I am filled with immense pride and gratitude towards our dedicated trustees, hardworking volunteers, and the generous donors who continuously contribute to our noble cause.

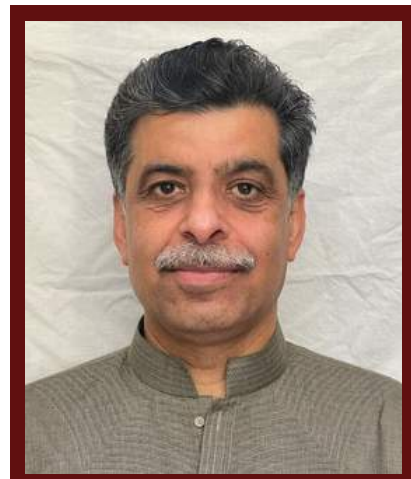

Al-Qiyas Welfare is mainly operated by volunteers who generously dedicate their time and efforts to support our cause. These volunteers are the heart and soul of

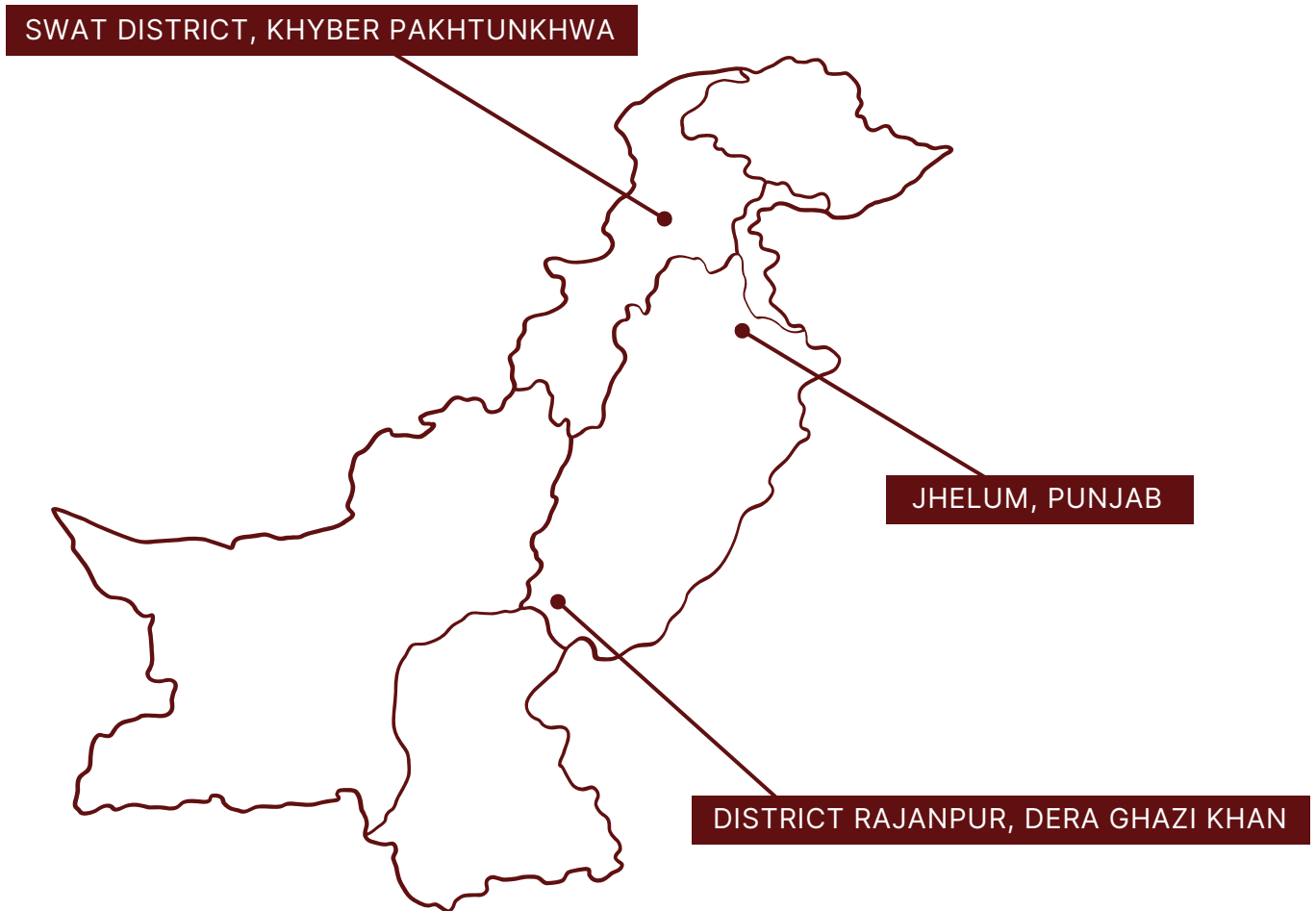

# RAMADAN 2023

Food insecurity continues to pose a significant challenge for families across the world. Many families struggle to cope in their daily life, unsure about where their next meal will come from. In response to this, charitable organisations play a crucial role in extending support to families in need.

Al-Qiyas Welfare provides food packs throughout the year to daily wage earners and low-income, vulnerable families experiencing financial hardships. These food parcels are carefully curated to contain a variety of staple food items that are essential for sustaining a family for up to a month. Each pack consists of substantial quantities of rice, flour, lentils, oil, tea, sugar and more, all purchased locally to support the community.

Like previous years, in the Islamic month of Ramadan, food packs were provided for poor and needy families to ensure that families did not go hungry and had nutritious food to break their fasts with at the end of each day without worry.

The team made certain that your generous donations went to those who were in need and truly deserving and worked tirelessly to make sure the food packs reached these families in time for Ramadan. Equally, the team dedicated significant effort to ensure all Zakat al Fitr (Fitrana) donations and Eid ul-Fitr food packs were distributed to families in need before the end of Ramadan and Eid.

By working together, we can make a meaningful difference in the lives of those who are struggling to cope with the challenges of daily life. We are grateful for the opportunity to make a positive impact and look forward to continuing our efforts to support those in need during Ramadan and beyond.





