Trustees' annual report

Objectives and Activities

The Trust's objective is to develop the capacity and skills of the disadvantaged community of Lubani and its surroundings in the Jinja district of Uganda through relief of poverty and the advancement of education of skills. This is achieved through provision of life changing resources; education buildings, teachers and resources; tools and technical equipment.

During the year, Nile 2010 supported the 3rd UK expedition to the Jinja Vocational Training Centre (JVTC). The expedition aimed to further the development of the JVTC and succeeded in doing so by both contributing funds and assisting in the physical construction of a new building at the existing site.

Furthermore, the Trustees continued their advisory efforts in supporting the Jinja Vocational Centre in its expansion aspirations and pursuit of enhanced registration status with the Ugandan governmental department of education whilst ensuring suitable governance to ensure distributions made by the charity in pursuit of its aims were safeguarded.

In planning and carrying out the activities noted, the Trustees have had due regard to the commission's public benefit guidance.

Achievements and Performance

2023 saw a boost in the charitable activities for Nile 2010. In most years we raise and provide sufficient funds to support the running costs of our Vocational Training Centre in Jinja. Every 5 to 6 years we aim to support an expedition of volunteer Scouts to Uganda to expand and improve the facilities.

In summer 2023 we supported the expedition which saw 16 scouts and leaders travelling to Uganda where, working with the Ugandan team, they built two further classes at the JVTC. Using the brick making machine we purchased previously and supported by local labour, we were able to build a substantial two classroom building next to our existing facilities.

The Ugandan team, funded by Nile 2010, have continued to work on and commission the building since the departure of the expedition. This will enable more students to attend the centre and, over time, for more subjects to be offered.

Financial Review

2023 was a busy year for Nile 2010, particularly with supporting the completion of the 2023 expedition to Uganda.

We are particularly grateful to the Roger Raymond Charitable Trust for their grant funding received in the year which was applied in the capital funding of the building constructed in 2023. Their funding allowed significant work to commence on the building prior to the arrival of the expedition.

Following registering the Charity with Facebook, a number of fundraising campaigns were launched in order to drive donations for expedition members' fundraising goals. Similar campaigns operated through our existing platforms, such as Givey, and in total contributed donations of £4,000.

Fundraising costs increased as we drove towards the expedition's fundraising goals, and the number of events attended throughout the year grew.

The Trust acknowledges that its reserves have expanded during the year to £63,800 (prior year £31,600) and continues to explore the most beneficial way to apply these funds in furthering its objectives through consultation internally and with the JVTC management team.

Structure, Governance and Management

Nile 2010 is a charitable trust registered under deed, dated 04 September 2020.

Trustees must be appointed by a resolution of the trustees passed at a special meeting called under clause 15 of the trust deed. In selecting individuals for appointment as trustees, the trustees must have regard to the skills, knowledge and experience needed for the effective administration of the charity.
