The objects of the charity ('the objects') are:

- (1) To advance the education of and to raise awareness among the general public and healthcare professionals in fighting all renal cancers in the United Kingdom and in particular, but not exclusively, the subtype Renal Medullary Carcinoma (RMC).
- (2) To raise funds in order to advance research into renal cancers (as in (1) above) and to provide equipment and treatment for the same for sufferers of such medical conditions residing permanently or temporarily in the United Kingdom through the provision of financial assistance, support, and practical advice as the trustees see fit from time to time.
- (3) To relieve the sickness and preserve the health of people suffering from renal cancers (as in (1) above) and improve and extend the quality of life of people living with renal cancers (as in (1) above) who are permanently or temporarily in the United Kingdom and to support the families of such people in the event of hardship as the trustees see fit from time to time.
- (4) To provide and assist in the provision of facilities not normally provided by the statutory authorities as the trustees see fit from time to time in order to support and promote the health and rehabilitation of firefighters across the United Kingdom.

Summary of the objects of the charity set out in its governing document

The Ricky Casey Trust is newly formed charity in 2020. This report therefore only covers the period from July 2020 - April 2021, and most of the work carried out during this period has been directly related to the set up and launching of the charity. We represent the only renal cancer charity in the UK with a particular focus on rare renal cancers, particularly RMC (Renal Medullary Carcinoma)

Below is the summary of our main charitable activities during the specified reporting period:

Firstly, a website was created. This was a crucial starting point for the charity to raise awareness and begin building a relationship with the general public in a professional capacity. Our website has allowed the public to be fully aware of the charity's aims, where we are located, the impact we are making, and encourages them to become actively involved with any upcoming events. We also have a medical page that gives clinical information regarding rare renal cancers and RMC. This helps with the education of the public and health care professionals. The website is the main point of contact for any patients or carers who may require support or advice.

Alongside the website presence, we have established various social media platforms including Twitter, Instagram and Facebook. These allow us to reach out to a much larger and more varied audience in real time. The social media presence has also allowed us to story-tell and advertise our fundraising campaigns.

The charity has recruited 2 patrons of celebrity status. This has helped with raising our profile and inspired the public to identify with and respond favourably to our charity, with fundraising and donations. One of our

patrons (Sir Kevin Sinfield OBE) helped us raise awareness by completing a 51 mile run as part of our virtual running event.

Another success within the short time period has been to form important links with an RMC charity in America (CJ Johnson Foundation) and a professor who is dedicated to RMC research (Professor Pavlos Msaouel at the MD Anderson Cancer Centre, Texas) who is dedicated to RMC research in the USA. This has enabled us to learn and understand more about this rare disease. Having this contact can help us directly in the UK. The more information and links we can form with other renal charities the greater the chance of working towards trials, treatments and eventually cures in the UK.

We have worked hard to continuously raise funds through organised events, including virtual events during the Covid-19 pandemic. In collaboration with the CJ Johnson Foundation we have established an annual walking event that will continue to grow with a worldwide reach. In March 2021, this event had over 120 people take part. Nicola Casey's son ran his first ever Ultra Marathon on the final day of the virtual event to help raise additional funds. The virtual event had newspaper and media coverage. We also plan to hold a charity ball each year to be held around the birthday anniversary of Ricky Casey. These are the two main annual events that we hope will bring in funds to support our aims of advancing knowledge, education and research into rare renal cancers. For our events, we have developed branded merchandise (e.g. t-shirts, sportswear, water bottles) with our logo. This is another aspect of our fundraising campaigns.

Through the connections with the CJ Johnson Foundation, Nicola Casey (Founder and Chair of The Ricky Casey Trust) has been invited to attend monthly support peer-to-peer group meetings for RMC patients and carers via Zoom. This has helped with an understanding of the difficulties that patients and family's face after being diagnosed with RMC and all rare renal cancers. Our understanding of their needs will help any future patient contacts of The Ricky Casey Trust.

As summarised above the charity has carried out a wide range of activities towards its purpose of public benefit.

We can also confirm that all the Ricky Casey Trust trustees have had regard to the guidance issued by the charity commission on public benefit.

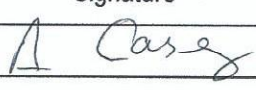