# DASTARKHWAN (COMMUNITY KITCHEN)



In efforts to tackle the problem of food insecurity and hunger in Jhelum, Al-Qiyas Welfare held regular dastarkhwans (community kitchen) for the community, throughout the year.

Hot cooked food was provided to individuals in need, including the poor, homeless, and those living on the streets. Meals were provided at no cost to anyone in need, with dignity and respect.

These community kitchens offer a helping hand to ensure that families have access to nutritious meals.

# PAKISTAN FLOODS SWAT KPK

In response to the devastating floods that hit Pakistan in 2022, Al-Qiyas Welfare team travelled to Kalam Valley in the Swat District of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Province in Pakistan.

Flood Relief Aid comprised of duvets, clothing, food packages, and medication to assist families who had lost their homes and possessions in the flood.

Duvets and food packs containing a month's supply of essential items were bought from local sources in Pakistan to support families in need in the Kalam Valley.

Clothing and footwear for women, men, and children were donated by the generous supporters of Al-Qiyas Welfare in the UK.

Thanks to the British Airways Community Team, our trustees could transport these kind donations of clothes and shoes to Pakistan as cargo at no cost.

A heartfelt appreciation goes out to the British Airways cabin crew for their dedicated efforts in collecting clothes and shoes to aid those impacted by floods.

During a relief flight to Islamabad, Pakistan on September 25, 2023, the crew generously donated these items to Al-Qiyas Welfare for distribution to those in need.

We greatly appreciate the ongoing support from the British Airways Community Investment team towards Al-Qiyas Welfare.









# SWAT KPK PAKISTAN MEDICINE & BUSINESS HELP

The floods caused significant destruction to residences, local businesses, and infrastructure. Financial aid was provided during the visit to assist individuals whose homes were affected and small business owners impacted by the floods in Bahrain Bazar, Swat.

