also provided dementia aids (fiddle/twiddle muffs) to hospitals, hospices and people in the local community. We have also passed on good quality second hand clothing, particularly coats for the homeless. In partnership with Dress a Girl around the world, we have sent the dresses that our volunteers have made all around the world. We have made up additional luxury toiletry hampers and given these to other charities to give as raffle prizes.

**In February 2022 we set up the Pants for patient's project, since then we have provided over 2,011 pairs of handmade trousers to hospital patients. In the following locations;**

1. Hillingdon Hospital
2. Michael Sobell Hospice
3. Harlington Hospice
4. Chelsea and Westminster Hospital

6. West Herts Teaching Hospital
7. Fur Clements – To distribute to hospitals in the Wigan area

To date (July 2024) the ***Pants for Patients*** project has provided over 2,000 pairs of trousers to **8 different hospitals/ hospices**. These are important because many patients arrive in hospital with damaged or unsuitable clothing, the basic hospital gowns are open and so it's hard to move around. So that patients aren't stuck in bed, unisex, drawstring trousers can be made and donated to hospitals. Loose adjustable trousers are great for all sizes and are easy to get on and off. These are great for anyone who has been in an accident and had their clothes damaged, for elderly patients and for maternity patients - the loose clothing is perfect to wear around the hospital. Allowing patients to be able to move around with dignity helps to reduce bed sores and muscle wastage.



In January 2024 we Partnered with Clean Conscience, this has allowed us to provide more toiletry packs (care kits) and has allowed us to reduce our carbon footprint.

These care kits include soap, shampoo & conditioner, bodywash and a toothbrush and toothpaste, as a minimum. They often also include vanity kits, sewing kits (which is useful for the homeless for darning socks), moisturiser/body lotion and lip balm.

We like to ensure that there is a dental kit in every care pack. Good oral hygiene is so important. researchers have found a strong link between dental plaque buildup and gum disease (gingivitis) and Alzheimer's disease and dementia. Not only that but tooth decay can cause all sorts of pain and problems.

Wash kits help to stop the spread of preventable, debilitating diseases which costs the NHS millions each year. Between 2018 - 2021 a total of 38% of respondents of the Homeless Health Needs Audit had been admitted to hospital in the last 12 months. Common symptoms among people experiencing homelessness (such as stomach problems, skin infections and urinary problems) could be prevented with good hygiene. Individuals have passed away from preventable illnesses on the streets, simply because of an inability to get clean. homeless people often receive stigma in public by not having the opportunity to maintain good personal hygiene.

#### **More than just a washbag**

Our toiletry packs / wash kits are more than just a washbag for the homeless

The number of people experiencing homelessness in the United Kingdom has been steadily increasing over the last 15 years, although a nationwide problem, it is much more prevalent in London.

The number of people using food banks has quadrupled over the last few years. Even people working full time, struggle to pay for essentials and attend food banks. Food banks supply more than just food, toiletries and other essentials.

Hygiene poverty and period poverty are all too common. As a charity we play part supplying toiletries, period products and other essentials to people in need in the community.

#### **Homelessness and hygiene:**

Recent research from Shelter showed at least 309,000 people in England spent the end of 2023 homeless. This is a increase of 14%, 38,100 people, in one year. The total number of people experiencing homelessness in London has risen 11%, from 150,000 to 167,000 people. This accounts for around 1 in 51 people. In Birmingham it's 1 in 71.

As well as preventing the spread of disease maintain good personal hygiene is critical for maintaining good physical and mental health.

Findings from the Homeless Health Needs Audit states the number of people with a mental health diagnosis has increased substantially from 45% in 2014 to 82% in 2021. The most common condition of which was depression. Those who have no choice but to sleep rough are 9 times more likely to take their own life than the average person. Being powerless to maintain personal hygiene exacerbates feelings of inadequacy, and compromises mental and physical well-being.

Being clean can help create a feeling of confidence and motivation, feelings essential for creating positive change. Many people facing homelessness experience low self-esteem and low motivation, exacerbated by a lack of resources to enable them to look after themselves.

Oral hygiene is so important for physical health, and this is why we aim to include dental kits in all our washbags.

### **A Hug in a Bag**

Our packs bring a ray of hope to people, they show that we care and are thinking of them. Often it is the small things that make a big difference to people in need. The fact that someone has taken the time to bring something to them, can mean the world to them and bring a smile to their face. Often giving them hope.

