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Structure, governance and management

LOC Foundation is charitable incorporated organisation, were incorporated on 14 October 2020.

The day to day running of the charity is led by managing trustee, Mr Faisal Ali who manages the daily activities of the charity and management related tasks. Mr Ali also participates in fundraising for the charity and travels to places where charitable activities are undertaken.

Objectives and activities

The charity helps poor families, schools, children along the line of control. This ranges from sending clothes, provide stationery equipment for schools, providing medical aid and IT equipment for the poor.

The main objectives of the organisation are:

The prevention or relief of poverty amongst those living in Kashmir Nakyal Sector by the provision of grants of items, equipment and funds to relieve their needs and the relief and assistance of people in Kashmir Nakyal Sector, who are victims of war or natural disaster, trouble or catastrophe in particular by the supply of grants.

The relief of financial need and suffering among victims of natural or other kinds of disaster in the form of money (or other means deemed suitable) for persons, bodies, organisations affected in such ways as the trustees shall think fit.

Achievements and performance

1. Education Support Across Nakyal Region

Charity delivered multiple targeted interventions to improve access to education for children in rural Azad Kashmir:

- Mouzzam Memorial Welfare Society - Nakyal

Provided 1 lac PKR (£263) to supply essential school materials including stationery, books and school bags.

- Banala Junior School - Nakyal

Donated 75,000 PKR to purchase school chairs and study tables, improving the learning environment for young students.

Impact: Strengthened educational access for children from low income families and improved classroom conditions in underserved schools.

2. Healthcare Improvements for Local Communities

Charity invested in critical healthcare infrastructure:

- Human Welfare Trust - Nakyal Hospital

Donated 2 lac PKR towards a dialysis machine, supporting life saving treatment for kidney patients.

Impact: Enhanced local hospital capacity and improved access to essential medical care for vulnerable patients.

3. Clean Water Access

- Borehole Project - Sultan Baghla

Funded a 250,000 PKR borehole installation to provide reliable access to clean water for the community.

Impact: Reduced water scarcity and improved daily living conditions for families in the area.

4. Community Infrastructure & Welfare

- Graveyard Improvements - Mohra, Nakyal

Contributed 50,000 PKR for essential upgrades to the local graveyard, overseen by a trustee.

- Nakyal (Law) Bar Association

Donated 50,000 PKR to support the creation of a small library and provision of law books for local lawyers.

Impact: Strengthened community facilities and supported professional development within the local legal community.

5. Social Welfare Support

- Orphan's Wedding Support

Provided 1 lac PKR to support the wedding expenses of an orphan, ensuring dignity and community support for a vulnerable family.

Impact: Delivered compassionate assistance to individuals facing financial hardship.

6. UK-Based Community Support

- NICOP Renewal Event - Watford

Covered £203.70 in staff food expenses for the Pakistan High Commission NADRA Mobile Team during a community NICOP renewal event organised by LoC Foundation.

Impact: Enabled local Pakistani residents in Watford to access essential identity services conveniently.

Financial review

The Charity received donation and funds £2,574 during the period. Total outgoing resources amounted to £3,965 of which £2,833 relates to restricted charitable activities and £1,132 on the costs of running the office and on other Governance costs.

Total available funds at 31 December 2025 amounted to £15,258 of which £15,258 related to unrestricted funds.

The Trustees are satisfied that the charity's activities during the period have met their objectives and are satisfied with the financial position at the period end.

1. General information

The Charitable Incorporated Organisation is a public benefit entity and a registered charity in England and Wales and is unincorporated. The address of the principal office is 18 Chestnut Walk, Watford, WD24 6NS, England.

2. Statement of compliance

These financial statements have been prepared in compliance with FRS 102, 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and the Republic of Ireland', the Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (Charities SORP (FRS 102)) and the Charities Act 2011.

3. Accounting policies

Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared on the historical cost basis, as modified by the revaluation of certain financial assets and liabilities and investment properties measured at fair value through income or expenditure.