Additionally, vital medicines were contributed to the RHC Bahrain medical camp to assist flood-affected communities in Swat, KPK. under the supervision of Dr Abrar Ahmed.

# PAKISTAN FLOODS

## DISTRICT RAJANPUR

### D.G.KHAN PAKISTAN

In January 2023, the team embarked on a second trip to provide flood aid to the extensively impacted District of Rajanpur in Dera Ghazi Khan in Pakistan where the severe flooding had resulted in hundreds of thousands of homes being damaged or destroyed.

This trip was organised in association with Chelmsford Muslim Society in the UK (Charity no. 1139707)

The team visited villages in Fazilpur and surrounding areas in District Rajanpur to survey the area, assess the situation of those affected by the floods and see the effects the floods had on peoples homes and livelihoods. The areas visited included Villages Ghulam Hussain, Zahoorwali, Nazirwali, Jaffarwala and Maula Bakhsh.

We express our gratitude to the kind donors from Al-Qiyas Welfare and Chelmsford Muslim Society. Your contributions enabled us to embark on this trip and assist those affected by the floods.

Through generous donations, food packs, water, clothing, shoes, bedding sets, and financial aid were provided to families and individuals in need of assistance.

# QURBANI

Qurbani, meaning 'sacrifice' refers to the important Islamic practice of sacrificing a livestock animal during the festival of Eid al-Adha.

Each year Al-Qiyas Welfare arranges Qurbani for needy and deserving families in Pakistan.

This year, we are grateful to have provided the largest number of animals for Qurbani compared to previous years.

For the first time we requested donations towards a Qurbani Fund in which the contributions were pooled together to offer a Qurbani of one camel.

In the three days of Eid al-Adha 2023 Al-Qiyas Welfare offered Qurbani of 1 camel and 8 cows.

With your generous contributions, we successfully distributed Qurbani meat to hundreds of underprivileged families in Pakistan.

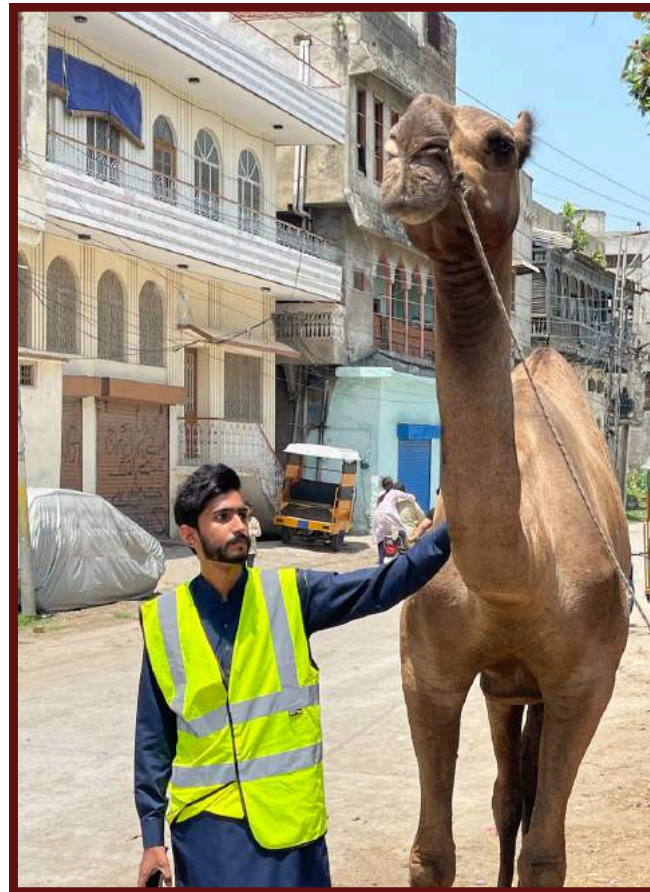