When you are in a hospital, being able to wash and smell nice often makes you feel better.

The treat packs we provide, particularly the luxury face creams often make a real difference to patients in hospital.



We also purchase other items from In Kind Direct including deodorant and sanitary towels.

In previous years we have purchased shoes for refugees, items for bespoke care kits and even clothing to support the homeless, all provided by InKind Direct.

Both Clean Conscience and in Kind Direct, receive surplus and redundant assets, directly from businesses, which would otherwise go to landfill. These are then donated to us in the case of Clean Conscience and purchased by us, at a reduced rate, from InKind Direct.

#### TOILETRIES AMNESTY

We also get items donated from the community and through Toiletries Amnesty. We all work together towards ending hygiene poverty. By stopping wastage and helping people in need.

We work out who needs what where, and then we get the donations in and make up distribute them, in packs to various charities, community groups, homeless shelters, schools and end users, as appropriate. Sometimes we purchase items to supplement the packs, depending on what is needed by our customers.

Recently due to the ongoing cost of living crisis we have helped with school pantries, with toiletries, toilet roll, sanitary towels and other essentials.

### **Sustainability**

We are reducing the carbon footprints by reclaiming and redistributing surplus or redundant assets ensuring that nothing goes to waste.

We also use re-cycled materials for our washbags and trousers. The left-over material from the trousers is also used to make children's dresses and children's trousers. These items then go to baby banks and children's hospitals.

### **Fundraising**

As well as receiving items that are re-distributed to us or made for us we also need to fundraise to purchase additional items. For instance, we have had baby clothes and blankets knitted for us, but we purchase the baby toiletry packs and nappies, to go with them, for the baby banks. We purchase deodorants and sanitary towels, to go to ShowerBox, homeless shelters and hospices.

In June 2024 we set up a fundraising lottery, which is administered via one lottery. We are hoping that this will help us raise funds to run the charity.

Homeless support



- Shower Box (London & Birmingham)

Showerbox provide free and secure shower space for those facing homelessness. They operate two mobile shower units, one in London and another in Birmingham. We have provided towels, clothes, sleeping bags, boots, toiletries and sanitary towels to ShowerBox over the last 4 years.

Over the last 4 years demand has grown and they have gone from providing support to 20 homeless individuals per session to 200 per session.

We have also provided Sanitary towels to Caroline at Tricky periods, to distribute to the street homeless. We work together to end period poverty.

- The Open Kitchen (Hounslow)

Food poverty within the UK is a growing problem with 1 in 5 people now struggling to put food on the table. Both London and Nottingham are home to some of the most deprived areas in the country, with thousands experiencing food poverty on a daily basis, ranging from homeless people to low-income families. Due to the severity of this issue, Muslim Hands established the Open Kitchen, a community kitchen for those affected by food poverty in West London. After the overwhelming response we received, we were able to open a second kitchen in Nottingham. Serving around 500 meals daily, The Open Kitchens also provide a warm, community-centred space where people are welcomed with respect and compassion.

## **TRUSTEES' REPORT- continued**

We have provided food containers and toiletries to the branch in Hounslow, West London. Our toiletry packs are great because they can come in and have a meal, and then take a care pack with them when they leave. Ehsan Choudary who runs the Open Kitchen, often makes up survival bags for the homeless with warm clothes and sleeping bags and we provide toiletry packs and sometimes knitted hats, and socks in the winter, to go in these.

- Olympic House

Olympic House is an emergency housing service for the homeless in Hillingdon. We provide toiletry packs to them, many of the residents have been living on the streets and have not had a shower for months and they arrive with nothing. The toiletry packs that we provide, means that when they arrive, they can have a nice shower and clean their teeth. We have also provided quilts, that have been kindly donated to us by the Women's Institute.

- Trinity Housing & Hillingdon Homeless Outreach

Trinity housing manage Olympic house, they also support families in need, providing housing for them. We supply care kits for individuals and also children and baby items for families in need.

We also provide toiletry packs to homeless outreach workers in Hillingdon and are part of 'Helping the Homeless Hillingdon'. We provide care kits (toiletries and sanitary towels) and on occasion woolly hats, gloves and socks.

On occasion we also directly distribute to the homeless around London.

- SHOC – Slough Homeless Our Concern

SHOC (Slough Homeless Our Concern) is a day centre that exists to provide care for the homeless in Slough and those at risk of becoming so. It is the only centre within a 20-mile radius that offers the homeless both crisis care and long term transformational help towards independence. We provide toiletries to them, along with any other donations that we receive including warm clothing and shoes. We also provide boxes of sanitary towels.