The financial statements are prepared in sterling, which is the functional currency of the entity.

Going concern

There are no material uncertainties about the charity's ability to continue.

Judgements and key sources of estimation uncertainty

There are no material uncertainties about the charity's ability to continue.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds are available for use at the discretion of the trustees to further any of the charity's purposes.

Designated funds are unrestricted funds earmarked by the trustees for particular future project or commitment.

Restricted funds are subjected to restrictions on their expenditure declared by the donor or through the terms of an appeal, and fall into one of two sub-classes: restricted income funds or endowment funds.

3. Accounting policies *(continued)*

Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included in the statement of financial activities when entitlement has passed to the charity; it is probable that the economic benefits associated with the transaction will flow to the charity and the amount can be reliably measured. The following specific policies are applied to particular categories of income:

- income from donations or grants is recognised when there is evidence of entitlement to the gift, receipt is probable and its amount can be measured reliably.
- legacy income is recognised when receipt is probable and entitlement is established.
- income from donated goods is measured at the fair value of the goods unless this is impractical to measure reliably, in which case the value is derived from the cost to the donor or the estimated resale value. Donated facilities and services are recognised in the accounts when received if the value can be reliably measured. No amounts are included for the contribution of general volunteers.
- income from contracts for the supply of services is recognised with the delivery of the contracted service. This is classified as unrestricted funds unless there is a contractual requirement for it to be spent on a particular purpose and returned if unspent, in which case it may be regarded as restricted.

Resources expended

Expenditure is recognised on an accruals basis as a liability is incurred. Expenditure includes any VAT which cannot be fully recovered, and is classified under headings of the statement of financial activities to which it relates:

- expenditure on raising funds includes the costs of all fundraising activities, events, non-charitable trading activities, and the sale of donated goods.
- expenditure on charitable activities includes all costs incurred by a charity in undertaking activities that further its charitable aims for the benefit of its beneficiaries, including those support costs and costs relating to the governance of the charity apportioned to charitable activities.
- other expenditure includes all expenditure that is neither related to raising funds for the charity nor part of its expenditure on charitable activities.

All costs are allocated to expenditure categories reflecting the use of the resource. Direct costs attributable to a single activity are allocated directly to that activity. Shared costs are apportioned between the activities they contribute to on a reasonable, justifiable and consistent basis.

Financial instruments

A financial asset or a financial liability is recognised only when the Charitable Incorporated Organisation becomes a party to the contractual provisions of the instrument.

Basic financial instruments are initially recognised at the amount receivable or payable including any related transaction costs.

Financial instruments *(continued)*

Current assets and current liabilities are subsequently measured at the cash or other consideration expected to be paid or received and not discounted.

Debt instruments are subsequently measured at amortised cost.

Where investments in shares are publicly traded or their fair value can otherwise be measured reliably, the investment is subsequently measured at fair value with changes in fair value recognised in income and expenditure. All other such investments are subsequently measured at cost less impairment.

Other financial instruments, including derivatives, are initially recognised at fair value, unless payment for an asset is deferred beyond normal business terms or financed at a rate of interest that is not a market rate, in which case the asset is measured at the present value of the future payments discounted at a market rate of interest for a similar debt instrument.

Other financial instruments are subsequently measured at fair value, with any changes recognised in the statement of financial activities, with the exception of hedging instruments in a designated hedging relationship.

Financial assets that are measured at cost or amortised cost are reviewed for objective evidence of impairment at the end of each reporting date. If there is objective evidence of impairment, an impairment loss is recognised under the appropriate heading in the statement of financial activities in which the initial gain was recognised.

For all equity instruments regardless of significance, and other financial assets that are individually significant, these are assessed individually for impairment. Other financial assets are either assessed individually or grouped on the basis of similar credit risk characteristics.

Any reversals of impairment are recognised immediately, to the extent that the reversal does not result in a carrying amount of the financial asset that exceeds what the carrying amount would have been had the impairment not previously been recognised.
