- to advance the Orthodox Christian religion in Hampshire and the surrounding area for the benefit of the public in accordance with the doctrines and the canons of the Romanian Orthodox Patriarchate and with the statutes of the Romanian Orthodox Metropolis of Western and Southern Europe, particularly, but not exclusively, by providing a place of worship, raising awareness and understanding of Orthodox Christian beliefs and practices, and carrying out religious acts, missionary and outreach work.

Organisation of Services, Activities and Achievements during the Period

The charity has been constantly involved in the Romanian community life in the Hampshire area. The main activity of the organisation has been to supply the Orthodox Christians in Southampton and the surrounding area with the necessary means to practice and advocate their Orthodox faith. Together with the promotion of the Orthodox Christian religion, the charity has provided support for those members of the community that found themselves in difficult living situations. Those struggling to pay their bills and buy food or those battling serious illnesses have found financial and moral support within the charity. The organisation has also helped the families that needed financial help to transport the deceased back to Romania to be buried next to their loved ones. Our priest has visited members of the community in prison or hospital and offered them practical and moral support, information and advice when required. Moreover, the charity has contributed to the consolidation of unity for the Christian Orthodox community by organising Christmas plays, social gatherings and picnics.

The charity purchased the Holy Trinity Church during the year. The high level of reserves/money in deposit account at 31st December 2024 is to enable the purchase of the church hall.