- Ealing Soup Kitchen

Ealing Soup Kitchen is a charity that seeks to help anyone who needs hot, nutritious food & a helping hand. They have been running a weekend Soup Kitchen since 1973 at St John's Church in Ealing for the homeless, vulnerable, and impoverished. They also run Monday & Friday drop-ins where they provide clothes, food, a barber, showers, foot care, practical help, and games. We supply toiletries to them and sanitary towels on a regular basis and other items such as shoes, clothes etc when we get the opportunity.

- Our Lady of the Visitation Greenford – Breakfast club & Ealing Night Shelter

Supporting the homeless with toiletry packs / care kits.

- Build on belief together with Addiction Recovery Community Hillingdon

*Build on belief is a new organisation that we have started to support and we hope to be able to support them with more items on an ongoing basis.*

*Build on belief together with Addiction Recovery Community Hillingdon help people overcome addictions. Many are living on the streets and need support to get their lives back on track, being able to wash, eat and connect with others will help them to do that. #### 1 Accounting Policies

##### Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to the charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015) – (Charities SORP (FRS 102)), the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) and the Companies Act 2006.

##### Change in basis of accounting or to previous accounts

There have been no changes to the accounting policies (valuation rules and method of accounting) since last year and no changes have been made to the accounts for previous years.

##### Fund Accounting

Unrestricted Funds      These are available for use at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of the general objects of the charity.

##### Income

Recognition of Income      Income is included in the statement in the Statement of Financial Activities (SoFA) when the charity becomes entitled to, and virtually certain to receive, the income and the amount of the income can be measured with sufficient reliability.

Donations and legacies      Voluntary income has received by way of donations and gifts is included in the SoFA when receivable and only when the charity has unconditional entitlement to the income.

Tax reclaims on donations and gifts      Income from tax reclaims in income in the SoFA at the same time as the gift/donation to which it relates.

Donated services and facilities      These are only included in income (with an equivalent amount in expenditure) where the benefits to the Charity is reasonably quantifiable, measurable and material.

Volunteer help      The value of any volunteer help received is not included in the accounts.

##### Expenditure Recognition expenditure

of      Expenditure is recognised on an accrual's basis. Expenditure includes any VAT which cannot be fully recovered and is reported as part of the expenditure to which it relates.

Expenditure on charitable activities      These comprise the costs incurred by the Charity in the delivery of its activities and services in the furtherance of its objects, including the making of grants and governance costs.

Governance costs      These include those costs associated with meeting the constitutional and statutory requirements of the Charity, including any audit/independent examination fees, costs linked to the strategic management of the Charity, together with a share of other administration costs.

Other expenditure      These are support costs not allocated to a particular activity.

#### Taxation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

#### Trade and other debtors

Trade and other debtors are recognised at the settlement amount due after any trade discount offered. Prepayment are valued at the amount prepaid net any trade discounts due.

#### Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents comprise cash at bank and on hand, demand deposits with banks and other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less and bank overdrafts. In the statements of financial position, bank overdrafts are shown within borrowings or current liabilities. In the Statement of Cash Flows, cash and cash equivalents are shown net of bank overdrafts that are repayable on demand and form an integral part of the company's cash management.

#### Trade and other creditors

Short term creditors are measured at the transaction price. Other creditors and provisions are recognised where the charity has a present obligation resulting from a past event that will probably result in the transfer of funds to a third party and the amount due to settle the obligation can be measured or estimated reliably. Creditors and provisions are normally recognised at their settlement amount after allowing any trade discounts due.

