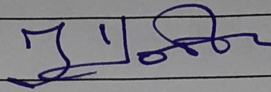
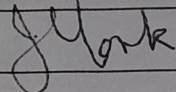

Section C. Notes to the Accounts

1. Basis of accounting

These accounts have been prepared under the historical cost convention with items recognised at cost or transaction value.

The accounts have been prepared in accordance with:

2. Financial Policies

2.1. Reserves

The Trustees consider that it is not possible, at a time of great volatility for food banks, to determine the Reserves Policy for the Charity.

2.2. Income.

The charity has adopted standard accounting practices for income except that donations in kind have not been valued. The Trustees consider that the substantial effort required to place a value on donated goods would not be worthwhile.