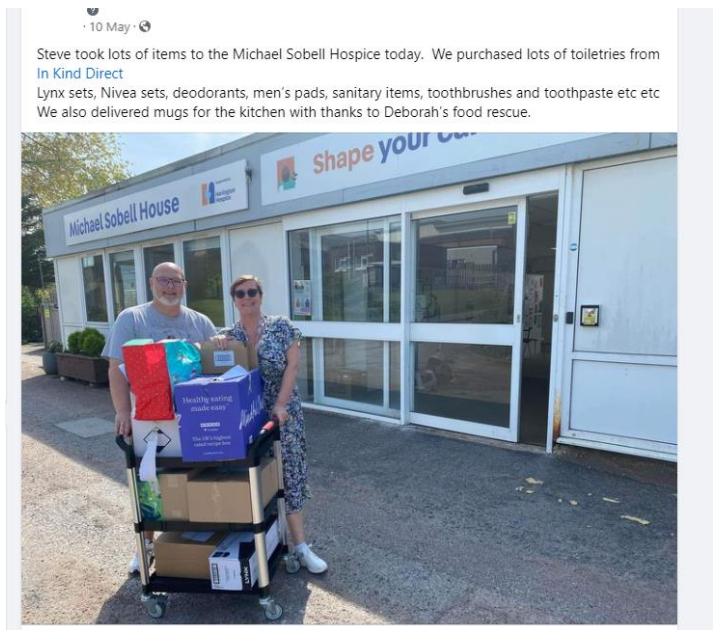

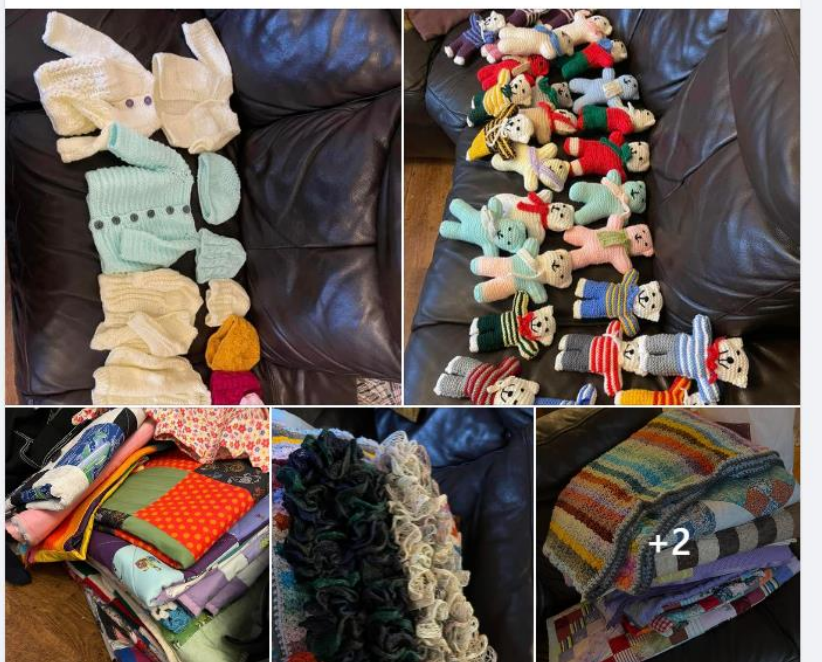

#### **Introduction**

Serving Our Superheroes started life as a project on 13<sup>th</sup> April 2020, in response to the Covid pandemic, we registered as a charity on 22<sup>nd</sup> September 2020 and updated our constitution to become international on 26<sup>th</sup> September 2021.

This is our 2nd accounting period is up to 30<sup>th</sup> September 2022. Up to the end of this accounting period (30<sup>th</sup> September 2022/ after 2 ½ years of operating) we had donated 165, 644 items. And at the time of writing this report, 22<sup>nd</sup> July 2023, Serving Our Superheroes has been running for just over 3 years and has donated 171,554 items, with an estimated retail value of over 3.5 million pounds (approx. value of the items donated).

We have had some cash donations but have mainly had items donated to us and volunteers have made items on our behalf. We have been able to maximise our funds by purchasing items at a fraction of the retail cost, though our charity suppliers, who have also donated items to us.

#### **MAIN ACTIVITIES UNDERTAKEN FOR THE PUBLIC BENEFIT**

Serving Our Superheroes provides items to those in need, from hospital, hospice, and care home patients to the homeless and people in the community suffering from hardship.

We started back in April 2020, during COVID, providing laundry bags (for care workers to put their uniforms in, in the washing machine), to prevent the spread of the infection via uniforms. We then provided washbags/toiletry packs filled with soap, shampoo, shower gel, dental kits, hand gel, shaving kits, moisturisers etc. We have continued to provide the toiletry packs (washbags) but also provide other items including; dementia aids (fiddle/twiddle muffs), emotion dolls, teddies, sanitary items, quilts, blankets, knitted baby hats and cardigans, nappies, wipes and baby wash, toys, sanitary items, larger baby products i.e. mosses baskets, cots, change stations, handmade girls cotton dresses, cotton trousers (for hospital patients), sleeping bags, clothes, shoes, family care packs and more.

We have also provided bespoke care packs. At the request of a local hospital, we provided miscarriage care packs. One hospital was having patients with complex care needs, particularly refugees and were facing a high number of miscarriages.



We have provided family packs for refugees, with toys, toiletries and other essentials. and pallets of shoes for refugees and the homeless

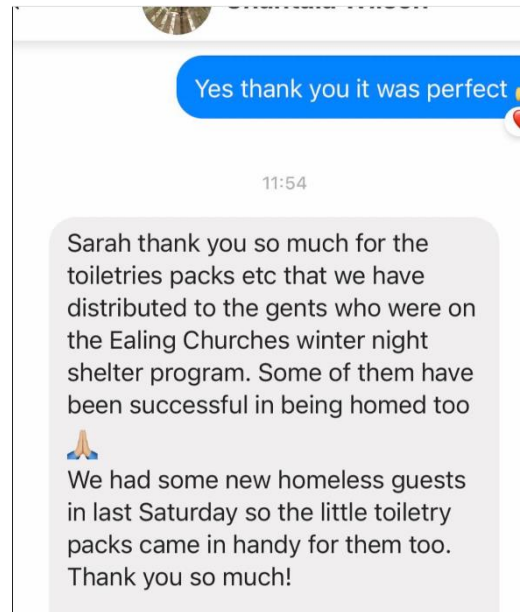
We provided baby kits for families that had arrived with nothing for their babies. We made custom kits with everything that they needed - these included a bowl that could be used to clean the bottles and wash the baby clothes and doubled as a baby bath. Cold water sterilisers, so that the bottles could be sterilised, nappies, blankets, hat, botties, bottle, dummy, vest and clothes for the baby.

We have provided various hampers; we have provided new-born hampers. Bags of items for new mums and Christmas hampers. We also provided luxury make up hampers and we have been providing luxury natural skin care products for hospices.

We have also continued with the project '**Pants for Patients**' & have provided over 1,000 pairs of trousers to 5 different hospitals/ hospices. These are important because many patients arrive in hospital with damaged or unsuitable clothing, the basic hospital gowns are open and so it's hard to move around. So that patients aren't stuck in bed, unisex, drawstring trousers can be made and donated to hospitals. Loose adjustable trousers are great for all sizes and are easy to get on and off. These are great for anyone who has been in an accident and had their clothes damages, for elderly patients and for maternity patients - the loose clothing is perfect to wear around the hospital. Allowing patients to be able to move around with dignity helps to reduce bed sores and muscle wastage.

In partnership with Dress a Girl around the world, we have sent the dresses that our volunteers have made and the dresses Dress A Girl have provided, from their volunteers all around the world.... So far, we have sent dresses to Syria 🇸🇾, Uganda 🇺🇬, Zimbabwe 🇿🇼, Ghana 🇬🇭 and now we have dresses going to Cameroon 🇨🇲 We have also been sending toiletries abroad for the Ukraine refugees 🇺🇦 as well as supporting

the Afghan refugees 🇦🇫 We have sent patterns to Rukiga in Uganda and through the Click Rukiga Youth in Development programme they have themselves made hundreds of dresses and they are supporting themselves and learning new skills.

Community Links between ICKENHAM and RUKIGA in Uganda

### DRESSING THE WORLD DURING COVID



ClickRukiga – Buhangizi are expanding their youth development, and are teaching people sewing skills and ClickRukiga have been supplying the material, so that they can make dresses themselves.

The dresses are simple and easy to make and will last a long time, due to the simple and adjustable design. By giving them resources and appropriate skills, it is allowing them to be sustainable and make dresses for many years to come.

The dresses are more than just dresses, they are life skills; and they give hope and provide opportunities for girls to go to school and to have dignity.

Third world countries have been particularly affected by COVID as poverty is very severe, there isn't the same medical support, or the same numbers of people being vaccinated, so the loss of life is greater. Many family members have lost the main earner and with strict lockdowns still in place in many countries, the women can't sell items at the markets. So providing dresses and masks really is essential. Having more than one dress also helps with hygiene and by being able to cover up, it gives the girls some level of protection and confidence.

This started back in May 2021 when Jacqui, from Dress A Girl Around the World, contacted Sarah (they had both been involved in For the Love of Scrubs). Dress A Girl had been unable to send their dresses abroad due to travel restrictions in the UK and had offered some dresses to Sarah's charity, Serving Our Superheroes. Sarah had, at the time, been providing school uniforms and clothes to families who had been struggling financially due to COVID and furlough.

Jacqui told Sarah about the charity and mentioned she had



lots of dresses. Sarah continued to give the dresses out during the summer in the UK, as well as using her network to facilitate the dresses going abroad.

Serving Our Superheroes have provided hundreds of dresses and Dress A Girl have provided over 300 dresses, which have been handmade and sent to Jacqui from volunteers all over the country, which are being sent to an orphanage in Ghana.

So far, the partnership has sent over 1,500 dresses to various third world countries in the last year including Syria, Ghana and Zimbabwe.

Working with Ealing Community Aid, One Nation, Creating Better Futures and now, ClickRukiga (Sarah is also on their committee), to send patterns for masks and dresses and material ClickRukiga have purchased for the Ugandans.

As well as the team at Dress A Girl making dresses and receiving them from their volunteers, the seamstresses who

have been volunteering for Serving Our Superheroes making washbags and laundry bags have also been making dresses. It is a great partnership that has seen many dresses being sent abroad.

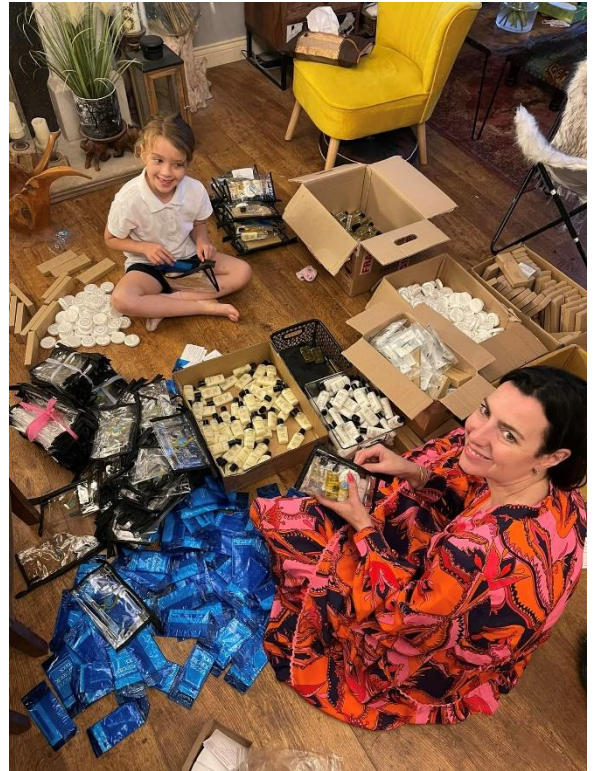

#### **Introduction**

Serving Our Superheroes started life as a project on 13<sup>th</sup> April 2020, in response to the Covid pandemic, we registered as a charity on 22<sup>nd</sup> September 2020 and update our constitution to become international on 26<sup>th</sup> September 2021.

Our first accounting period is up to 30<sup>th</sup> September 2021. Up to 30<sup>th</sup> September 2021 we had donated 67,495 items.

At the time of writing this report, 29<sup>th</sup> May 2022, Serving Our Superheroes has been running for just over 2 years and has donated 164,859 items, with an estimated retail value of over 3 million pounds for the items donated.

These items range from toiletries, washbags filled with toiletries and masks, treat packs, handmade trousers to larger value items such as games consoles, mosses baskets, luxury face creams and makeup, new designer clothes, shoes and hampers and sets. With the smaller donations ranging from £1 to £500 for larger donations, with the average donation of £20 taking the total estimated retail value to £3,297,180.00

This has had a big impact on the lives of so many people both in the UK and internationally.

Although the actual 'cash' received is small, this has been maximised by purchasing items from charity suppliers, such as InKind Direct at a fraction of the retail value and AT amenities are selling us items at cost price, often donating additional stock to us at the same time.

The charity relies mainly on the donations of handmade items from our volunteers who sew and donate the items directly to us.

#### **MAIN ACTIVITIES UNDERTAKEN FOR THE PUBLIC BENEFIT**

Serving Our Superheroes provides items to those in need, from hospital, hospice, and care home patients to the homeless and people in the community suffering from hardship, mainly due to poverty (although we do provide emotional dolls for children suffering emotional issues and dementia aids for people living with dementia).

We started back in April 2020, during COVID, providing laundry bags to frontline care workers, (hospitals, hospice, paramedics, and care homes), to prevent the spread of the infection via uniforms. We provided over 2,400 washbags in the space of a few months. By July 2020 most of the local hospitals and care homes had washbags, although we continued with a small amount of laundry bags, we found that the requirements for Foodbanks was increasing, and they needed bags. We then adapted the bag design and started donating re-usable cloth bag to Foodbanks and other charities, that they could fill with items and give to their customers.

We then provided washbags filled with toiletries, for hospital patients and for the homeless.

We also provided PPE – masks, ear guards and scrubs hats to hospitals.

We provided material face masks to the community.

We also supported the homeless and refugees with clothes, blankets, hats, towels, bedding, sleeping bags, shoes/boots, rucksacks etc

We have supported victims of domestic violence who are fleeing their homes.

During COVID we also supplied treat packs to front line key workers.

We have supported schools and families with uniforms, books, toys and emotion dolls, we have given toys and games consoles to hospitals and hospices.

We have provided bespoke care packs, including new-born baby care packs, family essentials for refugees and miscarriage care packs. We have donated many baby items from clothes and nappies to baby furniture, such as cots and mosses baskets.

We provided baby kits for families that had arrived with nothing for their babies. We made custom kits with everything that they needed - these included a bowl that could be used to clean the bottles and wash the baby clothes and doubled as a baby bath. Cold water sterilisers, so that the bottles could be sterilised, nappies, blankets, hat, botties, bottle, dummy, vest and clothes for the baby.

We have also been providing Fiddle / twiddle muffs – In conjunction with the Rotary club, as part of the Dementia Action Alliance and we have provided over 200 fiddle muffs and 30 memory boxes for people with dementia.

We have provided various hampers; we have provided new-born hampers and luxury make up hampers and we have been providing luxury natural skin care products for hospices.

Since the Covid pandemic we have continued to provide toiletries and sanitary items, to people in the community, including refugees, hospitals/hospices and to the homeless.

We have also made trousers for patients in hospitals and have set up a group called '**Pants for Patients**'.

Many patients arrive in hospital with damaged or unsuitable clothing, the basic hospital gowns are open and so it's hard to move around. So that patients aren't stuck in bed, unisex, drawstring trousers can be made and donated to hospitals. Loose adjustable trousers are great for all sizes and are easy to get on and off. These are great for anyone who has been in an accident and had their clothes damages, for elderly patients and for maternity patients - the loose clothing is perfect to wear around the hospital. So far, we have provided over 800 trousers for hospital patients.

In 2021 we started collaborating with dress a girl and we have sent thousands of dresses abroad, in partnership with Dress a Girl around the world, we have sent the dresses that our volunteers have made and the dresses Dress A Girl have provided, from their volunteers all around the world.... So far, we have sent dresses to Syria 🇸🇾 , Uganda 🇺🇬, Zimbabwe 🇿🇼, Ghana 🇬🇭 and now we have dresses going to Cameroon 🇨🇲 We have also been sending toiletries abroad for the Ukraine refugees 🇺🇦 as well as supporting the Afghan refugees 🇦🇫 We have sent patterns to Rukiga in Uganda and through the Click Rukiga Youth in Development programme they have themselves made hundreds of dresses and they are supporting themselves and learning new skills.



Currently our main offerings are toiletries and trousers (pants for patients).

Governance costs	These include those costs associated with meeting the constitutional and statutory requirements of the Charity, including any audit/independent examination fees, costs linked to the strategic management of the Charity, together with a share of other administration costs.
Other expenditure	These are support costs not allocated to a particular activity.

#### Taxation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

#### Trade and other debtors

Trade and other debtors are recognised at the settlement amount due after any trade discount offered. Prepayment are valued at the amount prepaid net any trade discounts due.

#### Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents comprise cash at bank and on hand, demand deposits with banks and other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less and bank overdrafts. In the statements of financial position, bank overdrafts are shown within borrowings or current liabilities. In the Statement of Cash Flows, cash and cash equivalents are shown net of bank overdrafts that are repayable on demand and form an integral part of the company's cash management.

#### Trade and other creditors

Short term creditors are measured at the transaction price. Other creditors and provisions are recognised where the charity has a present obligation resulting from a past event that will probably result in the transfer of funds to a third party and the amount due to settle the obligation can be measured or estimated reliably. Creditors and provisions are normally recognised at their settlement amount after allowing any trade discounts due.
